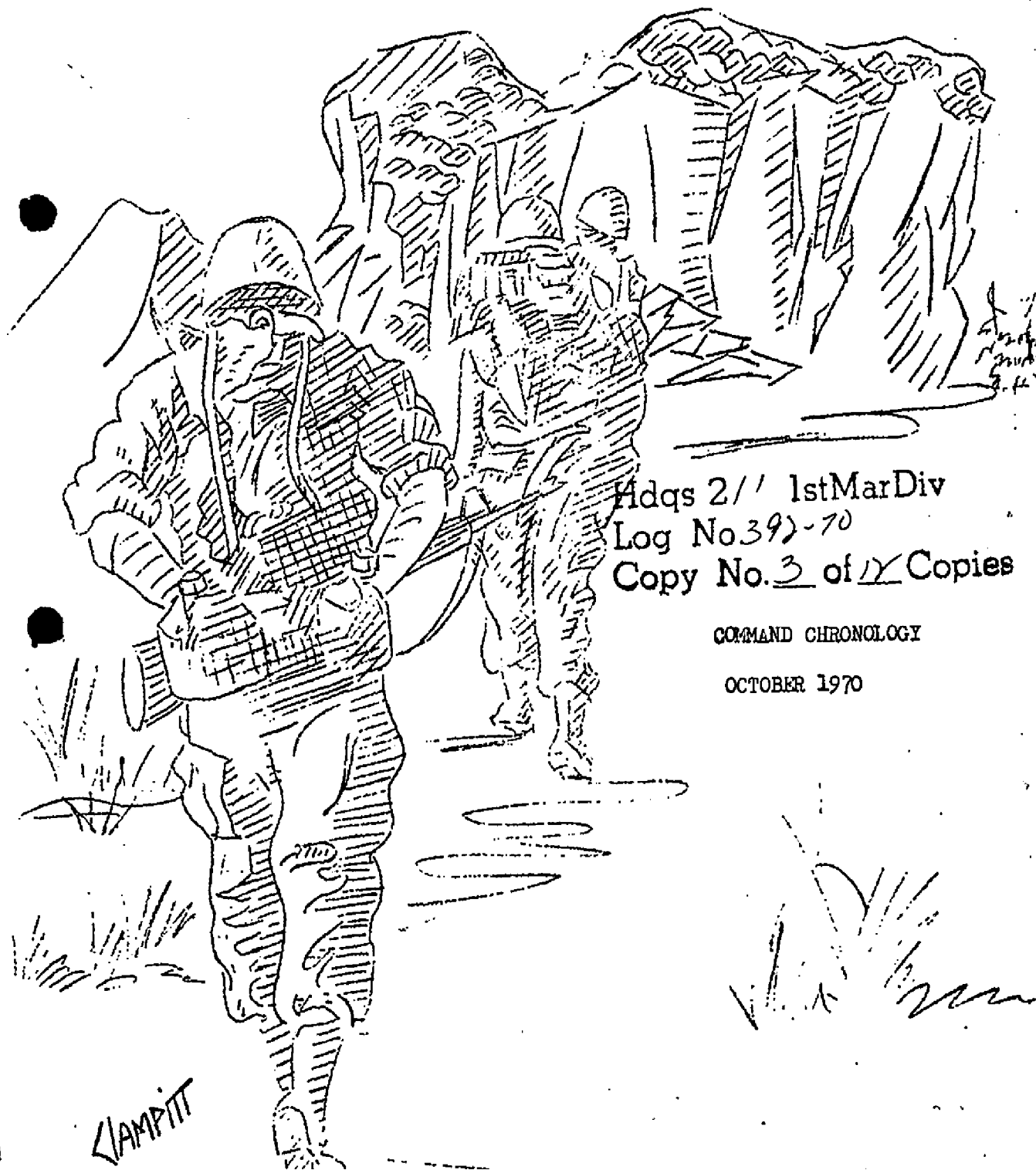

f. Morale and Welfare. The overall morale of the Battalion is considered to be excellent. In addition to the recreation and rest programs available to all Marines in Vietnam, the Battalion maintains an enlisted club with a large outdoor theatre which has hosted two USO shows this month. High on the list of favorite pastimes is an outstanding beach with facilities for Sunday parties. The Special Services program is active providing nightly movies, a weight room, a reading room, and equipment for sporting activities. The PX facilities include a Marine Corps Exchange, laundry, photo shop and gift shop. This cantonment has a messhall which efficiently feeds 600 men three hot meals daily. This month twenty-five (25) Marines from this Battalion participated in a culture tour of Da Nang City.

SECTION B

ENEMY, WEATHER, TERRAIN & S-2 FUNCTIONS

1. Enemy. Although enemy contacts remained at the same level as last reporting period with nine (9) exchanges of fire, enemy booby trap emplacement increased. There was one rocket launching from our TLOZ and one incident of incoming mortar fire at Hill 55.

There was one (1) significant item of military intelligence reported. At 191400H, while on a daytime activity, patrol spotted one (1) VC/NVA running across garden 5-10 meters in front of them. Point man yelled to stop and another VC/NVA came out of bushes 15 meters away, firing AK-47 at point man. One (1) VC/NVA located in tree used as a look out was shot. Patrol returned fire as VC/NVA fled. Captured were two (2) AK-47's, one (1) 9mm pistol and one (1) K-6 pistol. Patrol swept area resulting in several blood trails found.

3. Order of Battle. On the 21st of September a change in 2/1's TLOZ was initiated and finalized on the 30th of September. This 10 change did not affect the present OOB within our TLOZ. There are no North Vietnamese Army or Main Force units located as a unit in 2/1's TLOZ. The enemy is expected to follow its three phase offensive during the following months.

