2. ENEMY, WEATHER AND TERRAIN

a. General. From 3 Oct to 31 Oct contact with enemy forces has progressed from light to moderate. Mining activity grew from light to heavy.

The S-2 Officer effected liaison with 3rd Force Recon Company, MACV S-2 (QUANG TRI), MACV S-5 (QUANG TRI), and the 15th CIT.

There was one (1) significant contact in the 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines TAOR during October. On 26 Oct at YD 306477, G/3 observed ten (10) VC leaving a village. The unit opened fire with small arms resulting in six (6) VC KIA (conf), four (4) VC KIA (prob). Captured equipment included 1 M-1 Garbine, 1-PPSH41, assorted ammunition, grenades and documents.

(6) T-23 LF Company with an unknown strength, generally in support of the 2nd Battalion, 9th NVA Regiment and located vicinity Base Area 101.

(7) 68th NVA Artillery Company with an unknown strength and unknown location.

d. Weather and Terrain

(1) Weather. During October the QUANG TRI area experienced the first rains of the Autumnal transition from the Southwest to the Northeast monsoons. A period of heavy rainfall occurred during the first ten days of October, after which the weather was generally fair.

(2) Terrain. Generally terrain is that of farm paddy land and rolling hills. The lowland area bounding the eastern and western portions of the TAOR with lakes and rolling hills in the central portion. To the north, the TAOR is bounded by QUANG TRI City with the Hai Leng National Forest on the South. The Hai Leng National Forest is generally hilly with thick canopy overhead, dense vegetation and numerous streams throughout.

3. Organization and Operations

a. Tactical operations by 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines changed considerably as the battalion commenced operations in the QUANG TRI TAOR. Initially missions assigned to rifle companies were related to reconnaissance and familiarization with the new area, and company patrols were conducted throughout to obtain data about the local population, terrain, obstacles, enemy avenues of approach and possible enemy harbor sites or operating areas. During these first activities light contact was made with small groups of VC along trails and streams, but these meeting engagements provided no opportunities in which reactions could be executed to develop a major contact. As intelligence within the TAOR began to develop, company operations were planned and conducted locally to eliminate the guerilla forces threatening friendly hamlets nearby and the city of QUANG TRI. Units of all companies conducted patrols and ambushes in the TAOR, and these activities netted the most successful contacts during the month. Elements of Company G attacked a group of ten (10) VC observed departing a hamlet during an early morning ambush. The attack resulted in six (confirmed) VC KIA and four (4) probable KIA's. Elements of Company E on a patrol attacked a VC outpost and obtained two (2) confirmed VC KIA.

b. During October 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines participated in two named operations in QUANG TRI PROVINCE. During the period 11-19 Oct the Command Group and all rifle companies participated with 1st Marines in Operation MEDINA in the Hai Lang National Forrest Reserve. Intensive search and destroy operations were conducted, in which the battalion located several base camps and assembly areas containing food caches, demolitions, weapons, and other supplies which were captured or destroyed. During 26-30 Oct Co H and the Command Group were attached to 4th Marines for Operation GRANITE in the 4th Marine's TAOR. The battalion departed again with the Command Group and Companies F, H and E/1 on 31 Oct for movement into an assembly area before commencement of an operation at Hill #30.

c. Air

(1) Helicopter

In support of 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines helicopters of the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing performed 25 emergency med-evac missions carrying 60 persons, 16 priority med-evacs carrying 31 persons, and three routine med-evacs carrying three persons.

There were three trooplift missions flown including the airlift of all four rifle companies into the operating area for Operation MEDINA. There were six reconnaissance missions performed and two for the Commanding Officer.

(2) Fixed Wing

Aerial observers flew 9 missions for this battalion in October and flareships were requested on 9 occasions.

There were two fixed wing airstrikes conducted.

d. Artillery and Fire Support.

(1) During the month of October supporting arms fired 69 missions expending 1250 rounds. There were 450 H&I fires expending 3180 rounds. Battalion 81mm mortars fired 20 missions expending 244 rounds and 125 H&I fires expending 621 rounds. On 10 October Battery B, 1st Battalion 11th Marines displaced to Hill #34 to support Marine units on Operation MEDINA. On 19 October Battery B moved from Hill #34 to 1st Battalion, 1st Marines CP. At this time Battery B was put in direct support of 1st Battalion, 1st Marines while Battery A was designated as 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines supporting artillery unit. Battery W, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines established its location at this CP in general.

support of 1st Marines. While on Operation GRANITE the battalion was supported by one ARVN 105mm Howitzer.

