1. <u>Energy</u>. Although energy contacts remained at the same level as last reporting period with nine (9) exchanges of fire, energy berby trap omplacement increased. There was one recket launching from our TLOT and one incident of incoming morter fire at Hill 55.

There was one (1) significant item of military intelligence reported. At 191400H, while on a daytime activity, patrol spectrol one (1) VC/NVA running across garden 5-10 maters in front of them. Frint man yelled to stop and another VC/NVA came out of bushes 15 maters army, firing AK-47 at point man. One (1) VC/NVA located in tree used as a lock out was shot. Fatrol returned fire as VC/NVA flad. Captured were two (2) AK-47's, one (1) 9mm pistol and one (1) K-6 pistol. Fatrol swept area resulting in several blood trails found.

3. Order of Battle. On the 21st of September a change in 2/1's TiON was initiated and finalized on the 37th of September. This 10 change did not effect the present OOB within our TION. There are no North Vistnesse army or Main Force units located as a unit in 2/1's TAOR. The energy is expected to follow it's three phase offensive during the following menths.

4. Monther and Torrain.

a. Wather. The average high temperature was 62 degrees and the average low temperature was 72 degrees with an average humidity of 70%. Rain for the month was 24.60 inches.





Due to the fact that 2/l's TiOR is in the louland area, flooding can be expected over 74% of the area during the meason. The flooding of the louland areas will cause a champlization of both friendly and enemy travel. It is felt by S-2, 2/l that booky traps will become even more prevelent because we are restricted to predetermined routes.

b. <u>Torrain</u>. The terrain in 2/1's TAOR is flat and sandy with rice paddies and scattered broken treelines. There are two main water transportation routes, the Vinh Dien River in the east and the Yen River in the west. In addition, there are numerous lakes, pends and paddies where boot traffic is heavy.

5. S-2 Functions.

- and none were terminated. The three (3) security charances were initiated and none were terminated. The three (3) cherances initiated were required by Compunications Section personnel, and the S-3 (lphs.
- b. <u>INVN Interpreters</u>: The S-2 Section new has seven (7) interpreters who are assigned to different units to aid in the "on the spot" interpretation of detaines information and any documents which need an immediate readout.
- c. S-2 lorsemel: Ithough four (4) now personnel joined the section this menth (cm (1) Gunnery Serjoant and three (3) Serjoants) one (1) Serjoant was nedeviced when he detracted a booby trap. The S-2 Secuts continue to work as a Room Squal.
- d. VII Funds: The allocation of Voluntary Informant Program Funds remains a part of the S-2 function. I total of 52,500VN\$ was spent during the month of October. The VIF Program is not only a source of intelligence information, but it also eliminates the availability of ordinace to the enemy.
- e. KCS Program: There are a total of twelve (12) KCS assigned to the Battalian. By walking with the point man on patrols, the KCS are able to tot as an early warning for beeby trans and ambushes due to their familiarities with the enemy's tactics, habits and signs.
- f. Training: The S-2 Section continued to furnish instructors on call for indectrination training. At this time they are briefed on energy, weather, terrain and the expedilities and functions of the S-2 Section.
- 2. Figs: The S-2 Office has a full surply of mans of 2/1's TAON and will continue to surply them as needed.
- h. <u>Introl Debriofs</u>: Fatrol debrief forms have been disseminated to all company recon squads in order to maintain an up to date intelligence picture. These forms, when filled out, are returned to the S-2 Office.

i. Special Limison Term: The S-2 Officer has operational control of a Special Limison Term located in Nui Kim Son. It consists of twolve (12) unlisted personnel. Their function is to act as a special intelligence pathering and posification source. Uthough in its early stages, it has proved effective in accomplishing the job for which they are designed.





FART II SACTION C OI ERATIONS

1. Operations

- a. Mission. The 2d Battalion, 1st Marines was assigned the mission to:
- (1) Conduct unilateral and combined offensive operations within the assigned TAOR to locate and destroy enemy forces, installations and LOC, with primary emphasis on these forces and bases which hase the greatest threat to GVN control of important population and economic centers and to the security of friendly military installations.
- (2) Deploy forces throughout assigned TAOR to provide defense of the Da Nang vital area and military complex with emphasis on avenues of approach to known/suspected morter/rocket positions, to include waterways.
- (3) Be prepared to provide a reaction force for relief of Hearman District Headquarters and CAI/CUIT's within the TiOR.
- (4) In ecoperation and coordination with FALF and District Headquarters, maintain continuous program to upgrade hamlets within the TaOR in accordance with the Pacification Program.
- (5) Provide security for readswors and other engineer projects as required.
 - (6) Support Rovelutionary Development Progrem within TAOR.
- on 12 hour notice.
- (8) be propared on 48 hour notice to be relieved of present mission and to assume the mission of either of the other battalions within the 1st Marina Regiment.

b. Operations.