4. Weather and Terrain.

a. Weather. The average high temperature was 82 degrees and the average low temperature was 72 degrees with an average humidity of 73%. Rain for the month was 24.60 inches.

Due to the fact that 2/1's T1OR is in the lowland area, flooding can be expected over 74% of the area during the monsoon. The flooding of the lowland areas will cause a channelization of both friendly and enemy travel. It is felt by S-2, 2/1 that booby traps will become even more prevalent because we are restricted to predetermined routes.

b. Terrain. The terrain in 2/1's T1OR is flat and sandy with rice paddies and scattered broken treelines. There are two main water transportation routes, the Vinh Dien River in the east and the Yen River in the west. In addition, there are numerous lakes, ponds and paddies where boat traffic is heavy.

5. S-2 Functions.

a. Security Clearances: Three (3) security clearances were initiated and none were terminated. The three (3) clearances initiated were required by Communications Section personnel, and the S-3 Alpha.

b. LAVN Interpreters: The S-2 Section now has seven (7) interpreters who are assigned to different units to aid in the "on the spot" interpretation of detainee information and any documents which need an immediate rendition.

c. S-2 Personnel: Although four (4) new personnel joined the section this month (one (1) Gunnery Sergeant and three (3) Sergeants) one (1) Sergeant was redeployed when he detonated a booby trap. The S-2 Scouts continue to work as a Recon Squad.

d. VIF Funds: The allocation of Voluntary Informant Program Funds remains a part of the S-2 function. A total of 52,500VN\$ was spent during the month of October. The VIF Program is not only a source of intelligence information, but it also eliminates the availability of ordnance to the enemy.

e. KCS Program: There are a total of twelve (12) KCS assigned to the Battalion. By walking with the point men on patrols, the KCS are able to act as an early warning for booby traps and ambushes due to their familiarities with the enemy's tactics, habits and signs.

f. Training: The S-2 Section continued to furnish instructors on call for indoctrination training. At this time they are briefed on enemy, weather, terrain and the capabilities and functions of the S-2 Section.

g. Maps: The S-2 Office has a full supply of maps of 2/1's T1OR and will continue to supply them as needed.

h. Patrol Debriefs: Patrol debrief forms have been disseminated to all company recon squads in order to maintain an up to date intelligence picture. These forms, when filled out, are returned to the S-2 Office.

i. Special Liaison Team: The S-2 Officer has operational control of a Special Liaison Team located in Nui Kim Son. It consists of twelve (12) enlisted personnel. Their function is to act as a special intelligence gathering and pacification source. Although in its early stages, it has proved effective in accomplishing the job for which they are designed.

SECTION C
OPERATIONS

1. Operations

a. Mission. The 2d Battalion, 1st Marines was assigned the mission to:

(1) Conduct unilateral and combined offensive operations within the assigned TAO to locate and destroy enemy forces, installations and LOC, with primary emphasis on those forces and bases which pose the greatest threat to GVN control of important population and economic centers and to the security of friendly military installations.

(2) Deploy forces throughout assigned TAO to provide defense of the Da Nang vital area and military complex with emphasis on avenues of approach to known/suspected mortar/rocket positions, to include waterways.

(3) Be prepared to provide a reaction force for relief of Hoa Vang District Headquarters and CIL/CUHL's within the TAO.

(4) In cooperation and coordination with FMARF and District Headquarters, maintain continuous program to upgrade hamlets within the TAO in accordance with the Pacification Program.

(5) Provide security for roadsweeps and other engineer projects as required.

(6) Support Revolutionary Development Program within TAO.

(7) Be prepared to be reinforced and committed anywhere in RVN on 12 hour notice.

(8) Be prepared on 48 hour notice to be relieved of present mission and to assume the mission of either of the other battalions within the 1st Marine Regiment.

b. Operations.

(1) The overall concept of operation within the TAO is for three rifle companies to conduct saturation patrol/ambush activity within their respective areas of operation, while the remaining rifle company conducts mobile operations within the Battalion TAO.

(2) During October, the Battalion utilized both critical terrain and watch towers for observation posts during the hours of daylight. This tactic not only provided cognizance of many densely vegetated areas and thus potential enemy harbor sites, but also significantly reduced the number of Marine booby trap casualties.

(3) Long Range combat patrols continued to operate throughout the T.A.O.R. Each rifle company operated such patrols on a continuing basis within their designated A.O. The S-2 Scouts conducted long range patrols in those areas targeted by current intelligence information. Long range patrols were conducted in order to increase the amount of ground that was physically occupied and to depart from any possible routine that may have been established by units departing from and returning to their Patrol Bases on a regular schedule.

(4) Vietnamese civilians continued to turn in large amounts of ordnance to Marines and supplied periodic intelligence. This information, coupled with the employment of aerial observers and an extensive U.S. intelligence effort, produced significant results in that, as of 1 November in the last 130 days only a single rocket had been fired from the Battalion's T.A.O.R.

(5) Operations were characterized by continued close cooperation and liaison with Vietnamese Military and Civilian Officials. The many Regional Forces (RF) and Popular Forces (PF) units located within the Battalion T.A.O.R. carried an ever increasing portion of the defense and safeguarding of their areas. Operation Saturation commenced at 2400H on 21 October 1970. The concept of this operation was to get Vietnamese military units out into the hamlets and fields on a continuous basis, providing better security for the people and greater control of the countryside. These activities were most often joint ventures ensuring the closest of coordination.

