Upon arrival in the DA NANG area, paperback books became plentiful, movies were shown each night, and game kits and playing cards were distributed.

d. Postal: Air parcel post and letters arrive 7 times a week.

e. Disbursing: Disbursing service, for the first 2 weeks of August, was provided by the 4th Marines. Upon moving to the present location, disbursing service was provided by the 3rd Marine Division. The move to the DA NANG area interrupted the normal 2-week pay period; however, at the end of the move, all personnel were paid.

f. Post Exchange: During the first 2 weeks of August, PX facilities consisted of 1 truck load of luxury items; however, in the DA NANG area, a PX van is available in the Battalion area 6 days a week.

g. Legal and Discipline: During the reported period, 1 Battalion Commander's Office Hours was held. None, at this time, are pending.

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SECTION III
INTELLIGENCE

1. Enemy Situation.

a. The enemy situation was as follows:

(1) GIA LE: (1-12 July 1966) The enemy continued to harass vehicular traffic along National Route # 1 with sniper fire. There was increased employment of mines and booby traps throughout the TAOR.

(2) DA NANG Area: (13-31 August 1966) The enemy continued the heavy employment of mines/booby traps and moderate sniping at vehicles and friendly installations. Small units (up to squad size) have on several occasions attempted to set daylight ambushes using long range small arms fire.

b. Enemy units which operated near our TAOR:

(1) GIA LE: The 810th battalion operated in the southern portion of the TAOR with local and main force guerrilla bands.

(2) DA NANG

(a) The R-20th Battalion with a strength of 500 men is located vicinity grid square AT 8854. Equipment includes 4-81mm mortars, 6-60mm mortars, 3-57 RR, 3 machine guns and 3 B40's.

(b) The Q-15 Company with a strength of 100 men is located in the vicinity grid square BF 0061. Equipment includes 1-81mm mortar, 1-60mm mortar, 1-57RR, and 3 machine guns.

(c) The 70th Battalion with a strength of 500 men is located in the vicinity grid square BT 0549. Equipment includes 3-81mm mortars, 4-60mm mortars, 4-57RR, 5 light machine guns and 2-12.7mm machine guns.

(d) Unidentified battalions are located in the vicinity grid squares BF 0055 and AT 9657.

c. The enemy initiated several incidents during the period 1-12 August in the GIA LE area:

(1) 031800H A lone USMC vehicle heading north on Route # 1 was fired upon by an estimated 3 VC in the vicinity YD 825181. The incident resulted in 2 Marine KIA's. Area was searched by a CAC unit with negative results.

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(2) 041300H - Approximately 25 VC in black PJ's were observed in the vic YD 814106. An artillery mission was called in on the area and a patrol was dispatched to sweep the area. Results were negative.

(3) 081130H - Two vehicles were fired upon in the vic YD 820182 by automatic weapons fire. A man was observed running to the southeast and was taken under fire. A CAC unit swept the area with negative results.

d. Enemy initiated incidents for the period 13-31 August.

(1) 131900H - Tanks attached to H Company made contact with 9 VC in the vic of BT 025553. Tanks saturated the area with 11-90mm rounds resulting in 2 KIA (confirmed) and 5 WIA (probable).

(2) 131130H - H/1 patrol engaged an estimated platoon size unit in the vic BT 012582 resulting in 2 VC KIA (probable).

(3) 141030H - H/2 patrol engaged 3 VC in the vicinity BT 029589. Enemy was fired upon with small arms, 60 and 81mm mortars resulting in 3 VC KIA (probable).

(4) 151205H - G/1 received sniper fire from across the SONG KY LAH River vic BT 985539. The sniper was observed in a tree and fired upon. Sniper was seen to fall from the tree, but body could not be confirmed due to being across river. Incident resulted in 1 VC KIA (probable).

(5) 161945H - F/3 patrol took one VC sniper under fire in a tree line vic BT 041549. The patrol swept the area and found traces of blood indicating 1 VC WIA (probable).

(6) 200930H - A patrol from H Company received sniper fire from a hut vic BT 047572. When fire was returned the sniper ran from the hut and was hit by small arms fire. Area was swept but the body could not be found; results were 1 VC WIA (probable).

(7) 220940H - H Company patrol engaged 3 to 4 VC in the vic BT 022585 with small arms fire results were 1 VC WIA (confirmed).

(8) 231250H - H Company patrol was fired upon by a sniper vic BT 025575. The sniper was observed and taken under fire. The sniper was seen to stagger and fall, but no body was found during sweep of the area; results were 1 VC WIA (probable).

(9) 232000H - I&G Company lines using infra-red sniper scope, spotted one VC in front of their lines. VC was fired upon and fell to the ground. Area was swept at first light and 2 blood trails were found; results were 1 VC WIA (probable).

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(10) 291640H - The resupply helicopter for Hotel Company was fired upon with small arms in the vicinity BT 046561. Helicopter took no hits.

e. Summary of Enemy Casualties, Prisoners and Captured Equipment.

(1) GIA LE (1-12 August) - None

(3) DA NANG (13-31 August) - KIA: 4 (confirmed), 11 (probable); WIA: 3 (probable); 2 VCS and 1 VCC.

f. Significant trends during period:

(1) The VC political cadres during the last two weeks of August have projected their propaganda toward the disruption of the coming elections.

(2) Enemy movement within the TAOR has increased during the latter part of the month.

(3) Small enemy units (4-5 man) have increased the tempo of limited "hit and run" contacts. This has apparently resulted from their being recently equipped with newer (automatic) weapons than previously.

g. Enemy situation at the end of period: The tactics employed have remained basically the same throughout the period.

4. Control. Control of the battalion was exercised from the command post throughout the entire period. Wire and radio communications continue to be used equally to exercise control of the subordinate units.

5. Close Combat

a. Patrols: 8 Company, 39 platoon, 44 squad search and clear patrols; 56 platoon, 128 squad and 2 fire team security patrols were employed.

b. Ambushes: 1 platoon and 147 squad ambushes were utilized.

c. Listening Posts/Outposts: A total of 207 LP's/OP's were employed.

6. Special Operations

a. Amphibious Operations: None.

b. Combined Operations: None.

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c. Psychological Operations

(1) Significant Actions. On 16 August, the Commanding Officer of 2/1 spoke, through an interpreter, to the inhabitants of the hamlet of VIEN TAY. The theme of his speech concerned the ways in which the villagers could aid the Marines and the benefits they would gain by doing so. At the time the villagers appeared responsive to the idea.

(2) Material Distributed. On 31 August, a leaflet drop was made in two (2) areas within 2/1's TAOR. Along Route #1, from coordinates BT 055592 and 1,000 meters on each side of the highway, 120,000 leaflets were dropped. The theme of these leaflets was that the Marines were here to help the people of Vietnam. The second area, in which the drop was made, was grid squares BT 0161, 0261, 0160, 0260, 0159, and 0259. The theme of these leaflets (of which there were 20,000) told of the "CHIEU HOI" program. Twenty thousand safe contact passes were dropped in this area also.

d. River Operations. See After Action Report, Operation SWANNEE (Tab C to Appendix 2).

7. Nuclear, Biological, Chemical and other Types of Warfare.

a. During the reporting period neither NBC Warfare nor equipment peculiar to it were employed.

b. No NBC Warfare training was conducted.

c. All items of NBC equipment authorized by T/E are on hand and operational.