- (1) The everall except of operation within the TACA is for three rifle companies to conduct saturation patrol/embush activity within their respective areas of operation, while the remaining rifle company conducts mobile operations within the Battalian TACA.
- (2) During October, the Battalian utilized both critical terrain and watch towers for observation posts during the hours of daylight. This tactic not only provided cognizance of many densely vegetated areas and thus retential enemy harbor sites; but also significantly reduced the number of Parine booby tray essulties.

- (3) Long Range combat matrols continued to operate throughout the TaOR. Each rifle company operated such patrols on a continuing basis within their designated AO. The S-2 Scouts conducted long range patrols in these areas targeted by current intelligence information. Long range patrols were conducted in order to increase the amount of ground that was physically occupied and to depart from any possible routine that may have been established by units departing from and returning to their Patrol Bases on a regular schedule.
- (4) Victorause civilians continued to turn in large amounts of orderace to Marines and supplied periodic intelligence. This information, coupled with the amplement of social observers and an extensive U.S. intelligence offert, produced significant results in that, as of I Nevember in the last 130 days only a single rocket had been fired from the Battalian's T.OR.
- (5) Operations were characterized by continued close corporation and limited with Vietnamese Military and Civilian Officials. The many Regional Forces (RF) and Expulse Forces (FF) units becated within the Bettelien T.OR carried an ever increasing portion of the defense and safeguarding of their areas. Operation Saturation commonced at 2400H on 21 October 1970. The concept of this operation was to get Vietnamese military units cut into the hambets and fields on a continuous basis, providing better security for the marphe and greater control of the countryside. These activities were most often joint ventures ensuring the closest of coordination.
- (6) Mapting its tactics to the manager sees and the channelized lines of communications, the matching continued to stress read blocks and corden and search operations as the best methods to root out the Vist Cong infrastructure. Read blocks were run every day on the main arteries that traverse the Battelian's Area of Operation. Three corden and search operations were run during the month of October and many more were in the clanning stages for execution during the following months.
- (7) Surviving Typho n Nate in 24 October 1970, the Battalian learned same valuable lessons about operating and extruminating in the worst of meason weather. Five days later this experience was invaluable as eight (00) plateons were energency extracted without lesing one Marine when almost the whole Battalian TAON was inundated with four to ten feet of water by the worst flash flood that had hit the Da Nang area in over six years.

c. Significant Actions and Events.

- (1) At 0600H on 2 October a high throat period commenced.
- (2) On 2 October twenty-five (25) foot towers were delivered and installed at Echo 1's PPB (AT977673) and Hotel 3's PPB (BT089676).




- (3) On 2 October a three phased, joint operation kicked off in the Britislian Area of Operation. The concept of operation had a Vietnamese Scal Commundo Team working the waters of the area under the cover and protection of USMC and PF/RF units.
- (h) Fox Company of the 2d Battalion, 7th Marines, was returned to the operational control of the 7th Marines.
- (5) October 5th through 6th saw the indoctrination training of thirty-one (31) Marines who came to the Bettalion from the 7th Marines.
- (6) A personal response class conducted by a term from III NAF and the lat herine Division 0-5 section taught a combined group of Batta-lien Officers and men at 0900H on 6 October 1970.
- (7) On 7, 8, and 9 October a 1st Engineer Battalian Mobile Contact Town talked to a total of 127 Marines and Many Corpsmen.
- (8) At 2400R on the 8th of October a cordon and search operation of the village of Lion Lac (1) was initiated. The capture of four (04) WCS and asserted exchange resulted from the operation.
- (9) CUPP 23 sprung a night ambush at 2130H on 8 October. The results were one VC KIA, one AK-47 captured, and six (06) detained found hiding in a house.
- (10) At 0300 on 10 October two Regional Perco Soldiers of the 111th RF Company were killed when B-40 reckets hit their bunker guarding Tu Cau Hamlet (B1048658).
- (11) The 1st Marine Division Malaria Contact Town gave instruction to 199 Marines and Havy Corpsmen throughout the Rattalian.
- (12) At 0055H a single lhorm rocket was fired from the Battalian Area Of Operations at (AT983664). This ended 113 days in the AD without an indirect fire attack.
- (13) Echo Company participated in a one day operation with the 59th Regional Force Battalion. The results were three (03) Viet Cong Suspects captured and one (01) cave discovered and destroyed.
- (14) The 2d plateon of Hotel came into the Battalian rear for a four (04) dy rehabilitation training period on the 12th of October.
 - (15) At 1800H on 12 October 1970 a high threat period commenced.
- (16) 1600F on 16 October marked the end of the high threat poriod.
- (17) In the vicinity of BTO21683 at 2130H on 16 October Fox 3/2 made contact that resulted in two Marino modovace, one of which died of wounds.