(6) Adapting its tactics to the monsoon season and the channelized lines of communications, the Battalion continued to stress road blocks and cordon and search operations as the best methods to root out the Viet Cong infrastructure. Road blocks were run every day on the main arteries that traverse the Battalion's Area of Operation. Three cordon and search operations were run during the month of October and many more were in the planning stages for execution during the following months.

(7) Surviving Typhoon Kate on 24 October 1970, the Battalion learned some valuable lessons about operating and communicating in the worst of monsoon weather. Five days later this experience was invaluable as eight (8) platoons were emergency extracted without losing one Marine when almost the whole Battalion T.A.O.R. was inundated with four to ten feet of water by the worst flash flood that had hit the Da Nang area in over six years.

c. Significant Actions and Events.

(1) At 0600H on 2 October a high threat period commenced.

(2) On 2 October twenty-five (25) foot towers were delivered and installed at Echo 1's PPB (AT977673) and Hotel 3's PPB (BT089676).

(3) On 2 October a three phased, joint operation kicked off in the Battalion Area of Operation. The concept of operation had a Vietnamese Seal Commando Team working the waters of the area under the cover and protection of USMC and PF/RF units.

(4) Fox Company of the 2d Battalion, 7th Marines, was returned to the operational control of the 7th Marines.

(5) October 5th through 6th saw the indoctrination training of thirty-one (31) Marines who came to the Battalion from the 7th Marines.

(6) A personal response class conducted by a team from III MAF and the 1st Marine Division G-5 section taught a combined group of Battalion Officers and men at 0900H on 6 October 1970.

(7) On 7, 8, and 9 October a 1st Engineer Battalion Mobile Contact Team talked to a total of 127 Marines and Navy Corpsmen.

(8) At 2400H on the 8th of October a cordon and search operation of the village of Lion Lac (1) was initiated. The capture of four (04) VCS and assorted ordnance resulted from the operation.

(9) CUPP 23 sprung a night ambush at 2130H on 8 October. The results were one VC KIA, one AK-47 captured, and six (06) detainees found hiding in a house.

(10) At 0300 on 10 October two Regional Force Soldiers of the 11th RF Company were killed when B-40 rockets hit their bunker guarding Tu Cau Hamlet (BT048658).

(11) The 1st Marine Division Malaria Contact Team gave instruction to 199 Marines and Navy Corpsmen throughout the Battalion.

(12) At 0055H a single 110mm rocket was fired from the Battalion Area Of Operations at (AT983664). This ended 113 days in the AO without an indirect fire attack.

(13) Echo Company participated in a one day operation with the 59th Regional Force Battalion. The results were three (03) Viet Cong Suspects captured and one (01) cave discovered and destroyed.

(14) The 2d platoon of Hotel came into the Battalion rear for a four (04) day rehabilitation training period on the 12th of October.

(15) At 1800H on 12 October 1970 a high threat period commenced.

(16) 1600H on 16 October marked the end of the high threat period.

(17) In the vicinity of BT021683 at 2130H on 16 October Fox 3/2 made contact that resulted in two Marine medovacs, one of which died of wounds.

(18) CG 1st Marine Division Message 000926Z October 1970 made Fox Company the Division reserve company.

(19) At 1700H on 18 October 1970 the cordon and search of Hui Kim San (BT072709) was completed. Two detainees were taken.

(20) Hotel 2/1, at grid BT073682, killed one Viet Cong and captured two AK-47s, two pistols, and numerous documents on the 19th of October.

(21) Golf's third Platoon came to the Battalion rear for a four (04) day rehabilitation training period on the 20th of October.

(22) At 2400H on 21 October Operation Saturation commenced. The concept of this operation was to get the Vietnamese military units out into the hamlets and field on a continuous basis.

(23) At 1930H on 22 October a claymore mine was command detonated on a patrol from 2d platoon of Fox Company, killing one (01) Navy Corpsman and wounding two (02) Marines.

(24) In response to Typhoon Kate, Storm condition II was set at 0800H on the 24th and changed to condition I at 1550H. The storm hit during the night and was downgraded to a tropical storm by 0700H on the 25th of October. At 1500H on the 25th the all clear signal was given.

(25) At 1200H on 27 October a cordon and search of Trung Luong Hamlet (BT042722) was completed. 130 people were screened and two M-26 grenades were found.

(26) On the 27th the first platoon of Fox Company came to the Battalion rear for a four (04) day rehabilitation training period.

(27) At 2310H on the 28th of October a Marine lost his footing while crossing a swollen stream (AT971661) and was swept away by the current. His body was later found and identified.

(28) On the night of the 29th and the early morning of the 30th of October a flash flood engulfed the Battalion Area of Operations. Most of the units in the field had to be extracted to Hill 55 (AT967618) or Camp Lauer (BT064704) by air.