8. Problem Areas. No significant problem areas were encountered during the period.

9. Sequential Listing of All Contact, General Description of Scheme of Maneuver and Results Attained:

(1) 1 August - At 0425H H&S lines reported a trip flare set off in front of the lines vicinity BT 086567; fired machine guns and threw 2 grenades. Nothing further was observed. At 0830H I/3/12 and 2/1 commenced displacement by helicopter to DONG HA. The movement was completed at 1330H. At 1500H 2/1 less H Company departed DONG HA by Rough Rider for GIA LE arriving at 1935H.

(2) 2 August - At 1230H H Company arrived from DONG HA via Rough Rider.

(3) 3 August - At 1800H 2 men KIA by sniper fire while driving north along Highway # 1. Casualties evacuated to A-Med and vehicle returned to 2/1 MT.

(4) 4 August - At 1100H OP 225 reported approximately 8 VC in black clothing moving southeast (approximate location vicinity YD 814106.) OP 225 called artillery mission. At 1330H F Company patrol dispatched to check area with negative results.

(5) 5 August - At 1000H OP 225 observed 5 VC constructing what appeared to be mortar aiming stakes. At 1150H 4th Marines requested clearance to fire on subject VCS at YD 816117. At 1230 F Company patrol sent to sweep area of VCS with negative results. At 2105H artillery fired illumination at suspected movement vicinity GS YD 8116. At 2230H G/2 patrol heard movement and fired illumination with negative results.

(6) 6 August - At 1620H G/2 patrol found a grenade at YD 790119 lying on its spoon in a tank trail. Booby trap was blown in place. At 1630H several rounds of sniper fire received by 1/4 vicinity YD 828182. One VCS was apprehended; U.S. M-26 grenades were found in his possession. VCS turned over to CIT at PHU BAI. At 2020H G/2/A found trip wire just after leaving patrol base vicinity YD 790116.

(7) At 0700H G/2 traced the trip fire (first found at 062020H) to a stick type grenade (Chicom) tied to a bush at YD 790116. The grenade was detonated in place by the Engr's with G/2 patrol. At 1630H G/3 patrol located two M-1A1 anti-tank mines at YD 810103; mines were destroyed in place by Engr's. At 1750H 4th Mar S-2 notified 2/1 of 20 unidentified personnel dressed in black PJ's; no weapons were observed. G/3 patrol, located in their PPB at YD 798109, was notified of the sighting and an immediate search was conducted with negative results. At 1840H G/3 received two small arms rounds from vicinity YD 790112. A 4.2" fire mission was called and patrol swept the area with negative results.

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(8) 8 August - At 0800H G/3 patrol completed sweep of area from which sniper fire was received at 071840H in vicinity of YD 790106 with negative results. At 1130H two vehicles received a burst of automatic fire at the junction of Highway # 1 and GIA LE road YD 820182. Fire was returned in the direction of the sniper and one man was seen running away in a southeasterly direction. At 1730H G/1 patrol located a pressure release type mine on trail at YD 782128. Mine was constructed from a 50mm round. Engineer detachment with G/1 patrol destroyed the mine in place.

(9) 9 August - At 2255H H Company lines reported 4 men struck by lightning. Battalion surgeon reports all men in satisfactory condition.

(10) 10 August - At 0732H Golf Company departed GIA LE area (YD 805145) by motorized convoy enroute to DA NANG (vic BT 012632). At 1600H 4th Marines relayed message that Company G had arrived at 2nd Bn, 9th Marines CP (vic BT 012632); Company G OpCon to CO, 2nd Bn, 9th Marines.

(11) 11 August - At 1203H Hotel Company departed 2/1 CP via Rough Rider to DA NANG arriving at 1630H; Company H now OpCon 2/9.

(12) 12 August - At 1155H H&S Company, Company F and heavy command group departed the GIA LE area by motorized convoy, enroute to 2nd Bn, 9th Marines area, chop OpCon to 9th Marines at 1500H and arrived at 2nd Bn, 9th Marines area at 1800H. At 1900H a tank attached to H/2 patrol sighted 9 VC walking in a westerly direction down the river bank. VC wore khaki uniforms, packs and had weapons. Tanks opened fire with .50 Cal and saturated the area. Results 2 VC KIA (confirmed) and 5 VC KIA (probable).

(13) 13 August - At 0320H F/2/A patrol returning from ambush site detonated a booby trap located 4 to 5 feet above the ground and rigged with a trip wire resulting in 3 U.S. WIA's; med evac was completed at 0800H. At 1100H H/1 patrol at BT 012585 received a very heavy volume of fire from an estimated VC platoon located vicinity BT 005575. Patrol returned fire with small arms and 60mm fire and called in an artillery mission on suspected VC position. Results: 2 VC KIA (probable). At 1115H E Company departed GIA LE by motorized convoy enroute to 2/1 (BT 015627) arriving at 1805H. At 1200H 2nd Bn, 1st Marines assumed operational control of 2nd Bn, 9th Marines TAOR. At 1300H H/1 patrol located a 155-shell rigged as a mine at BT 023571; detachment of engineers blew it in place. At 1500H F/1 patrol tripped a M16A1 tomato can mine which was placed in a tree at BT 001634. The mine did not detonate, but fell out of the tree smoking. It was blown in place by the engineers. At 1010H one truck (M422) from 3rd platoon, Co A,

3rd Motors enroute on Anderson Trail (vic BT 028640) received one round of sniper fire from an unknown direction resulting in 1 U.S. WIA. Vehicle continued moving and returned fire with 20 7.62mm rounds and 30 .45 Cal rounds in the area of the suspected sniper round. At 1800H H/S bunker (BT 018629) received one sniper round from vicinity BT 020633; There were no casualties.

(14) 14 August - At 0800H H/2 patrol at BT 029591 received sniper fire from tree line vicinity BT 028586; Patrol called in an 81mm mortar fire mission and ten rounds were expended. The area was swept with negative results. At 1040H H/2 patrol received sporadic sniper fire from vicinity BT 022589; an 81mm mortar fire mission was called and patrol swept area with negative results. At 1115H the 1st Mar. Regt. requested assistance in searching for a MIA in vicinity BT 055635. E Company alerted 2 platoons. At 1130H 1st Marines notified S-3 to stand down on assistance requested: MIA was changed to KIA. At 1305H E/3 was sent with FO team to conduct a sweep of village in vicinity BT 048638. Direction of sweep was from northwest to southeast. At 1320H 1st Bn, 1st Marines reported sighting 4 to 5 VC in vicinity BT 041638; artillery mission was called and a sweep of the area was conducted by 1st Bn, 1st Marines with negative results. At 1430H E/3 began sweep of village. At 1530H E Company lines at BT 015628 received one sniper round from an unknown direction; a visual reconnaissance of suspected area was conducted with negative results. At 1625H E/3 located a suitcase in the village containing khaki clothes. Investigation revealed the clothing belonged to an ARVN. E/3 completed sweep of the village with negative results and returned to Bn CP. At 1700H G/2 patrol at BT 000679 sighted a group of VC carrying an estimated 10 rifles and 2 or 3 automatic weapons at BT 006575. Patrol laid down a base of fire and assaulted the village at BT 001582. It swept through village without incident, but upon reaching north end the patrol received a short burst of automatic weapons fire. One squad was dispatched to continue the search to the north toward the area of suspected enemy positions; results of the sweep were negative. At 1905H G/2 patrol called an artillery mission on suspected VC positions at BT 001582 with good effect on target. At 1930H F Company at BT 000620 received approximately 30 rounds of automatic weapons fire from vicinity BT 004617. Company returned fire with 200 rounds of automatic fire and 6 rounds of M-79. Area was swept with negative results. At 2025H G/2 patrol moving to their PPB at BT 000580 received 2 sniper rounds from an unknown direction; a visual reconnaissance of the area was conducted with negative results.