(18) Of let Marine Division Message 080925Z October 1970 made Fox Cumpur the Division reserve company.

- (19) At 1700H on 18 October 1970 the corden and search of Mui Kim Son (20072709) was completed. Two detriness were taken.
- (20) Notel 2/1, at grid BN073682, killed one Viet Cong and exptured by AK-1/1's, two pistols, and numerous documents on the 19th of October.
- (21) Golf's third Platoon came to the Battalian rear for a four (04) day rehabilitation training period on the 20th of October.
- (22) At 2000H on 21 October Operation Saturation communeed. The concept of this operation was to get the Victorianese military units but into the homlets and field on a continuous basis.
- (23) At 1930H on 22 October a clayarro mino was command detenated on a patrol from 2d plateon of Fox Company, killing one (01) Navy Corpsman and nounding two (02) Marines.
- (24) In response to Typhoen Kate, Storm condition II was set at 0800H on the 25th and changed to condition I at 1550H. The storm hit during the night and was downgraded to a trooteel storm by 0700H on the 25th of October. At 1500H on the 25th the all clear signal was given.
- (25) At 1200H on 27 October a cordon and search of Trung Lucze Hamlot (BT0h2722) was completed. 130 purple were servened and two N-26 grounds were found.
- (26) On the 27th the first plateen of Fox Ompany case to the Battalian rear for a four (0h) day rehabilitation training period.
- (27) At 2310H on the 28th of October a Marine lest his facting while crossing a swellon stream (AT971661) and was swept away by the current. His bedy was later found and identified
- (23) On the night of the 29th and the early morning of the 30th of October a flash flood engulfed the Battalian Area of Operations. Most of the units in the field had to be extracted to Hill 55 (AT967618) or Camp Lauer (BTO84704) by air.

2. Air Support.

a. The Bittalian's air support for the month of October was hampered by inclement weather and a restriction on fire support which includes Gless Air Support (ChS). Also, the to inclement weather, liminous runs normally facilitated by the visual recommandance (VR) were either rescheduled or conducted by vehicle. Helicopters were obtained from MAG-16 and OV-10, aerial observation aircraft, from MAG-11. Other fixed





wing support, such as flareships and Glose Air Support (CLS) missions, were flown the Air Force and Marine Corps pilots with direction furnished by Marine Aorial Observers.

- b. The Battalian had a total of fifty-wine (59) medevae missions in October, evacuating eighty-three (83) personnel. There were twenty-seven (27) U.S. emergency, twelve (12) U.S. priority, eleven (11) civilian energency, five (05) civilian priority, one (01) civilian routine, fourteen (14) ARVN emergency, seven (07) ARVN priority, one (01) ARVN routine and five (05) ARVN personent routine. The shortest delay for an emergency medevae was five minutes with the lengest being forty-four minutes. The average time for all emergency medevaes missions was sixteen minutes. This time was computed as the time elapsing from the moment when the medevae was called into the Battalian CCC until the casualty was airborne.
- c. There were 312 resupply services flown carrying 517,000 pounds of carry and 336 passengers.
- d. Eighteen (18) visual recommaissance (VR) missions were completed in the month of October. The VR was utilized to conduct limits now, administrative move of passengers and for visual recommaissance.
- o. Sixtoon (16) script observation (10) missions were flow, seven (07) of which were used to control close air support missions. The balance of the AD missions were utilized to because areas of suspected arms caches, possible recket launch sites and possible energy movement.
- f. Mission eighty (80) was divorted to conduct an emergency extraction. In extremely bad weather conditions 290 personnel were extracted from positions where the water ranged from f ur (04) to ten (10) foot deep as a result of a flash flood.
- g. Seven (07) close hir support missions were flown expending 11,500 pounds of ampalia, him,000 pounds of bombs and three (03) M-83 gum peds (20mm). The targets consisted of bunker complexes, suspected VC/NVA haven sites and heavily bomby trapped areas. Target destruction/coverage was good to excellent. On one occasion a flareship was utilized to provide illumination for an engaged unit.