(2) FSCC accompanied the battalion Command Group on Operation MEDINA during period of 17 Oct to 19 Oct. One section battalion 81mm mortar platoon and the FSCC accompanied the battalion Command Group on Operation GRANITE during period of 26 Oct to 30 Oct.

#### 4. Training

There was light emphasis on training in October due to the maximum effort expended toward the construction of the new CP position at Hill #25 and the continuous commitments of the rifle companies in the field. A 900 inch firing range was constructed on the west edge of the perimeter, and the range was located in order to accommodate the firing of all weapons in this battalion. Heavy use was made of this facility for familiarization firing and also refresher training of those returning to the battalion from absences of more than 30 days. In addition, a program of continuous familiarization firing was started for all personnel in the battalion.

Extensive training was conducted on the M-16 rifle as more than 120 new replacement personnel received instruction on functioning and care, and cleaning of the weapon as well as several hours of zeroing their rifles and firing them.

#### 5. Logistics and Supply

##### a. Logistics

- (1) Class I was adequate to meet October requirements.
- (2) Class II was adequate during October except as indicated in paragraph b, below.
- (3) Classes III and IV were adequate to meet October requirements.
- (4) Class V - Difficulty was experienced, during the month of October, in obtaining 81mm Illumination and Pop-up flares.

c. Motor Transport. As of 31 October, this Battalion had six (6) M274A2's (mules) dead lined for want of spare parts, i.e. carburetors, etc., it is understood these spare parts will be force fed by 1st FSR upon receipt. This area is becoming increasingly more critical.

d. Roads. All access roads and main supply route remained passable during the month of October.

e. Fiscal obligation for the month of October for FSA was \$102,746.98.

f. During October 9 Tactical Equipment Repair Orders were submitted for FLSU. Of these, 2 were completed. As of 31 Oct, 9 items of combat essential equipment were deadlined.

g. No problems were experienced in areas of food services, or hospitalization-evacuation.

#### 6. Civic Action

During the month of October S-5 representatives made initial liaison with Civil Affairs representatives in the Provincial Headquarters at Quang Tri. Coordination was made with the hamlet chief of Le Veng Huu, Quang Tri, concerning establishment of a med-cep dispensary and the possibility of arranging for Battalion medical supply to provide future supplies and personnel for med-ceps that will take place in Le Veng Huu.

Sewing and brick making equipment was obtained from civic action sources in Quang Tri, this equipment will be used for on the job training for the people of surrounding hamlets and villages. Disbursing this equipment throughout selected hamlets and villages stimulates the people to train themselves in some

type of trade and this increases the industrial standing of the community.

#### 7. PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE

During the month of October S-5 representatives made initial liaison with psy-war representatives in Quang Tri and procured leaflets depicting "Health", "Chieu Hoi", and "Return to your government" themes from the S-5 advisor. On one occasion an armed propaganda team from Quang Tri province assisted in a two Company search and clear operation in Thon-Ten-My hamlet on 31 October 1967.

#### 8. COMMUNICATIONS

Following the relocation of 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines to the QUANG TRI TAOR a complete new communications system was installed. Initially there were forty-six phones and over twelve miles of wire put into operation. Four lines were laid to Regiment by 2nd Battalion wire section, and these included two common users and two hot lines. Although the necessary wire has been laid, the teletype is not yet in use due to the temporary loan of equipment from this Battalion to Regiment.

Communications personnel experienced problems during the initial work in the new CP due to a lack of poles for wire and many of the wires within the CP were affixed to engineer stakes and buried. A shortage of wire delayed installation of electric power throughout the camp, but the minimum essential requirements have been met.

Standard radio communications equipment was installed upon arrival at this CP, and RC-292 antennae were installed on all nets for extended range reception. Although primitive conditions existed initially, covered circuit equipment including a RT-524 with a KY-8 were set up and provided the Battalion with this secure means of radio communications.

#### 9. MEDICAL AND DENTAL

(a) Fourteen combat casualties and 640 sick-call patients were treated at the Battalion Aid Station during the month of October. There were several suspected cases of Malaria with no final reports as yet. According to responses from random sampling of the troops, it is felt that the Silicon Foot Ointment issued for Operation MEDINA is beneficial in combating the effect of moisture on the feet in the field.

(b) Dental facilities have not yet been installed in the new CP, and dental cases are referred to Regimental Aid Station.