(15) 15 August - At 0625H F Company began movement from their position (AT 999620) enroute to Bn CP in conjunction with Operation SWANNEE arriving at 0705H. At 0625H H/1 and H/2

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commenced movement from Company CP (BT 025576) to vicinity BT 070550 to act as river security for Operation SWANNEE, arriving at 1010H. At 0700H E/1 (Rein) and E/2/A (Rein) departed CP by motorized 'convoy' to vicinity BT 091555 (arriving at 0830H) and effected relief of 1st Bn, 1st Marines. E Company elements then provided security on both sides of river west of the bridge to line from BT 075543 to BT 081553. G Co commenced movement on foot to new PPB's located at BT 005560, AT 990545 and AT 980560 arriving at new positions at 0850H; platoons commenced providing security of north bank from AT 977568 to BT 014559 in conjunction with Operation SWANNEE. At 0910H F Company departed Bn CP by motorized 'convoy' to assume command of river survey at bridge (BT 091552) and arrived at 0935H. At 0911H E/1 at bridge (BT 091552) notified 2nd Bn, 1st Marines that the LCM would be delayed for approximately 60 minutes due to difficulty in loading. At 1010H hourly position report submitted to 1st Marines. At 1050H 1/1 notified 2/1 of ARVN moving across river on eastern edge of TAOR from vicinity BT 046633. At 1145H G/1 at AT 990546 received sniper fire from across the river in vicinity AT 985539. Platoon returned fire with small arms and sniping ceased. At 1205H G/1 sighted the VC sniper in a tree vicinity AT 995539 and took him under fire; sniper seen to fall out of the tree; results 1 VC KIA (probable). At 1236H F Company at bridge BT 091552 was directed by the Hydrographic Survey Team to postpone river sweep until 160625H. At 1300H G/1 patrol began shifting to new position vicinity AT 983554, arriving at position at 1705H. At 1806H firing heard at Bn CP and the following was monitored on the radio: ARVN convoy (consisting of 1 PC and 1 6x6 truck) was ambushed vicinity BT 038632 by an unknown number of VC located in the vicinity BT 038628. VC sprung the ambush with small arms fire and suspected 60mm mortars; fire may have been returned by the ambushed ARVN. VC broke contact and moved east and west from ambush position. Artillery fire was called on suspected enemy position. 2/1 security patrol on Anderson Trail set up a blocking position along south side of trail and 1 platoon from E Company placed on alert status. Two med-evacs were requested and ARVN continued south on Highway # 1 to ARVN position. At 1710H blocking position/local security on Anderson Trail secured from blocking position. At 1830H G/2 in PPB (BT 005560) received approximately 20 rounds of sniper fire from vicinity BT 006565; an artillery mission was called and sniper fire ceased. At 1923H G Company requested an artillery mission on automatic weapons firing in vicinity BT 015572; firing ceased.

(16) 15 August - At 0725H F Company commenced movement to rendezvous with LCM in order to commence refueling of the LVTs. At 0755H G Company CP security position (vic BT 015527) sighted approximately 4 unidentified persons running from rock to rock in vicinity BT 038627. Sentry fired one warning round in the air, then fired 2 rounds of small arms directly at persons who appeared to be hiding in rocks. Unidentified persons fled into

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the tree line and disappeared. Due to LVT's stuck on sand bars, mechanical problems with LVT's and only 1 remaining hour of favorable water conditions for LCM, it was decided to remain in present position in order to refuel LVT's, set in defensive positions for the night and organize to move out at first light. At 1515H a tank from 3rd Plat, Co B 3rd TK Bn approaching the main security gate (BT 016627) received 6 rounds of sniper fire from an unknown direction; fire was not returned because the location of the sniper could not be determined. At 1610H Comm Wire team working on lines from Bn CP area to HA DONG Bridge, received one sniper round. Fire came from an unknown direction. No casualties. At 1915H H/2 with tanks attached (vic BT 025538) observed 50 VC wearing mixed uniforms and helmets moving at BT 025558. Tanks fired 11-90mm rounds with good coverage of target. A sweep of the area was not conducted due to the distance from location and security mission assigned. At 1945H F/3 patrol located in vic BT 041549 sighted one VC in tree line and opened fire; area was searched and patrol found 1 shower shoe with blood on it; no body was located. Results: 1 VC KIA (probable). At 2100H H/2 patrol located at BT 025558 received 10-12 carbine sniper rounds in their position from vic BT 021562; attached tanks returned fire with .30 Cal automatic fire; sniper fire ceased. At 2130H G/2 at BT 003656 reported receiving 20 incoming round of small arms fire plus 1-60mm mortar round (dud) from suspected position vic BT 006563. At 2150H H Company located BT 032575 received numerous sniper rounds from unknown directions; H Company returned fire with small arms and 10-60mm mortar rounds; sniper fire ceased.

(17) 17 August - At 0110H F Company at BT 037555 and BT 046556 received approximately 12 rounds of suspected 60mm mortar muzzle flashes were seen in the vic BT 030155. Company returned fire with approximately 200 rounds of .50 Cal machine gun fire; mortaring ceased and VC broke contact in an unknown direction. At 0140H a listening post on H&S lines at BT 015627 reported hearing someone cough and movement in the vic BT 016630. An 81mm illumination mission was fired. Results were negative. At 0635H one Marine at Bn CP listening post vic BT 012627 sighted 1 unidentified person carrying a rifle at BT 012630; sentry fired 3 rounds of automatic fire at suspected VC, who jumped into bushes. H&S Company dispatched a fire team to sweep the area. Team returned at 0730H and reported locating only fresh foot prints. At 1045H E Company (BT 024567) reported helo with CO 2/1 aboard received sniper fire from vic BT 024579; area was saturated with small arms and mortar fire; a sweep of the area was conducted with negative results. At 1740H one Marine from F Company stepped on a punji trap at vic AT 999546; Marine was med-evacuated to C-Med at DA NANG at 1830H. At 1850H med-evac helo received enemy fire from vic BT 024579; helo returned fire with M-60 machine gun. Two tanks with H/3/A

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were dispatched to suspected area. Two structures suspected of harboring sniper (vic BT 024579) destroyed by 90mm cannon fire. Med-evacs from F and H Companies successfully evacuated from respective areas at 1830H. At 1800H F Company located 1 M6A1-tomato can mine at AT 998546; mine was armed with 3 prongs sitting above the ground and was covered with "C" Ration cans, stacked "TEE PEE" style. Engineers disarmed mine and F Company will retain it for forwarding to Bn S-2. At 1805H H&S Company wire team returning to Bn CP from checking land line to and from HA DONG Bridge (AT 991642) received 1 round of sniper fire from an unknown direction; a visual reconnaissance of the area produced negative results. At 2210H G Company heard noises at vic AT 999561 and dispatched a squad to investigate. G/2/A sighted a squad of VC, called in 81mm illumination and assaulted the VC with semi and automatic fire. VC retreated into dense tree line. G/2/A swept area with negative results; due to dense foliage bodies may be hidden.