3. Artillery and Fire Support

- a. Artillory fire support for 2d Battalien, let Marines was prorided by Battery "B", let Battalien, 11th Harines and three (03) tubes of Battery "W", let Battalien, 11th Marines. Reinforcing fires were provided by two (02) Milhal 155mm Hewitzers attached to Battery "B", let Battalien, 11th Marines and "B" Plateen, 2d Bight Inch Gws.
- b. let Battalien, 11th Merines remined in direct support of let Marines during October with Battery "B", 1st Battalien, 11th Marines and "B" Plateen, 3d Eight Inch Guns coblocated at Mill 55.



- c. Thirty-eight (38) observed missions were fired, nine (09) of which were einthet illumination fired in support of allied units inthe Battalien Tion. Harrassment and Interdiction fires totalled 119 targets. These targets were planned on suspected enemy assembly areas, known enemy bunker areas, and suspected enemy infiltration routes. The rounds expended during October were: sixty-four (6h) 105mm High Explosive, fourteen (1h) 105mm illuminating, two (02) 105mm White Phesporous, 108 4.2 inch High Explosive, thirty-three (33) 1.2 inch illuminating, and sixty-nine (69) 1.2 inch Thite Phesporous.
- d. The Elmm mertar plateen fired twenty-eight (28) observed missions, fourteen (14) of which were centact illumination missions fired in support of activities engaged with the enemy. The remaining missions were prepfires on two (02) targets in support of the Comp Lauer defenses. The Elmm mertar plateen expended 1,475 High Explosive, 1,158 illuminating, and 100 White Prosperous rounds during the month of October. One morter section was located in the Comp Lauer Combat Base (B1081703), one section at Sea Ancher (B1082698), one section at the Company G Combat Base (B1043687), one tube at the Company E Combat Patrel Base at Hill 55, and one tube at the 17th Amered Covelry Compound (A1990675).
- e. Due to artillary incide to involving injury of civilians, several measures were taken to prevent the recurrence of such incidents. These are:
- 1. No intells or pro-capts will be fired within 1,000 meters of an inhabited area.
- 2. The rules of engagement and normal clearance distances apply to units in contact or units unking a positive confirmed energy sighting (1.0. distinctive uniforms, weapons, etc.) within 1,000 meters of an inhabited area.






1. Training



- a. Training consists of indoctrination training for replacements, plateen rehabilitation training, formal schools and refresher training as required.
 - b. The replacement indectrination course is broken down as follows:
- (1) 5 day course. Conducted for replacement personnel initially and soming into the Republic of Viet Nam. During the month of October eight Marines corpleted the course. The subjects included: IIC and linster Spending, Pay and Illowances, Emergency Leave, Record of Emergency Data, Evac/Casualty procedures, CAI irogram, R&R, Perstal Regulations, Private Maryons, PX facilities, Request Mest, Respect for Religious Desod on Customs of Viet Name, Moral Guidance, Red Cross, S-2 Mission, VC/NV: Mission, ThOR/ worther, Enemy Forces, Enemy Tactics, Rowards From roms, Handling of 100's, Care of Mass, VC/NVA Infrastructure, Interpreters and Kit Carson Applement, Security Compromise, Mr Trophics, Secuting and Introlling, Basic Mar Reading and Aerial Thotos, Password and Countersian, Terrain Analysis and Navigation, Exployment of Snipers, Pottali n Mission, Supporting arms, Air Support, Rules of Engagement, Troop Conduct, MACV Rulus of Angolement, Vietnomase Armed Forcus, Spot Reports, Abushas and Counter Ambushes, Derelitions and Destruction of Beeby Trans, Beeby Trans, Do by Trap Land, Compass, Small Unit Toctics, Employment of Chamical Ligants, Motor Transport, Surplies, Discarded Equipment, Armory, En incors, Civil Affairs, Psychological Worfaro, Vistanteso Customs/ lorsonal Response, Chilu Hoi Troppos, Scouts, Pacification, Assisting Vistorusa Lacrie, Conduct/Attitude toward Vistoruse Nationals, Viotnamese Political Parties, Off Limit Areas, Prostitution, Narcotice, Mechel, Loyal Assistance, Accidental Discharges, Loss of Marons, Buddy will, Heat Casualties, Personal Hygiene, Preventative Medicine, Veneral Disass, Anti-Inlaria Mensures, Military Decorum, Local Rogulations, filitary Courts oy and Discipline, Warrens Safety, Char Mortar, Claymore Minus, Grenado Safety and M-2/ Praymontation Grenade, M-16 AL Rifle; Care and Cleaning, Pattalian Rande Regulations, Pull Firing, Zording Marchs, and Quick Fire/Quick Kill.
- (2) 3 day course. Conducted for replacement personnel joining the Dattelien from other "in country" commands. This training is designed to disseminate requirements and tactics relevant to the Battalion's TAOR Eighty-one (31) Marines attended this course during the month of October. The subjects included: Tactical Undate, Legal Considerations, Victorasse Relations, Religion and Personal Melfare, Duick Fire/Quick Kill, Military Downing and Londorship, Decby Tree Lane, Counternassures for Mines and Booby Trees, Night Fire "N", COC Brief, Communications Security, Personal Affairs and Legistics.