2. Air Support.

a. The Battalion's air support for the month of October was hampered by inclement weather and a restriction on fire support which includes Close Air Support (CAS). Also, due to inclement weather, liaison runs normally facilitated by the visual reconnaissance (VR) were either rescheduled or conducted by vehicle. Helicopters were obtained from MAG-16 and OV-10, aerial observation aircraft, from MAG-11. Other fixed

wing support, such as flareships and Close Air Support (CAS) missions, were flown the Air Force and Marine Corps pilots with direction furnished by Marine Aerial Observers.

b. The Battalion had a total of fifty-nine (59) medevac missions in October, evacuating eighty-three (83) personnel. There were twenty-seven (27) U.S. emergency, twelve (12) U.S. priority, eleven (11) civilian emergency, five (05) civilian priority, one (01) civilian routine, fourteen (14) ARVN emergency, seven (07) ARVN priority, one (01) ARVN routine and five (05) ARVN permanent routine. The shortest delay for an emergency medevac was five minutes with the longest being forty-four minutes. The average time for all emergency medevacs missions was sixteen minutes. This time was computed as the time elapsing from the moment when the medevac was called into the Battalion COC until the casualty was airborne.

c. There were 312 resupply sorties flown carrying 517,000 pounds of cargo and 336 passengers.

d. Eighteen (18) visual reconnaissance (VR) missions were completed in the month of October. The VR was utilized to conduct liaison runs, administrative move of passengers and for visual reconnaissance.

e. Sixteen (16) aerial observation (AO) missions were flown, seven (07) of which were used to control close air support missions. The balance of the AO missions were utilized to observe areas of suspected ammo caches, possible rocket launch sites and possible enemy movement.

f. Mission eighty (80) was diverted to conduct an emergency extraction. In extremely bad weather conditions 290 personnel were extracted from positions where the water ranged from four (04) to ten (10) foot deep as a result of a flash flood.

g. Seven (07) close air support missions were flown expending 11,500 pounds of napalm, 44,000 pounds of bombs and three (03) M-83 gun pods (20mm). The targets consisted of bunker complexes, suspected VC/NVA haven sites and heavily booby trapped areas. Target destruction/coverage was good to excellent. On one occasion a flareship was utilized to provide illumination for an engaged unit.

3. Artillery and Fire Support

a. Artillery fire support for 2d Battalion, 1st Marines was provided by Battery "B", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and three (03) tubes of Battery "W", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. Reinforcing fires were provided by two (02) M114 155mm Howitzers attached to Battery "B", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and "B" Platoon, 2d Eight Inch Guns.

b. 1st Battalion, 11th Marines remained in direct support of 1st Marines during October with Battery "B", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and "B" Platoon, 2d Eight Inch Guns collocated at Hill 55.

c. Thirty-eight (38) observed missions were fired, nine (09) of which were contact illumination fired in support of allied units in the Battalion TAO. Harassment and interdiction fires totalled 119 targets. These targets were planned on suspected enemy assembly areas, known enemy bunker areas, and suspected enemy infiltration routes. The rounds expended during October were: sixty-four (64) 105mm High Explosive, fourteen (14) 105mm illuminating, two (02) 105mm White Phosphorus, 408 4.2 inch High Explosive, thirty-three (33) 4.2 inch illuminating, and sixty-nine (69) 4.2 inch White Phosphorus.

d. The 81mm mortar platoon fired twenty-eight (28) observed missions, fourteen (14) of which were contact illumination missions fired in support of activities engaged with the enemy. The remaining missions were prep fires on two (02) targets in support of the Camp Lauer defenses. The 81mm mortar platoon expended 1,475 High Explosive, 1,158 illuminating, and 101 White Phosphorus rounds during the month of October. One mortar section was located in the Camp Lauer Combat Base (BT081703), one section at Sea Anchor (BT082698), one section at the Company G Combat Base (BT043687), one tube at the Company E Combat Patrol Base at Hill 55, and one tube at the 17th Armored Cavalry Compound (AT990675).

e. Due to artillery incidents involving injury of civilians, several measures were taken to prevent the recurrence of such incidents. Those are:

1. No intells or pre-emptive will be fired within 1,000 meters of an inhabited area.

2. The rules of engagement and normal clearance distances apply to units in contact or units making a positive confirmed enemy sighting (i.e. distinctive uniforms, weapons, etc.) within 1,000 meters of an inhabited area.

At this time the Vietnamese are preparing a new edition of the friendly village overlay for the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines TAO and 1,000 meters from all 2d Battalion, 1st Marines boundaries to assist in the planning of fires. Also, the present RF/PF area saturation program makes clearance of fires especially difficult.

1. Training

a. Training consists of indoctrination training for replacements, platoon rehabilitation training, formal schools and refresher training as required.

b. The replacement indoctrination course is broken down as follows:

(1) 5 day course. Conducted for replacement personnel initially coming into the Republic of Viet Nam. During the month of October eight Marines completed the course. The subjects included: IIC and Finster Spending, Pay and Allowances, Emergency Leave, Record of Emergency Data, Evac/Casualty procedures, CMI program, R&D, Postal Regulations, Private Weapons, PX facilities, Request Post, Respect for Religions Based on Customs of Viet Nam, Moral Guidance, Red Cross, S-2 Mission, VC/NV: Mission, THOR/Weather, Enemy Forces, Enemy Tactics, Rewards Programs, Handling of IO's, Care of Maps, VC/NVA Infrastructure, Interpreters and Kit Caren Employment, Security Compromise, War Trophies, Scouting and Patrolling, Basic Map Reading and Aerial Photos, Password and Countersign, Terrain Analysis and Navigation, Employment of Snipers, Battalion Mission, Supporting Arms, Air Support, Rules of Engagement, Troop Conduct, MACV Rules of Engagement, Vietnamese Armed Forces, Spot Reports, Ambushes and Counter Ambushes, Demolitions and Destruction of Booby Traps, Booby Traps, Booby Trap Lane, Compass, Small Unit Tactics, Employment of Chemical Agents, Motor Transport, Supplies, Discarded Equipment, Armory, Engineers, Civil Affairs, Psychological Warfare, Vietnamese Customs/Personal Response, Chieu Hoi Program, Scouts, Pacification, Assisting Vietnamese People, Conduct/Attitude toward Vietnamese Nationals, Vietnamese Political Parties, Off Limit Areas, Prostitution, Narcotics, Alcohol, Local Assistance, Accidental Discharges, Loss of Weapons, Buddy Kill, Heat Casualties, Personal Hygiene, Preventative Medicine, Venereal Disease, Anti-Malaria Measures, Military Decorum, Local Regulations, Military Courtesy and Discipline, Weapons Safety, (Our Mortar, Claymore Mines, Grenade Safety and M-26 Fragmentation Grenade, M-16 Rifle, Care and Cleaning, Battalion Range Regulations, Full Firing, Zeroing Weapons, and Quick Fire/Quick Kill.