#### 10. CHAPLAIN

a. Protestant Divine Services. The Battalion Chaplain, LCDR A.H. White, CHC, USNR, is Protestant. Seven Protestant Divine Services were held on Sundays during the month of October. Five of these were held in the 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines Command Post Area; one was held at the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines Command Post Area. A total of 181 persons attended Sunday Divine Services during the month of October. Six Weekday Divine Services were held for Protestants during October. A total of 69 persons attended these services. A total of 15 Protestant Divine Services were held during the month of October with 250 persons attending.

b. Catholic Divine Services. Catholic coverage for 2nd Battalion was provided by Lt. R.M. Lyons, CHC, USNR. Four Catholic Divine Services were held on Sundays at the 2nd Battalion 1st Marines Command Post. There were 138 persons attending. No Weekday Catholic Services were held.

c. Lay Leaders Divine Services. There were two Letter-Day Saints Lay Leader Services held in the month of October. Ten persons attended.

d. Visits. During October the Battalion Chaplain made three visits to "B" Co, 3rd Medical Battalion Hospital with a total of 17 persons visited.

e. Counseling Sessions. The Battalion Chaplain counseled with 24 Marines regarding personal problems.

f. Red Cross Messages. The Battalion Chaplain delivered five Red Cross Messages in the month of October.

g. Memorial Services. The Battalion Chaplain conducted four Memorial Services, one each for the line companies. All personnel from the companies were present. A letter and Memorial Bulletin were sent to each of next of kin.

h. Conferences. The Battalion Chaplain attended four Regimental Chaplain's conferences, with each of the Chaplains in the Regiment present. Two luncheon type conferences were participated in with these same Chaplains.

i. Scripture Distribution. Thirty New Testaments and four

Bibles were given to personnel of 2nd Battalion. An unknown quantity of religious tracts and pamphlets were given also. All types of religious literature were available at the Chaplain's Office.

j. Correspondence. Twenty-six letters of various interests were mailed out to Marines and Officers next of kin dealing with pertinent matters related individually.

k. Lectures. The Battalion Chaplain gave five lectures on the Respect for the Religious Customs and Religions of Vietnam. One hundred and seven personnel attended.

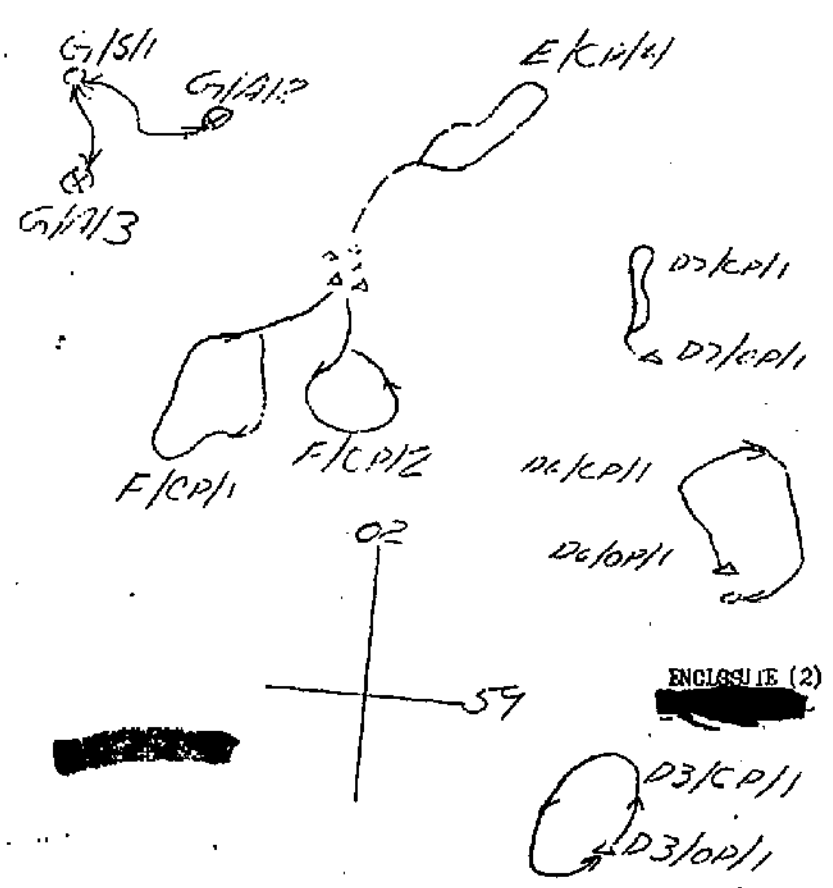
Activity Overlay for period 011800H to 020600H