- c. On 6 October 1970 a six hour Personal Response class was presented by a combined Civil Affairs Instruction Team corresed of G-5 personnel from both III MAF and let Marine Division. Four (04) officers, five (05) Staff NCO's and sixteen (16) NCO's attended the class.
- d. On 7, 3, and 9 October the Mine/Borby Trop Mobile Contact Team from the 1st Engineer Battalian instructed 127 Marines and Sailars on counterceasures of mines and booby traps.
- s. On 10 October twenty (20) Marines graduated from the Hattalien's three-week Vietnamese Language School. The instructor of the class fermorly taught at the III MAF Vietnamese Language School. Eighty-four hours of instruction were given with the aim of teaching the students a 400-500 word vecabulary.
- f. On 12 and 13 October, the 1st Marine Division Malaria Contact Team presented instruction to 197 Marines and Sailors. The classes were oriented towards familiarization with Malaria and preventative measures that can be readily employed.
- g. On 20 October seventy-four (74) indigenuous personnel and three (03) of their U.S. Army Green Boret Advisors attended a landmine warfare training program given by this Battalien. Instruction included lecture, demonstration, and application. The application consisted of going through the Battalian's Booby Trap Lane.
- h. A total of forty-three (43) Marines from the Pattalien, attending three different five (05) day sessions, graduated from the Landmine Warfare Resident Course as presented by the 1st Engineer Bettalien.
- i. During October 172 Merines underwent Quick Fire/Quick Kill training. Fifty-two Merines completed familiarization firing which included field zeroing their weapons. All of this instruction, thirty-four (34) hours, was completed in the Exttalian 1,000 inch range.
- J. The 2d llatern of Hetal Company (28 man), the 3d llatern of Golf Company (35 man), and the 1st Platern of Fox Company (41 man) all completed the four day platern rehabilitation training progress. The intensive and corefully planned progress were highlighted by a fattalian Commenders inspection, presentations by the Division Drug abuse Team and the G-5 personal response locturer, and immediate action and patrolling instruction by U.S. Army Green Beret personnel. Other subjects of instruction included Kep Reading, Booby Tray Scuntermeasures, Career Planning, CIT, Communications Security, Air Support, Hygiene and First Aid, Londorship, Ambush Tips, Chaplain's talk, S-2 and S-3 briefs, Quick Fire/Quick Kill techniques, Night Firing, a COC brief, the M-16 Rifle and Physical Fitness.

k. In the latter part of October the plans for a new school were finalized. The mattalian lattel Leaders School will begin its first class in sarly Nevember. The school was created to teach advanced patrol leading techniques to squad leaders and potential squad leaders. The school includes instruction in Map Reading, Terrain Approximation, Warning Orders, Patrol Orders, Reporting Procedures, Combat Intelligence, the PTC-25 Radio, First Aid, latted Tips, Republing, Rubber Feat Maintenance and Handling, Demolition Ambushes, and Immediate Action Drills. The first four days of the school will be spent at 1st Recon Battalian and the last day with U.S. Army Special Forces instructors.