(18) 18 August - At 0005H G/2/A patrol at AT 999561 sighted an estimated VC squad at same coordinates; patrol took VC under fire with small arms and called in 60mm and 81mm mortar rounds of illumination. VC broke contact and retreated into densely wooded area; area was searched with negative results. At 0615H G/3 began sweep of area (vic AT 999561) and discovered 2 pools of blood and many trails of blood through elephant grass through the tree line; the patrol swept the tree line and found more blood trails, but no bodies. Between the hours 0920H and 1050H H Company patrols located and exposed caches of rice (approx 500 to 600 lbs) vic BT 028532 and received mortar and small arms fire from 7 different positions around cache site; fire was returned with 7 rounds of 81mm mortar fire, automatic and semi-automatic fire at the vicinity of suspected VC. The patrol searched the area with negative results. H/2/A was dispatched to Route #14 to check population and found several houses with abandoned clothes and 5-50 lbs bags of rice in vic BT 035582. H/1/A patrol received heavy semi and automatic fire from a few houses vic BT 035582. Fire was returned with heavy volume of small arms fire and M-79 rounds; two structures were ignited by M-79 rounds. A more thorough search was conducted of the abandoned hamlets in the vic BT 030580 with negative results. At 1430H H Company at BT 035582 located documents, and a cache of rice; maps and documents will be forwarded to S-2 at first opportunity. At 1700H H/2/A and ARVN troops sent to investigate rice caches at BT 030581 encountered sniper fire while searching area. H/2/A and ARVN forces with 2 OMTOS returned fire with automatic fire and 4 106mm RR rounds; an abandoned hut was burned by 106mm rounds and no further contact was encountered. Search of the area was conducted with negative results. ARVN stated rice appeared to belong to PF's and returned to their CP without taking further action. At 1505H F/2/A patrol at AT 992627 received 8-10 sniper rounds from a house in vic AT 992628; patrol returned fire with small arms and M-79 rounds; swept area with negative results. Between

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the hours of 2050H and 2107H H/1/A patrol received two rounds of sniper fire from vicinity BT 025579; returned fire and returned to CP vicinity BT 025575. H/1/A again departed friendly lines by an alternate patrol route and received automatic fire from the vicinity BT 024573. H/1/A called and adjusted 5 rounds of 60mm mortar fire on suspected enemy position; results unknown due to darkness. A sweep of the area at first light had negative results. H/3/A fire team LP observed squad size unit moving along treeline at BT 027580 and opened fire with 20 rounds automatic fire, then returned to CP.

(19) 19 August - At 0010H three rounds M-79 were fired by H/1 at continued digging noises vicinity BT 027578; noises ceased. At 0030H digging noises continued. H Company continued harassment of area with M-79 and 60mm mortar fire throughout the night. At 0130H noises ceased. At 0950H F/3/A patrol moved in a southwest direction toward suspected enemy position at AT 993626 from which sniper fire was received earlier; one Marine stepped on a punji trap at AT 994663 and was med-evaced at 1150H. At 0956H E/2/B at BT 015625 received an undetermined number of rounds of sniper fire from vicinity BT 017623; a fire team was dispatched to search out the area with negative results. At 1010H F Company at AT 999546 received 3 rounds of sniper fire; returned fire with 100- .50 Cal, 1-105mm and 100 rounds small arms. Sniper fire hit LVT radiator; LVT commenced movement to better position to return sniper fire and broke a track. At 1030H E/2/A found 2 satchel charges with 2 feet of trip wire across trail. EOD personnel blew charges in place. At 1050H H/1/A ambush patrol at BT 018582 received 30 to 40 rounds of sniper fire from an estimated 2 snipers from vicinity BT 016583. Patrol returned fire with 150 rounds of small arms fire and 2 rounds of M-79. Harassing sniper fire ceased and patrol continued to ambush site. At 1310H Bn CP (BT 015627) received 3-4 sniper rounds throughout the CP area; diverted E/2/A patrol toward suspected enemy position in vicinity BT 010625; patrol sighted one man heading toward treeline at BT 011619. A search of the area was conducted and located 1 bunker with tunnel entrance; a smoke grenade was thrown into the entrance with negative results. At 1440H a column of two OTTER's conducting a resupply of F and G Companies with security had lead vehicle strike mine at AT 989578. Track on right side of vehicle blown off; vehicle seriously damaged and 4 Marine WIA's resulted. One OTTER and security team continued on mission of resupply to Golf Company CP. Recovery operations of damaged OTTER to commence at first light 20 August 1966.

(20) 20 August - At 0713H E Company was directed to execute Op O 216-66 with 1 platoon (E/3). At 0730H G Company commenced sweep as directed by FRAG ORDER; at 0800H G Company reported to be in vicinity AT 983577 and was instructed to hold at that position until further notice. At 0817H G Company was instructed to take up security positions along Route # 14 and hold that position. At 0930H 2 LVT's moving east on Route # 14

received sniper fire from vic BT 043572. Fire was returned; one VC running from hut was seen to fall; area was swept and traces of blood found. At 1005H H/3 at BT 011584 received 5 to 10 well-placed sniper rounds from across the river vic BT 013582 resulting in 2 U.S. WIA; fire was returned with small arms, M-72 and M-79's. Patrol continued original assigned mission. Med-evac completed at 1125H. At 1145H G/2 discovered a hole in the road vicinity AT 997577; it is believed hole was caused by a mine due to the fact that pieces of flesh and bone were found in area. From appearance of area it was determined that casualty was either a civilian or VC who was planting a mine in the road. At 1220H F/2 at AT 989642 received sniper fire from vicinity of GS AT 9964; F/2 did not return fire due to unknown position of sniper. At 1300H H/3 at BT 018591 received light sniper fire from vicinity BT 019589. Unit returned fire with 4-60mm mortar rounds; sniper fire ceased. Area was swept with negative results. At 1500H H/3 received heavy small arms fire from 7 structures vicinity BT 021385. Small arms fire and 18 rounds of 81mm mortars were returned; sniper fire ceased. Area was swept with negative results. At 1610H vicinity AT 990586 as G/2 patrol was advancing on search and destroy mission, a mine (suspected to be a 105mm round with pressure-type firing device) was detonated resulting in 5 U.S. WIA's (one subsequently DO). All were med-evac'd at 1730H.