(2) 3 day course. Conducted for replacement personnel joining the Battalion from other "in country" commands. This training is designed to disseminate requirements and tactics relevant to the Battalion's THOR Eighty-one (81) Marines attended this course during the month of October. The subjects included: Tactical Update, Legal Considerations, Vietnamese Relations, Religion and Personal Welfare, Quick Fire/Quick Kill, Military Bearing and Leadership, Booby Trap Lane, Countermeasures for Mines and Booby Traps, Night Fire "X", COC Brief, Communications Security, Personal Affairs and Logistics.

c. On 6 October 1970 a six hour Personal Response class was presented by a combined Civil Affairs Instruction Team composed of G-5 personnel from both III MAF and 1st Marine Division. Four (04) officers, five (05) Staff NCO's and sixteen (16) NCO's attended the class.

d. On 7, 8, and 9 October the Mine/Bocby Trap Mobile Contact Team from the 1st Engineer Battalion instructed 127 Marines and Sailors on countermeasures of mines and bocby traps.

e. On 10 October twenty (20) Marines graduated from the Battalion's three-week Vietnamese Language School. The instructor of the class formerly taught at the III MAF Vietnamese Language School. Eighty-four hours of instruction were given with the aim of teaching the students a 400-500 word vocabulary.

f. On 12 and 13 October, the 1st Marine Division Malaria Contact Team presented instruction to 197 Marines and Sailors. The classes were oriented towards familiarization with Malaria and preventative measures that can be readily employed.

g. On 20 October seventy-four (74) indigenous personnel and three (03) of their U.S. Army Green Beret Advisors attended a landmine warfare training program given by this Battalion. Instruction included lecture, demonstration, and application. The application consisted of going through the Battalion's Bocby Trap Lane.

h. A total of forty-three (43) Marines from the Battalion, attending three different five (05) day sessions, graduated from the Landmine Warfare Resident Course as presented by the 1st Engineer Battalion.

i. During October 177 Marines underwent Quick Fire/Quick Kill training. Fifty-two Marines completed familiarization firing which included field zoning their weapons. All of this instruction, thirty-four (34) hours, was completed on the Battalion 1,000 inch range.

j. The 2d Platoon of Hotel Company (28 men), the 3d Platoon of Golf Company (35 men), and the 1st Platoon of Fox Company (41 men) all completed the four day Platoon rehabilitation training program. The intensive and carefully planned programs were highlighted by a Battalion Commanders inspection, presentations by the Division Drug Abuse Team and the G-5 personal response lecturer, and immediate action and patrolling instruction by U.S. Army Green Beret personnel. Other subjects of instruction included Map Reading, Bocby Trap Countermeasures, Career Planning, CIT, Communications Security, Air Support, Hygiene and First Aid, Leadership, Ambush Tips, Chaplain's talk, S-2 and S-3 briefs, Quick Fire/Quick Kill techniques, Night Firing, a COC brief, the M-16 Rifle and Physical Fitness.

k. On 10 October 1970 (10) indigenous personnel and three (03) of their U.S. Army Green Beret Advisors attended a landmine warfare training program given by this Battalion. Instruction included lecture, demonstration, and application. The application consisted of going through the Battalion's Bocby Trap Lane.

LOGISTICS

1. Logistics

a. During the month of October, resupply of Camp Lauer was accomplished by truck. Organic and attached units were resupplied by helicopter, truck, and huskie. There were 330 helicopter lifts with a combined weight of approximately 517,500 pounds. A detachment of 2½ ton trucks from First Motor Transport Battalion traveled 9,600 road miles and transported approximately 578,400 pounds of supplies in support of the Battalion. Six huskies from 11th Motor Transport Battalion provided support from 1-14 October. During this period they transported approximately 78,000 pounds of supplies.

b. There were five work orders completed in October. The perimeter berm surrounding Camp Lauer was reconstructed. Two SEA huts were constructed on top of OP Crowsnest to replace the huts previously destroyed by high winds. Contaminant roads were covered with laterite, graded, and covered with oil. A SEA hut was constructed at the main gate to Camp Lauer for the use of the S-5 in processing Vietnamese laborers. Culverts were installed to improve drainage in the vicinity of Special Services during the monsoon season.

c. Work was begun but not completed on several other work orders during October. It was determined that further work was necessary to clear fields of fire around the Camp Lauer perimeter. Heavy equipment was brought in and work had progressed considerably by the end of the month. During September a request was submitted to fill the hole around the Battalion landing zone and the area immediately surrounding it with laterite and oil. The work was approximately 75% completed by the end of October. Action was initiated on a work order to balance the electrical system at Camp Lauer. Electricians from First Engineer Battalion made their initial survey, and actual work is scheduled to begin shortly.