PART II SECTION E LOGISTICS

1. Logistics

- a. During the month of October, resupply of Comp Lauor was accomplished by truck. Organic and attached units wore resupplied by helicopter, truck, and lauskie. There were 330 helicopter lifts with a combined weight of approximately 517,500 pounds. A equachment of 2½ ten trucks from First Meter Transport Battalion traveled 9,600 read miles and transported approximately 578,400 pounds of supplies in support of the Battalion. Six huskies from 11th Meter Transport Battalion provided support from 1-14 October. During this period they transported approximately 78,000 pounds of supplies.
- b. There were five werk orders completed in October. The perimeter berm surrounding Camp Lauer was reconstructed. Two SEA huts were constructed on top of OP Growsnest to replace the huts previously destroyed by high winds. Contemment reads were covered with laterite, graded, and covered with oil. A SEA hut was constructed at the main gate to Camp Lauer for the use of the S-5 in processing Vietnamese laborers. Culverts were installed to improve drainage in the vicinity of Special Services during the measure season.
- c. Vork was begun but not completed on several other work orders during October. It was determined that further work was necessary to clear fields of fire around the Comp Lauer perimeter. Heavy equipment was brought in and work had progressed considerably by the end of the month. During September a request was submitted to fill the hole around the Battalian landing zone and the area immediately surrounding it with laterite and oil. The work was approximately 75% completed by the end of October. Action was initiated on a work order to believe the electrical system at Comp Lauer. Electricians from First Regimeer Battalieb made their initial survey, and actual work is scheduled to begin shortly.

An engineer assistance request was submitted for equipment to fill in the lor area adjacent to 600 to eliminate pooling of water. This area is becoming a mosquite hizard. Another request was submitted for assistance in constructing new gates for Comp Lauer's front and rear entrances. The present gates are not considered tactically sound. Additionally, a work request was re-submitted for repair of the existing reafs covering the Officer's Club, Staff MCO Club and the Enlisted Club at Comp Lauer. No action has been taken as of yet on these requests.

d. During October, grout emphasis was placed on removation of the Comp Louer perimeter. In addition to the clearing of fields of fire and the planned installation of new gates, a limited rewiring of the of the perimeter was become. All burkers were renovated, strengthened, and rain proof covers installed. Colverts were constructed at each position to ensure that personnel have a dry place to sleep.

e. During the month of October, the Battalian Laundry Unit washed and dried approximately 28,760 pounds of clothing. The unit is still operating ineffectively because of the Coup's electrical power shortage. Steps have been taken to provide a generator to effectively operate the laundry unit.

2. Motor Transport

- a. The Battelian Noter Transport Section operates and is organized in accordance with the prescribed T/O of an Infantry Battalian. The various facets of Noter Transport include a dispatch window, records clerk, vehicle parking, unintenance, wash point, lubrication rack, tire repair shop, battary shop and living quarters for Noter Transport personnel.
- b. The vehicles argenic to the Battalian Motor Transport Section are twenty-two M151A1, four M37B1 personnel carriers, eighteen Malé trailers, four M01 trailers and six M149 water trailers. The communication vehicles include two MRC 123, tax MRC 109 and the MRC 12h.
- c. There are four key personnel who retain their vehicles twenty—four hours a day. These are the Battalien Camander, the Battalian Executive Officer, the Operations Officer and the H&S Campany Comander. In addition, one personnel carrier and a jeep and trailer have been permanently assigned to Company E on Hill 55 in support of the Company's CUPP units. All other vehicles are dispatched and twelve hour a day basis. Emphasis is placed an providing the Companies with all the Mater Transport necessary to support their operations in the field. The remainder of the vehicles are handled by task crientated vehicle request forms. These forms are submitted sixteen hours prior to the section or individual needing the vehicle. Upon receiving these requests a decision is made as to the tactical necessity and importance of the mission and the vehicles are dispatched accordingly.
- d. Battelian Motor Transport's proscribed achelous of maintenance include first and second. Driver's maintenance is perfermed drily by the driver of the vehicle. Once a work or main required, the driver perferms proventative maintenance on his vehicle. This includes a therough lubrication and check of vital areas of the vehicle, such as battery, gauges and air cleaner.
- e. Quarterly's and annuals are performed by trained Motor Transport personnel. Such maintenance includes an extensive check of the vehicle's encompassing spark plugs, whose bearings, points, carbureter and numerous other items that are out of the realm of first echelon driver maintenance.
- f. Soot checks are performed to insure that the drivers are performing their required echelon of maintenance. All weekly PM's are inspected and the PM sheet is signed by a qualified mechanic.
- g. Supplies are requisitioned by a Motor Transport Supply men. He retains daily drap shoots as well as a requisitioning file. Those files

are reconciled on a weekly basis. A daily check is made of the Motor Transport issue point at Battalian Supply for incoming parts.

h. Current Status/Forecast

- (1) As of 30 October 1970 two mules are on deadline for second scholen MORS. One M-37 personnel carrier is deadlined on third scholen MORS at FLC. Three M-151 jcops are deadlined. One jeep is deadlined for second scholen MORS musiting an exhaust system, one jeep is deadlined for third scholen MORS at FLC, and the other is being propared to be given code H status.
- (2) Recently the Motor Transport Section had two MISI's given a status of Code H. A M-37 personnel carrier was picked up by us and one was invoiced ever to Headquarters Battalian. This puts us up to T/E level with four M-37's operational.