(21) 21 August - At 0730H H/3 at BT 025538 received light sniper fire from vic BT 023583; small arms and M-79's fire was returned; sniper fire ceased and patrol continued its mission. At 0900H H/1 with CP group located 1 M-26 grenade without fuze at BT 025577 and blew it in place. At 1000 H/1 patrol received fire from vic BT 025583 from 5 buildings located at BT 028583. Returned small arms fire and grenades and a man was seen running away into the tree line. Area was searched with negative results. At 1045H wire team received 5 rounds of sniper fire from vic BT 003634. ONTOS returned fire and probably wounded 1 VC. At 1100H F/2 patrol vic AT 995637 fired at a sniper who was shooting at 2 ONTOS at BT 004635. The patrol continued after the sniper broke contact. At 1120H a squad from H/1 at BT 025580 received 7-8 rounds sniper fire from vic BT 027582. Small arms fire was returned and sniper fire ceased. M-1 ball ammunition was found at sniper's position upon search. At 1340H F/2 patrol in the vic AT 995624 observed 2 VC with weapons at AT 993628. VC were taken under small arms fire and fled. During the engagement a member of the patrol tripped a grenade-type mine which detonated and caused 2 WIA's; one was evacuated. At 1600H communication wire section discovered 3 mines in the vic BT 009635. Mines were rendered safe. They consisted of one M-26 grenade (lying on spoon, with pin pulled, under a piece of cardboard) and 2 VC anti-personnel mines rigged with trip wires. During the period 0850-1915H E/1 patrol received several sniper rounds from vic

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BT 012615. No fire was returned since sniper's position could not be determined exactly. They swept the apparent location and received fire from the right flank (in the vic BT 012613) and also from rear (in the vic BT 015618). An 81mm mortar mission was called and small arms fire was returned. Area was swept and several VC were observed running into distant tree line; one was armed with a rifle. One document was found and returned to S-2.

(22) 22 August - At 0130H H/3/A in LP (vic BT 029979) observed 6 persons and area was illuminated. Surveillance of the area was continued throughout the night. At 0720H H&C Company mine sweeping detail on Anderson Trail discovered 1 block type mine with 50 to 60 pounds of TNT in the vic BT 031641. Mine was blown in place. At 0730H H/3 received sniper fire from vic BT 023583. Small arms and M-79 rounds were returned. Sniper fire ceased and patrol continued its mission. At 0940H H/1 (BT 022585) received semi-automatic fire from an estimated 2-3 VC in the vic BT 019856. Fire was returned with 150-200 small arms 5 rounds of 81mm mortar. Results of contact; 2 U.S. MIA which were med-evacuated; 1 VC KIA (confirmed) and 1 VC KIA (probable). At 1100H E/2 at BT 017623 received 1 sniper round from vic BT 016624; fire was returned with 75 rounds of 7.62 and 25.30 Cal. Area was swept with no active results. At 1100H G Company captured 1 VCC at AT 983552 who disclosed the location of 14 VC and weapon cache at vic AT 990550. G Company plus 2 tanks swept area with negative results and VCC was evacuated by helo to ITT. At 1107H H/1 patrol at BT 026592 received heavy sniper fire from vic BT 029530; small arms and M-79 rounds were fired in return. Sniper fire ceased and patrol continued its mission. Between the hours 1430H and 1505H H Company CP (BT 024576) received sniper fire from BT 028578 and BT 027580. No fire was returned because sniper exact position could not be determined. At 1530H a squad size patrol from E Company at BT 030621 located a nylon fishing line stretched across the trail. Line was traced with negative results and patrol continued its mission. At 1525H E/2 at BT 019607 received approximately 25 rounds of sniper fire from the east across the river. Fire was returned with 70 rounds of small arms. However, movement to the area was impossible due to river barrier. At 1530H E/2 at BT 019607 received 15-20 rounds sniper fire from vic BT 014607. Fire was returned with 2 106mm RR rounds, 4 81mm mortar rounds and 100 rounds of small arms. However, movement to the area was impossible due to river barrier. At 1720H two Marines from E/2 at BT 017618 stepped on punji stakes while returning to CP. Medical aid was given and injured men walked back to CP.

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(23) 23 August - At 0940H G/2/A activated a M16A1 mine vicinity AT 982568. As corpsman was administering first aid to the wounded, one wounded Marine detonated a second M16A1 mine; results were 2 KIA and 11 WIA. At 0950H H/3 patrol at BT 039685 received light sniper fire from vicinity BT 039585; patrol returned fire and VC broke contact in unknown direction. Area was swept and a blood trail was found. Several young Vietnamese men were noted lounging within the swept area; ID cards were checked and none were on the black list. At 1100H H/1 located 1 VC grenade with an electrical cord running from it (vicinity BT 014577) into a nearby rice paddy; grenade was destroyed in place and patrol continued. At 1100H one corpsman with E/3 at BT 034624 detonated a mine consisting of one 7.62mm tracer round; round went through his foot and the individual was helo/med-evaced. At 1130H H/1 patrol apprehended one Vietnamese male in hut (vic BT 013578) with an empty demolition bag; VCS was turned over to District Headquarters. At 1250H Hotel Company CP (BT 125573) received heavy semi and automatic weapons fire from vicinity BT 025575. Area was swept and two tunnels were closed with grenades. One VC was observed fleeing into the tree line (vic BT 028579) and was fired upon by patrol; VC appeared to stagger before disappearing into tree line. At 1558H Hotel Company CP received sniper fire from vicinity BT 025579; VC broke contact into tree line two of the VC were females. Area was swept with negative results. At 1600H a resupply column of OTTERS returning from Hotel Company struck a mine estimated to be 40-60 lbs TNT. One OTTER was almost completely destroyed and 5 WIA's resulted. Four Marines were med-evaced and 1 returned to BAS. At 2120H Tanks attached to Golf Company at AT 977567 forced a boat ashore on opposite bank by fire. Subsequent M-79 fire resulted in a large secondary explosion (2 VC KIA probable). At 2120H Golf Company CP (AT 982563) observed activity in the tree line at AT 985564. Area was illuminated and 3 VC were sighted. Small arms and .50 Cal fire were employed resulting in three secondary explosions (3 VC KIA probable).

(24) 24 August - During the hours of 232000H and 240035H H&S Company manning the CP perimeter observed 1 VC in the vicinity BT 009630 by means of infra-red sniperscope. VC was taken under fire and seen to fall. A reinforced squad size patrol was dispatched with a sniperscope to locate the body. At this time more images were observed in the tree line in the same vicinity carrying what appeared to be a body. They were taken under fire with small arms and M-79 rounds. Area was searched at first light and only footprints were found. At 0845H H&S security patrol in vicinity BT 028635 received one sniper round from vicinity BT 024634. Fire was not returned

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due to the presence of civilians in the area: however, area was searched with negative results. At 1017H G Company completed sweep of area of contact the night before (vic BT 982563) and located three holes with dried blood. At 1440H F/2 patrol at AT 999625 received automatic fire from an undetermined number of VC from vicinity AT 995628. Fire was returned with small arms and area was swept with negative results. Contact results: 4 non med-evac WIA's. At 2035H Golf Company CP (AT 982564) received 2 rounds of sniper fire from vicinity AT 980568. Fire was not returned since the sniper's exact location was not known.

(25) 25 August - At 1010H one member of H/3 activated a VC grenade-mine at BT 037594 resulting in 1 U.S. WIA. H/3 -- began receiving light sniper fire from vicinity BT 037594 while awaiting the arrival of med-evac helo; patrol returned fire with small arms and 81mm mortars and the VC broke contact in an unknown direction. A search of the area was conducted with negative results and the med-evac was completed without further incidents. At 1040H E/2/A patrol at BT 023623 received 15-20 rounds of sniper fire from vicinity BT 022618; fire was returned with semi and automatic weapons fire. VC broke contact in an unknown direction and area was swept with negative results. At 1110H H/3 at BT 025594 received heavy small arms fire from the vicinity BT 030594 and BT 030596 resulting in 1 U.S. WIA. 81mm mortar mission was called and the area was swept with negative results. At 1240H F/2 patrol at AT 998629 received sniper fire from the vicinity AT 993624. Small arms fire was returned and sniper fire ceased. Area was swept with negative results. At 1315H 2/1 CP (BT 015628) received 10 rounds of sniper fire from an unknown direction; fire was not returned since the sniper's position was not known. At 1315H E/1/A patrol at BT 029621 received automatic weapons fire from vicinity BT 029619 resulting in 1 U.S. WIA. Small arms fire was returned and the area was swept with negative results. At 1715H 81mm mortar section in the Bn CP at BT 015628 received small arms fire from the southeast vicinity BT 025625; all units were alerted.