An engineer assistance request was submitted for equipment to fill in the low area adjacent to COC to eliminate pooling of water. This area is becoming a mosquito hazard. Another request was submitted for assistance in constructing new gates for Camp Lauer's front and rear entrances. The present gates are not considered tactically sound. Additionally, a work request was re-submitted for repair of the existing roofs covering the Officer's Club, Staff NCO Club and the Enlisted Club at Camp Lauer. No action has been taken as of yet on these requests.

d. During October, great emphasis was placed on renovation of the Camp Lauer perimeter. In addition to the clearing of fields of fire and the planned installation of new gates, a limited reworking of the of the perimeter was begun. All bunkers were renovated, strengthened, and rain proof covers installed. Culverts were constructed at each position to ensure that personnel have a dry place to sleep.

e. During the month of October, the Battalion Laundry Unit washed and dried approximately 28,740 pounds of clothing. The unit is still operating ineffectively because of the Camp's electrical power shortage. Steps have been taken to provide a generator to effectively operate the laundry unit.

2. Motor Transport

a. The Battalion Motor Transport Section operates and is organized in accordance with the prescribed T/O of an Infantry Battalion. The various facets of Motor Transport include a dispatch window, records clerk, vehicle parking, maintenance, wash point, lubrication rack, tire repair shop, battery shop and living quarters for Motor Transport personnel.

b. The vehicles organic to the Battalion Motor Transport Section are twenty-two M51A1, four M37E1 personnel carriers, eighteen M46 trailers, four M101 trailers and six M49 water trailers. The communication vehicles include two MRC 123, two MRC 109 and one MRC 124.

c. There are four key personnel who retain their vehicles twenty-four hours a day. These are the Battalion Commander, the Battalion Executive Officer, the Operations Officer and the H&S Company Commander. In addition, one personnel carrier and a jeep and trailer have been permanently assigned to Company E on Hill 55 in support of the Company's GUPP units. All other vehicles are dispatched on a twelve hour a day basis. Emphasis is placed on providing the Companies with all the Motor Transport necessary to support their operations in the field. The remainder of the vehicles are handled by task orientated vehicle request forms. These forms are submitted sixteen hours prior to the section or individual needing the vehicle. Upon receiving these requests a decision is made as to the tactical necessity and importance of the mission and the vehicles are dispatched accordingly.

d. Battalion Motor Transport's proscribed echelons of maintenance include first and second. Driver's maintenance is performed daily by the driver of the vehicle. Once a week or when required, the driver performs preventative maintenance on his vehicle. This includes a thorough lubrication and check of vital areas of the vehicle, such as battery, gauges and air cleaner.

e. Quarterly's and annuals are performed by trained Motor Transport personnel. Such maintenance includes an extensive check of the vehicle's encompassing spark plugs, wheel bearings, points, carburetor and numerous other items that are out of the realm of first echelon driver maintenance.

f. Spot checks are performed to insure that the drivers are performing their required echelon of maintenance. All weekly PM's are inspected and the PM sheet is signed by a qualified mechanic.

g. Supplies are requisitioned by a Motor Transport Supply man. He retains daily drop sheets as well as a requisitioning file. These files

are reconciled on a weekly basis. A daily check is made of the Motor Transport issue point at Battalion Supply for incoming parts.

h. Current Status/Forecast

(1) As of 30 October 1970 two mules are on deadline for second echelon MORS. One M-37 personnel carrier is declined on third echelon MORS at FLC. Three M-151 jeeps are declined. One jeep is declined for second echelon MORS waiting an exhaust system, the jeep is declined for third echelon MORS at FLC, and the other is being prepared to be given code H status.

(2) Recently the Motor Transport Section had two M151's given a status of Code H. A M-37 personnel carrier was picked up by us and one was invoiced over to Headquarters Battalion. This puts us up to T/E level with four M-37's operational.

3. Supply

a. Three (03) Marines with the MOS 3041 and three (03) Marines with the MOS 3051 rotated during October. No additional supply MOS personnel were joined by the section.

b. Shortages are apparent for 9R tropical combat boots, rifle cleaning rods, bore brushes for M-16 and M-79. M-60 machine gun cleaning patches are still in short supply. BA-4386 batteries are difficult to obtain when the normal supply channels are followed. This problem necessitates an unusually large number of walk-thru requisitions to be submitted. Difficulties continue to be apparent for procurement of Trixano (heat).

c. The warehouse and office section are presently engaged in efforts to rectify errors found by the FSIO Inspection Team and are in the process of carrying out the recommendations that were presented by the FSIO Inspection Team.

CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

1. Civil Affairs/Civic Action

a. Public Works. The month of October was a fairly active one in the area of public works. Twenty-four (24) culverts were delivered to Xuan Tra for their drainage project. Eight (08) dumptruck loads of sand and fifty (50) engineer stakes were delivered to Hoa Long Village for their new market place. Also one (01) trailerload of tools, left behind by amtracks, were distributed to Xuan Tra (ILH). Five truckloads of lumber were delivered to Tan Luu for the new school which is under construction there.

b. Welfare. During October, a total of 40,250\$VN was paid for local hire and the AIK (Assistance In Kind) employment fund. This program accomplishes two basic things; first, it enables needy Vietnamese to earn money on a daily basis for their food, etc., secondly, it provides a temporary work force that can perform many of the menial tasks throughout the cantonment i. e., police, burning feces, etc., which frees that many more Marines for other uses. At present there are twelve (12) Vietnamese working for the Battalion under the AIK (Assistance In Kind) program. They work and are paid on a daily basis, and receive a maximum of 150\$VN per day.

c. Education. This month Tan Luu fishing Lanlet began actual construction on their new school. Building materials came from three (03) towers at Sea Anchor. Ten to fifteen people plus the R.D. from Tan Luu supplied the work force necessary to gather the wood. Five truckloads of lumber were finally obtained to be utilized for the new school.