3. Supply

- a. Throo (03) Marines with the MOS 3014 and throo (03) Marines with the HOS 3051 articled during October. He additional supply MOS personnel were joined by the section.
- b. Storteges are apparent for 9R tropical combat boots, rifle cleaning rads, bore brushes for N-16 and N-79. M-60 machine gun cleaning patches are still in short supply. BL-1386 battories are difficult to obtain when the normal supply channels are followed. This problem necessitates an unusually large number of walk-thru requisitions to be submitted. Difficulties continue to be apparent for procurement of Trinxane (heat).
- c. The varchouse and office section are presently engaged in efforts to rectify errors found by the FS.O Inspection Team and are in the process of carrying out the recommendations that were presented by the FS.O Inspection Team.







SECTION F CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

- a. Public Works. The month of October was a fairly active one in the area of public works. Twonty-four (24) sulverts were delivered to then Tra for their drainage project. Eight (06) dumptruck loads of sand and fifty (50) engineer stakes were delivered to Moa Long Village for their new market place. Also one (OI) trailerload of tools, left behind by amtracks, were distributed to Xian Tra (FLH). Five truckloads of lumber were delivered to Ten Lun for the new school which is under construction there.
- b. Wolfare. Driving October, a total of 40,250 NW was paid for local hire and the Alk (Assistance In Kind) employment fund. This program accomplishes two basic things; first, it enables needy Viotnewase to carn money on a daily basis for their food, etc., secondly, it provides a temporary work force that can perform many of the mental tasks throughout the cantonwort i. e., police, burning foces, etc., which frees that many more Marinos for other uses. At present trore are twelve (12) Victnamese worlding for the Battalion under the AIK (Assistance In Kind) program. They work and are paid on a daily basis, and receive a maximum of 150\$W per da.
- c. Education. This month Tan Luu fishing Hamlet bogan actual construction on their new school. Building meterials came from three (03) towors at Sea Ancier. Ton to fifteen people plus the R.D. from Tan Luu supplied the force necessary to gather the wood. Five trucklends of lumber were finally obtained to be utilized for the new school.
- d. Socurity. One (01) case of hand illumination canisters was delivered to the PSDF (Peoples Self Defense Force) of Mian Tra (HLH) to mid them in spotting the enemy during periods of poor illumin tion.
- e. Solatium. A otal of 17 access Solatium. A total of 17,000\$WN was paid out in solatiums this past month for three (03) incide to reculting in three (03) injuries and three (D3) deaths to Victnemese in the area. One death occurred in a traffic accident. In this case the victim auddonly steeped into the path of an encoming Marine personnel carrier. In another case the victim was injured by a Fox Company, 2/7 Marino. In the last incident two injuries and two duaths were sustained by Viotnamese civilians when a Brave Pattery, likh Murinos, fire mission lamied near their home. In reference to the traffic accident, driver safety classes were held which explasized the problem encountered in traffic with Victorias and has to possibly provent similar incidents in the future.
- f. Person 1 Response. A tot 1 of 126 onlisted men and mine (09) officers joined the Battalion during the month of October and were given an indoctrination briof covering the many facets of Civil Affairs and stressing parson I response. The Personal Response Control Town from G-5








PART II SECTION O COMMUNICATIONS

1. Communications

- a. Normal Britislian communications were provided by the Communications Platon during the worth of October. A critical shortage of batteries, Ba-1366, required limited operations for a four day period in mid-month, and a typhoon and monsoons hampered operations throughout October.
- b. Radio Rolly Section. This section continued to provide radio relay channels from the Battalian to 1st Marines. Weather and equipment malfunction, compounded by a damaged field wire cable, resulted in a 12% form time for the month. Courier runs supplemented operations chaing those periods.
- c. Radia Section. Tactical, administrative and logistical communications support was provided by this section. In addition to those daily requirements, special purpose nots were manned during the tac typhorus which plaqued the area. A one dry CPX was conducted, with the basic communications necessary to support the Battalian being located and operated from Golf Campany Patrol Base. The one persistent problem during this time period was the shortage of batteries BA-4386 and BA-30, a condition which is slowly being rectified with the entry of additional batteries into the surply system. Section personnal participated in an ensite inventory and materpredding of Rifle Company communications equipment, and at the same time provided aperator instruction in care and operation of the radios.
- d. Niro Section. Battalion and quard requirements were met on a 21, hour basis by the section. New lines were everheaded to the positions of the perimeter defense network, and a section of twenty-five pair cable was harded from the switchboard to the main frome in the vicinity of the Combat Operation Conter. Hermal system maintenance, to include replacement of terminal TM-184 with terminal box TM-125 was conducted.
- e. Meserge Center Section. Meserge traffic for the section for the month of October was 51 outgoing and 815 including meserges. This total was processed with a down time of 78 hours which relates to an efficiency factor of approximately 90%. The processionant contributor to this total time was the non-availability of the lat Marines radio relay system.
- f. Electronics Maintenance Section. Normal repair and second echolon operations during the month were supplemented by field visits to two rifle companies and subsequent maintenance/repair of their equipment. The section received Code "H" letters on three Telephones, TA-1, and one Switchboard. (SB-22, six Radio Sets. and RW-841 are on backgrear.