(26) 26 August - At 1115H F/3/A patrol observed 2 VC at BT 007623; VC were taken under fire with small arms and area was searched. Blood was found throughout the area. Results: 1 VC KIA (probable). At 1220H F/1/A patrol at BT 012615 moving southwest, tripped a booby trap of an unknown nature resulting in 1 U.S. WIA (non med-evac). At 1245H E/1 patrol received semi and automatic weapons fire from an unknown number of VC in the vicinity BT 018616; fire was returned with all organic weapons and VC broke contact in an unknown direction: area was swept with negative results. At 1455H E/1 patrol received approximately 200 rounds of automatic weapons fire from an unknown number of VC from the vicinity BT 014614 resulting in 1 U.S. WIA; fire was returned with all organic weapons and VC broke contact. At 1625H E/1 patrol found 1 M16A1 "Tomato Can" mine at BT 010619; mine was rendered inactive and returned to Bn CP.

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(27) 27 August - At 1030H H/3 patrol in an LVT crossing the river at BT 015559 sighted 6 sampans at BT 015556; 10 VC were sighted jumping into river after discarding equipment into the river. VC were taken under fire with small arms and sampans were sunk after a thorough search was conducted; results of contact 1 VC WIA (probable). At 1130H Echo Company located at BT 000611 received approximately 140 rounds of machine gun fire from vicinity AT 999619; fire was returned with small arms and 81mm mortar fire mission. Area was swept with negative results. At 1320H a tank meeting Golf Company's resupply convoy struck a mine at AT 984564 resulting in 5 U.S. WIA's and destroyed the tank tread; mine was estimated to contain 60 lbs of explosives. At 1420H Echo Company at BT 000611 received semi and automatic weapons fire from vicinity AT 999608; fire was returned with small arms and 81mm mortar fire. Area was swept with negative results.

(28) 28 August - At 0930H E/3 moving at coordinates BT 024626 received 30 rounds of automatic fire from BT 028625; fire was returned with 20 M-79 rounds and heavy volume of small arms fire. Area was swept and patrol apprehended a 50 year old Vietnamese woman who had no ID card. Suspect was turned over to CIT. At 1400H H/3 patrol at BT 046557 received 10 rounds of small arms fire from BT 014253. Patrol returned fire with 60mm mortar, M-72 and M-60 machine gun fire. Results unknown. At 1630H H Company CP (BT 042581) received 6 rounds sniper fire from vicinity BT 042581; fire was returned with small arms and 60mm mortars. Area was searched with negative results.

(29) 29 August - At 0014H G Company CP lines (AT 983566) observed 2 VC in front of perimeter lines; 4 rounds of M-79 were fired and 1 VC was seen to fall; the other ran into the tree line. A search of the area was conducted at first light with negative results. Contact results: 1-VC WIA (probable). At 0700H H/3 (BT 046561) requested a med-evac for 1 Vietnamese female who was shot by the local VC at vicinity BT 045567; Vietnamese was med-evac at 0735H. At 0900H E/1 at BT 020626 was fired upon by automatic weapons from vicinity BT 029620. Fire was returned with 8 M-79 rounds, a heavy volume of machine gun fire and an 81mm mortar mission was called. A sweep of the area was conducted with negative results. Between the hours of 0930H-1115H E/1 moving south received heavy automatic and small arms fire at BT 030619 from vicinity BT 028619. Patrol called for 81mm mortars in addition to all organic weapons. Swept VC position and continued receiving heavy automatic fire from across the river vicinity BT 030617. 81mm mortar and artillery missions were called on the area. Due to extraction of wounded and obstacle of the river, results were unknown. At 1000H F/1 at BT 013612 received 8-10 rounds of small arms fire from 3 VC in the vicinity BT 013609; fire was returned with small arms, M-60 and 4 M-79 rounds. Area was swept with negative results. At 1010H H/3 at BT 046556 received sniper fire from estimated 4-5 VC from vicinity BT 043556. An 81mm mortar fire mission was called and fire was returned with small arms fire. Results are unknown due to sniper being across the SONG DIEN

River. At 1100H as the resupply convoy to Golf Company was passing AT 992578 a mine exploded after the 4th truck. It was believed to contain 25 pounds of explosive and to have been detonated electrically. Area was swept and no trace of wire was located. No damage occurred to truck or personnel. At 1310H F/1 at BT 003610 was fired upon by .50 Cal and small arms fire from vicinity BT 003609. Fire was returned with 4 M-79 rounds and 25 7.62mm rounds. Med-evac was called for 2 U.S. WIA. Upon completion of med-evac patrol continued mission. At 1425H Foxtrot Company reported a recon helo at BT 003609 received approximately 25 rounds small arms fire; helo surveyed area with negative results. At 1500H H/3 at (BT 046561) received 2 rounds of sniper fire at resupply helo from vicinity BT 043556. No fire was returned due to lack of firm target. Resupply was completed without further incident.

(30) 30 August - At 0715H F/2 patrol moving in vicinity AT 998637 had one member of patrol step on punji stake. Man was med-evac'd and patrol continued on its assigned mission. At 0840H road security for Anderson Trail received several rounds of sniper fire from BT 032642; fire was not returned due to unknown position of sniper. Area is under close surveillance. At 1500H Echo Company patrol in vicinity BT 030620 received auto and semi-automatic fire from BT C30617; fire was returned with approximately 100 rounds of small arms and 10 60mm mortar rounds; an 81mm mortar fire mission was called and at end of mission area was swept with negative results. At 1700H 2/1 received information from 9th Marines that uniformed VC moving in groups of 2 or 3 were seen carrying packs and weapons in vicinity of AT 995615. It was noted that all groups were heading in a northeast direction. Fire mission for 9th Marines, who could observe the VC, was cleared by 2/1; mission was never fired. Additional reports stated group of 100 VC in vicinity AT 995625. At 1805H 2/1 took over fire mission and fired artillery and 81mm mortars against VC position. Artillery and 81's expended 41 105mm rounds, 12 155mm rounds, and 84 81mm rounds on target and it was reported by 9th Marines that rounds had good effect on target at last observed position of VC. F/2 reported after barrage had ceased that 20 Vietnamese people were seen moving from smoking hamlet at coordinates BT 008639 to hamlet at coordinates BT 001635. Due to darkness and scattering of VC units, no friendly units were dispatched to check area, but all 2/1 units were alerted. At 2235H Echo Company reported 2 VC had approached to within 25 meters of their patrol base perimeter at BT 038632. Fire was returned with 30 rounds of M-14 rifle fire and both VC's were observed to fall; area was searched at first light with negative results.