d. Security. One (01) case of hand illumination canisters was delivered to the PSDF (Peoples Self Defense Force) of Xuan Tra (ILH) to aid them in spotting the enemy during periods of poor illumination.

e. Solatium. A total of 17,000\$VN was paid out in solatiums this past month for three (03) incidents resulting in three (03) injuries and three (03) deaths to Vietnamese in the area. One death occurred in a traffic accident. In this case the victim suddenly stepped into the path of an oncoming Marine personnel carrier. In another case the victim was injured by a Fox Company, 2/7 Marine. In the last incident two injuries and two deaths were sustained by Vietnamese civilians when a Bravo Battery, 11th Marines, fire mission landed near their home. In reference to the traffic accident, driver safety classes were held which emphasized the problem encountered in traffic with Vietnamese and how to possibly prevent similar incidents in the future.

f. Personal Response. A total of 126 enlisted men and nine (09) officers joined the Battalion during the month of October and were given an indoctrination brief covering the many facets of Civil Affairs and stressing personal response. The Personal Response Contact Team from G-5

COMMUNICATIONS

1. Communications

a. Normal Battalion communications were provided by the Communications Platoon during the month of October. A critical shortage of batteries, BA-4386, required limited operations for a four day period in mid-month, and a typhoon and monsoons hampered operations throughout October.

b. Radio Relay Section. This section continued to provide radio relay channels from the Battalion to 1st Marines. Weather and equipment malfunction, compounded by a damaged field wire cable, resulted in a 125 down time for the month. Courier runs supplemented operations during those periods.

c. Radio Section. Tactical, administrative and logistical communications support was provided by this section. In addition to those daily requirements, special purpose nets were manned during the two typhoons which plagued the area. A one day CPX was conducted, with the basic communications necessary to support the Battalion being located and operated from Golf Company Patrol Base. The one persistent problem during this time period was the shortage of batteries BA-4386 and BA-30, a condition which is slowly being rectified with the entry of additional batteries into the supply system. Section personnel participated in an on-site inventory and waterproofing of Rifle Company communications equipment, and at the same time provided operator instruction in care and operation of the radios.

d. Wire Section. Battalion and guard requirements were met on a 24 hour basis by the section. New lines were overhauled to the positions of the perimeter defense network, and a section of twenty-five pair cable was buried from the switchboard to the main frame in the vicinity of the Combat Operation Center. Normal system maintenance, to include replacement of terminal TM-184 with terminal box TA-125 was conducted.

e. Message Center Section. Message traffic for the section for the month of October was 51 outgoing and 815 incoming messages. This total was processed with a down time of 78 hours which relates to an efficiency factor of approximately 90%. The predominant contributor to this total time was the non-availability of the 1st Marines radio relay system.

f. Electronics Maintenance Section. Normal repair and second echelon operations during the month were supplemented by field visits to two rifle companies and subsequent maintenance/repair of their equipment. The section received Code "W" letters on three Telephones, TA-1, and one Switchboard, SB-22, six Radio Sets, and RP-841 are on backorder.

MEDICAL & DENTAL

1. Medical and Dental

a. The Battalion Surgeons are Lt R. D. COX, MC, USNR and Lt R. L. FROEB, MC, USNR. The Battalion Chief is HMC G. L. ADAMS, USN. During this reporting period, the Battalion had three officers (2 Medical Corps and 1 Chaplain Corps) and fifty enlisted in the field and in garrison.

b. The Battalion Aid Station treated nine hundred fifty patients during the month. The Division Preventative Medicine Units Monthly Sanitation Inspection Report was submitted and the discrepancies were noted and corrected.

c. Analysis of mortality figures reveals that there were two USMC KIA, zero USMC DOW. Fifteen USMC MIA, forty-one USMC NBC, zero USMC DIA, zero USMC WABE, and zero MIA. There was one USN KIA, one USN WIA, and three USN NBC.

d. Analysis of routine treatment revealed twenty-one cases of diarrhea, twenty-two cases of upper respiratory infection, eighteen cases of foot disorders, twenty cases of skin disorders, eleven cases of gonorrhea, eight cases of fever of undetermined origin, two cases of immersion foot, one new case of malaria and no hepatitis. There were two hundred eighty-three Dental Patients seen.

e. The civilian medical program was active. There were seven hundred and thirty-seven Vietnamese civilians treated for medical reasons, none of which were due to combat related injuries. Four Vietnamese civilians were treated for dental reasons.

CHAPLAIN

1. Chaplain

a. On 7 October 1970 Lt. Julian GNALL, CHC, USNR, rotated. Rev. Gnall had served the 2d Battalion since 15 October 1969. His unstinting loyalty and Christian dedication to this Battalion gave spiritual and personal assistance to an untold number of men in this unit. The Battalion's gratitude was expressed to Father Gnall at a Special "Mass Night" on 3 October in his honor.

b. During the month of October, Chaplain Frank D. MINTJAL, Lt., USNR, who arrived in Camp Lauer 30 September 1970, offered a total of twenty-five Catholic services with four hundred and twenty in attendance. Ten Protestant services were conducted for two hundred and fifty-eight Battalion personnel by Cdr. E. ANDRESS, USN, the Regimental Chaplain.

c. During October forty-three Marines were counselled, six hospital visits were made and two brig visits were conducted by the Battalion Chaplain. In addition two Marines were assisted in obtaining Welfare reports via Red Cross, and five Marines were aided in attempts to place MRS calls.

d. Four Moral guidance lectures were given to a total of 127 Marines in the Battalion.

e. Two good-will visits were made to Sacred Heart Orphanage. On each occasion two Marines accompanied the Chaplain, and they distributed ten crates of surplus vegetables and fruit, five boxes of children's clothing, and sweet-tooth items donated by the '81' Platoon.

f. The Chaplain attended three lecture/seminars this month, one sponsored by the Chaplain's Section of XXIV Corps and two by the Chaplain's Section of 1st Marine Division. These half-day sessions are a continuing attempt to obtain the spiritual and practical betterment of the Chaplains of Military Region I.