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(31) 31 August - At 0030H Echo Company at BT 038632 observed 1 VC moving across rice paddy dike 200 meters in front of friendly lines; fire was directed at VC with 3 M-79 rounds. Results believed to be negative but area will be checked at first light. At 1100H H/1/A received sniper fire from vicinity BT 027589; fire was returned with small arms and 4 M-79 rounds. Sniper fire ceased and patrol continued assigned mission. At 1718H F/2 reported 10 Vietnamese people working in field across railroad tracks at AT 993635. Since F/2 had not observed these people at this location at that particular hour before and in that immediate area numerous punji traps had been found, Bn CP instructed F/2 to dispatch a unit to advance on and observe people. Bn CP had 81's prepare fire mission to cover area of suspicious activity if investigating unit came under fire. Patrol noticed movement in treeline and 3 M-79 rounds were fired and minor injury to one Vietnamese person resulted. F/2 corpsman treated person as unit conducted a thorough search of area. Although nothing suspicious was uncovered the area remained under close surveillance throughout the night. At 2020H H/3 on advice from PF platoon commander at their position (vic BT 046560) requested artillery mission on suspected VC platoon at BT 042553. The mission was fired and it was reported that the 38 105mm howitzer rounds had excellent coverage of target but due to target being on south side of SONG KY LAM River, area was not searched for effect of concentration.

10. Training. On the job training in billet MOS's continued to receive the major emphasis during this reporting period. In addition, the battalion embarked on a concerted effort to send all personnel to the Land Mine Warfare School conducted by 3rd Engr Bn; at the present time 75 men a week are completing the 2-day school. All newly joined personnel also undergo a three-day orientation program to acquaint them with life in the field, Vietnamese customs, etc., in addition to affording them the opportunity to "FAM fire" their assigned weapon.

11. PF/RF Liaison and Training.

a. On 20 Aug 1966 liaison was made with RF Company stationed at BT 443620. One rifle squad reinforced with a corpsman, S-2 scout, and interpreter was stationed with RF unit to provide the necessary liaison and to assist the unit in its training. In addition to its military oriented activities, the squad has been conducting a very successful MED CAP program.

b. Each rifle company has been assigned an area of responsibility encompassing one or more villages. A close working relationship has been developed between the Company Commanders and the village chiefs. The Marine units are working with local RR/PF's in the conduct of their operation and training. Additionally, the Marines are conducting a rather small scale, but very successful Civic Action program within these villages. At the present time this program has been in effect only a few days; however, considerable progress has already been made and there is every reason to believe that we should enjoy continued success.

SECTION V

LOGISTICS

1. Supply. With the battalion's move from PHU-BRI to the DA NANG area, the source of supply changed from FLSU # 2 to FLSG-A. No problems in resupply were encountered.

2. Maintenance. Ninety-one Tactical Equipment Repair Orders were submitted to FLSG-A during the month and forty-seven were completed. The following is a breakdown by section of the work orders submitted and completed:

3. Food Services. Food services personnel and facilities encountered no difficulties during the reporting period. The battalion is currently receiving two A ration meals and one B ration meal daily. Fresh salad is available one meal a day.

4. Cantonment and Camp Facilities Development. Fifty-four tropical huts are presently being utilized in addition to 48 GP tents. A request has been submitted to the Division Engineer for construction of 35 additional tropical huts to replace much of the GP tentage. When this has been completed, the camp will be in good posture to face the coming monsoon rains.

5. Transportation and Roads. Roads between DA NANG and the battalion field CP are in satisfactory condition at present. However, the dirt road leading from Highway # 1 to the battalion CP (a distance of approximately 1 1/2 miles) will become impassable during the monsoon rains. A road repair request has been submitted to the Division Engineer to correct this situation.

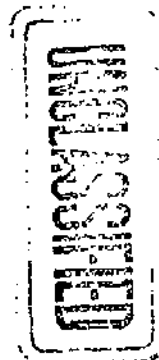
6. Fiscal. During the month of August, the battalion obligated \$49,352.25 for stock fund account items.

7. Water. During the period, the water point was located within this battalion's command post and no water problems were encountered.

8. Motor Transport. Preventative maintenance is being performed on a continuing basis. Presently, five M274's are deadlined for 3rd echelon repair at FLSG-A.

9. Embarkation. The battalion embarkation posture remains satisfactory. No embarkation or debarkation occurred during this period.

10. Hospitalization and Evacuation. There were 38 cases of Malaria diagnosed during the month of August. The battalion incurred 57 combat casualties and 7 KIA's during this time and 697 Marines were treated at the BAS. The Civil Affairs medical support section treated 3,545 local Vietnamese civilians. An improvement in sanitation has been made in the Battalion CP with the enlargement of drainage pits, a grease pit, and repairs to screening.

SECTION VI

COMMUNICATIONS-ELECTRONICS

1. General. During the month of August, the major efforts of the battalion communications platoon were devoted to inventory and preventative maintenance programs following Operation HASTINGS; preparation and movement from PHU-BAI to DA NANG; and the establishment of the new command post at DA NANG.
2. Radio. On 11 August this organization received its new AN/PRC-25 FM family radio which replaced the AN/PRC-10's, AN/PRC-6's and AN/PRC-38. These new radios were immediately inventoried, operationally checked, and issued to the rifle companies.
3. Wire. No major difficulties were encountered as this organization assumed an existing wire system from 2nd Bn, 9th Marines. It has been noted, however, that we are experiencing more wire cutting incidents now than were experienced in the PHU BAI TAOR.
4. Message Center. No difficulties were encountered in the message center operations.
5. Supply and Maintenance Support. With the introduction of the new FM family radios there should be no difficulties in this area in the foreseeable future.

CIVIL AFFAIRS ACTIVITIES

1. Significant Activities. Civil Affairs Activities have been largely limited to medical aid given to the Vietnamese civilians. Since 14 August, the Battalion's Corpsmen have treated 2,374 people.

2. Material Distributed. Through the daily MedCap, 2/1 has distributed approximately 1,000 bars of soap in addition to the medicine mentioned in Section IX, Medical/Dental Affairs.

3. Special Civil Affairs Projects. At this time, 2/1 has not completed any special projects. However, there have been discussions with the District Chief concerning the construction of a school in the village of VINH HA. The District Chief has also expressed hope that 2/1 can supply tin for the roof and lumber for desks in order to complete a school in the hamlet of PHONG NGU (1).

4. Apparent Results. The most readily apparent result of 2/1's Civil Affairs Program is the increase in the daily MedCap activities. The first five days during which the battalion was in this area, corpsmen treated an average of sixty-one people daily. At the present time, two hundred civilians are being treated every day. On 22 August, approximately seventy (70) families came to the Bn CP requesting permission to resettle in the area. They were given our approval, subject to the approval of the District Chief.

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

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



At 1800H SITREP #3 submitted to 1st Marines along with the position report; positions remained the same and situation was all secure. At 1915H H/2 with tanks attached (vic BT 025538) observed 50 VC wearing mixed uniforms and helmets moving at BT 025558. Tanks fired 11 90mm rounds with good coverage of target. 