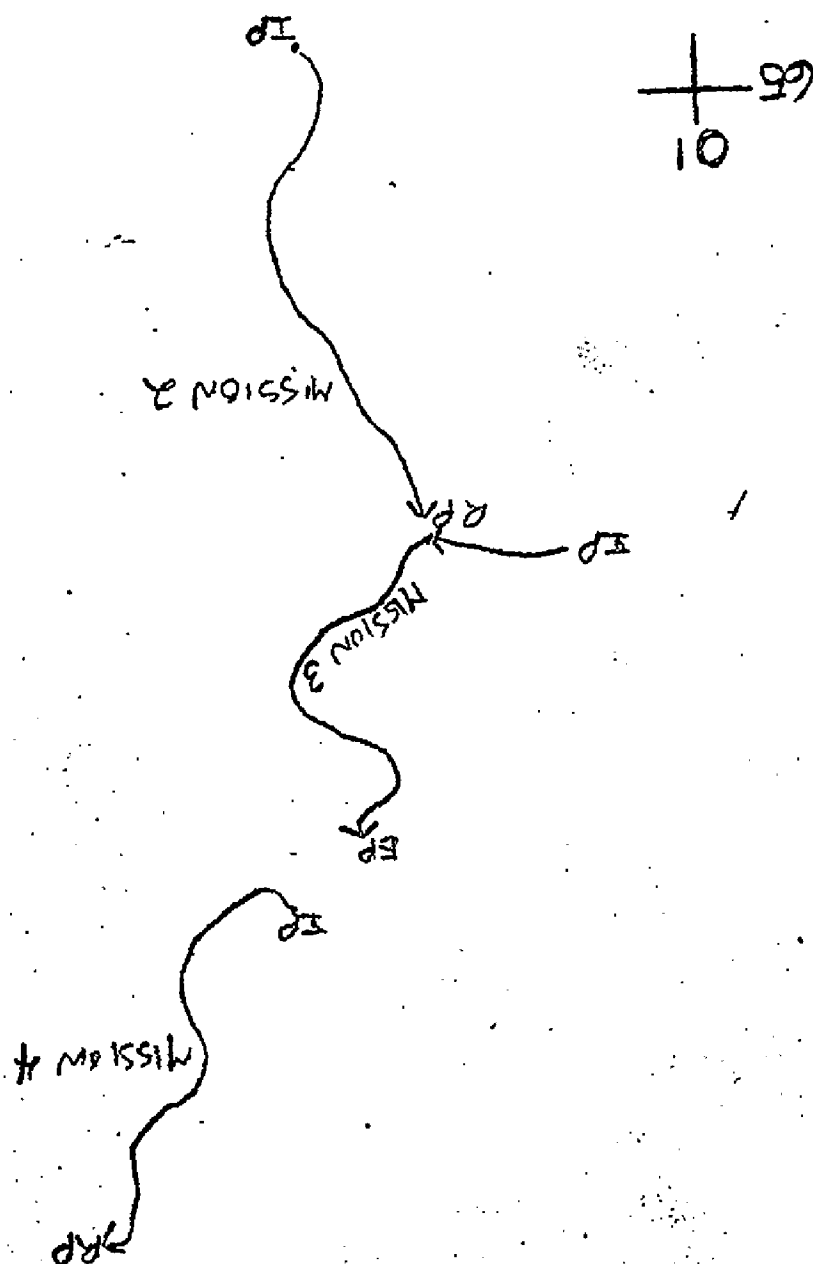

1. SITUATION.

a. Enemy Forces. 59th RF Battalion intelligence sources indicate that VC cross Vinh Dien river in the vicinity of BT032691, BT027687, and BT030665 to effect liaison and to carry rice from east to west. Also, VC use early morning sampam traffic on the Vinh Dien north of grid line BT070 as cover to move into Da Nang.

2. MISSION. 2d Battalion, 1st Marines, in cooperation/coordination with allied RVNAF units, conducts riverine patrol operation on the Vinh Dien river to interdict enemy movement.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of Operation. On 21 October 1970, a section of two Patrol Boats, River (PER) will enter the Vinh Dien shortly before dark and proceed to the Tu Cau Bridge. After dark the section will drift downstream to selected ambush points, exiting from the river at first light. The section will destroy or capture any enemy attempting to cross or descend the river. Friendly forces on each bank will coordinate their activities with the section's movement and be prepared to provide a reaction/relief force if required.

The following were found in a twenty-five (25) meter radius of 105mm illumination canister; two (02) more 105mm canisters with explosives inside with parachute string utilized as a trip wire, one (01) M-26 grenade with parachute string trip wire, fifteen (15) M-14 rounds, two poppers all placed in one square foot area and two (02) homemade Chi-coms with pull friction fuse attached to larger explosives underground. No markers or markings of any kind were found to indicate the booby traps. The Platoon Leader decided the area was too heavily booby trapped and could not be entered without further casualties. The sweep was secured and all booby traps were blown in place.