ARVN stated rice appeared to belong to PF's and returned to CP without taking further action. At 1505H H/2/A patrol at AT 992627 received 8-10 sniper rounds from a house in vic AT 992628; patrol returned fire with small arms and M-79 rounds; swept area with negative results. At 1825H E/2, Anderson Trail security returned to Bn CP with negative results. At 1930H night time activities (patrols/ambushes, and listening posts) commenced. Between the hours of 2050H and 2107H H/1/A patrol received two rounds of sniper fire from vic BT 025579; returned fire and returned to CP via BT 025575. H/1/A again departed friendly lines by an alternate patrol route and received automatic fire from vic BT 024573. H/1/A called and adjusted 5 rounds of 60mm mortar on suspected enemy position; results unknown due to darkness; will sweep area at first light. At 2105H FRAG ORDER for 19 August 1966 issued: Be prepared to execute my 181000H WARNING ORDER on 20 August. Operation Order will be issued 19 August. E Co provide mine sweep and Anderson Trail security. Rejoin E/1 upon arrival CP. Conduct day and night patrols in W-1 and W-2 areas. F Co continue to provide security. First light move to vic AT 995568. Pass LVTH security responsibility to G Co upon joining. Conduct day and night Recon patrols in area coordinating with G Co. G Co assume LVTH security responsibility upon meeting F Co. Pass on to 1/9 via AT 984585. Conduct day and night patrols in area coordinating with F Co. H Co continue day and night patrols in S-2 area. Continue dismantle camp. Chop E/1 to B Co via resupply convoy. All units be advised of necessity of submitting night time activities in timely fashion. Late submission delays any H&I's requested. Hourly Position Reports and 6 hour SITREP's submitted in conjunction with Operation SWANNEE. There were 5 squad patrols and 4 squad ambushes and 3 listening posts employed.

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

19 August - (Note that this is a late report). At 1822H H/1 at BT 027758 heard digging noises and metal on metal in vicinity BT 027758; H/3/A fire team LP observed squad size unit moving along tree line at BT 027580; opened fire with 20 rounds automatic fire and returned to CP. At 1900H three rounds M-79 were fired at continued digging noises vicinity BT 027578; noises ceased. At 0030H digging noises continued. H Company continued harassment of area with M-79 and 60mm fire throughout the night. At 0130H noises ceased, apparently caused by harassment of fires of H Co. At 0630H two squads from E Co and a detachment of engineers commenced mine sweep of Anderson Trail to junction of Highway #1; sweep completed at 0750H. At 0700H (Operation SWANNEE) 2/1 requested information on repairs of downed LVT from LVT Bn Commander; repairs to be completed ASAP. At 0706H F Co notified battalion that no repair kit had arrived at F Co position for the completion of repair of LVT. At 0800H Regt 3 notified 2/1 that LVT Bn is constructing a new repair kit for the LVT and it should arrive at F Co position no later than 1200H. At 0915H daylight activities (Patrols/ambushes and outposts) commenced. At 0950H F/3/A patrol moved in a southwest direction toward suspected enemy position at AT 993626 from which sniper fire was received earlier; one Marine stopped on a punji trap at AT 994633; Marine was med-evaced at 1105H to C - Med.

At 0956H E/2/B located at BT 015625 received an undetermined number of rounds of sniper fire from vicinity of BT 017623; a fireteam was dispatched to search out the area with negative results. At 1010H F Company at AT 999546 received 3 rounds of sniper fire; returned fire with 100-50 Cal, 1-105mm and 100 rounds small arms. sniper fire hit LVT radiator; LVT commenced movement to better position to return sniper fire and broke a track; repairs now in progress. At 1030H E/2/A found 2 patch charges with 2 feet of trip wire across trail. JOD personnel blew charges in place. At 1050H E/1/A ambush patrol at BT 018582 received 30 to 40 rounds of sniper fire from an estimated 2 snipers from vicinity BT 016583. Patrol returned fire with 150 rounds of small arms fire and 2 rounds of M-79 rounds. Harrassing sniper fire ceased and patrol continued to ambush site. At 1310H Bn CP (BT 015627) received 3-4 sniper rounds throughout the CP area; diverted E/2/A patrol toward suspected enemy position in vicinity BT 010625; patrol sighted one man heading towards treeline at BT 011619. A search of the area was conducted and located 1 bunker with tunnel entrance; a smoke grenade was thrown into the entrance with negative results. At 1440H A column of two Otter conducting a resupply of F and G Companies with security had lead vehicle struck mine at AT 989578. Track on right side of vehicle blown off; vehicle seriously damaged and 4 marine KIA's resulted. Med-Evac was requested and personnel were evacuated at 1517H. One OTTER and security team continued on mission of resupply to Golf Company CP. Recovery operations of damaged OTTER to commence at first light 20 August 1966. At 0630H 2 sound from B Company acting as road security on Anderson Trail secured; at 1930H night time activities (patrol/ambush and listening) posts commenced. Hourly Position Reports and 6 hour SITREP's submitted in conjunction with Operation SWANNEE. There were 4 sound patrol, 3 squad ambushes, and 3 listening posts employed.

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

SYNOPSIS

21 August - At 0553H night time activities secured and daylight (search and clear/patrols and outposts) commenced. Mine sweep of Anderson Trail completed at 0735H with negative results. At 0730H H/3 at BT 025538 received light sniper fire from vic BT 023583; small arms and M-79 fire was returned; sniper fire ceased and patrol continued its mission. At 0900H H/1 with CP group located 1 M-26 grenade without fuze at BT 025577 and blew it in place. At 1045H a wire team with 2 ONTOS attached at BT 004635 received 5 rounds of sniper fire from the front and 1 round from the rear; fire was returned with 250 rounds of .30 Cal. fire from the ONTOS. Results were 1 VC WIA (probable). At 1100H F Company at AT 996593 received several rounds of automatic weapons fire from vic AT 998595 and BT 005590. Company returned fire with 3000 rounds of semi and automatic fire; area was swept and 1 M16A1 mine was located and destroyed in place 1 BAR magazine was also found. Contact results were 2 U.S. WIA's which were med-evacuated. At 1130H H/1/A at BT 025580 received 7-8 rounds of sniper fire from vic BT 027582; fire was returned with small arms and area was swept finding M-1 ball ammo wrapped in plastic on rice paddy dike. At 1340H F/2 at AT 995624 observed 2 VC with weapons in vic AT 993628. VC were taken under fire with small arms; VC broke contact and fled in an unknown direction. As the squad was firing at VC, a grenade which had been rigged as a mine was tripped resulting in 2 U.S. WIA's, both of which were med-evacuated. At 1600H wire team with a security element at BT 009635 located a M-26 grenade and 2 CHICOM grenades which were rigged with trip wires. All were rendered safe and returned to Bn CP. At 1815H E/2 security patrol for Anderson Trail returning to CP received 1 round of sniper fire which caused 1 U.S. WIA. Fire was not returned because sniper's exact position could not be determined. At 1830H daylight activities secured and night time activities (patrols/ambushes and listening posts) commenced. Between the hours of 0850H and 1915H E/1 patrol at BT 013617 received sniper fire from BT 012613 and BT 015615; 81mm fire mission was called in for support when VC were sighted running into tree-line; area was swept with negative results; patrol continued its mission. It found a document in a house at BT 013614, which was returned to S-2. At 2300H FRAG ORDER for 22 August was issued: Bn Operation 216-66 terminates at 221200H; all companies continue with assigned mission. There were 4 squad, 5 platoon, 1 company search and destroy; 1 fire team and 1 squad patrols, 8 squad ambushes and 2 listening post employed.