g. Ground Power Section. Ground power generation equipment located in the Stack Arms area was added to the section's cognizance during the month. Rewiring of many old and poorly wired installations, and repair of storm damaged lines accounted for the bulk of the section's operations. One project, rowork of the borm lights, was an an-going operation which resulted in a considerably improved night lighting system for Camp Lawer's perimeter defense.


1. Medical and Dental

- a. The Battalion Suegeons are Lt R. D. COX, MC, USNR and Lt R. L. FROEB, MC, USNR. The Battalion Chief is HNC G. L. ADAMS, USN. During this reporting period, the Battalion had three officers (2 Medical Corps and 1 Chaplain Corps) and fifty enlisted in the field and in garrison.
- b. The Battalien Aid Station treated nine hundred fifty patients during the month. The Division Preventative Medicine Units Monthly Sanitation Inspection Report was submitted and the discrepancies were noted and corrected.
- c. Analysis of mortality figures revelas that there were two USAC KIA, zero USAC DON. Hifteen USAC WIA, forty-one USAC NBC, zero USAC DIA, zero USAC WAINE, and zero MIA. There was one USA KIA, one USA WIA, and three USA NBC.
- d, Analysis of routine treatment revealed twenty-one cases of Ciarrhea, twenty-two cases of upper respiratory infection, eighteen cases of foot disorders, twenty cases of skin disorders, elevan cases of generating, eight cases of fover of undetermined origin, two cases of immersion foot, one new case of malaria and no hepatitis. There were two hundred eighty-thread Dontal Patients so as.
- e. The civilian medical program was active. There were seven hundred and thirty-seven Vietnamese civilians treated for medical reasons, none of which were the to combat related injuries. Four Vietnamese civilians were treated for dant 1 reasons.
- f. There were three USMC, nine Victormese civilians, and zero wounded Viet Cong evacuated.
- g. There was a total of one hundred and thirty patients sent on consultation to let Medical Batt dien or 95th Evacuation Respital.
- h. There were five contal patients sent to let Medical Battalien on consultation.



PART II SECTION I CHAILAIN

1. Cheplain

- a. On 7 October 1970 Lt. Julian GNILL, CHC, USNR, retated. Rev. Gnall had served the 2d Battalien since 15 October 1969. His unstinting loyalty and Christian dedication to this Battalien gave spiritual and a personal assistance to an untold number of men in this unit. The Battalian's gratitude was expressed to Father Gnall at a Special "Mass Night" on 3 October in his hence.
- b. During the month of October, Chaplain Frank D. MINTJ'L, Lt., USNE, who arrived in Camp Lauer 30 September 1970, offered a total of twenty-five Catholic services with four hundred and twenty in attendance. Ten Protestant services were conducted for two hundred and fifty-eight Batt-lich personnel by Cdr. E. ANDRESS, USN, the Regimental Chaplain.
- c. During October forty-three Marines were commselled, six.hespital visits were made and two brig visits were conducted by the Battelian Chaplain. In addition two Marines were assisted in obtaining Welfare reports via Red Cross, and five Marines were aided in attempts to place MARS calls.
- c. Four Moral guidance lectures were given to a total of 127 librines in the Battalion.
- e. Two good-will visits were made to Sacred Heart Orphanage. On each occasion the Marines accompanied the Chaplain, and they distributed ten crates of surplus vegetables and fruit, five boxes of children's clathing, and sweet-tooth items denoted by the 'El' Platein.
- f. The Chaplain attended three lecture/sominar's this menth, one spensored by the Chaplain's Section of XXIV Corps and two by the Chaplain's Section of 1st Marine Division. Those half-day sessions are a continuing attempt to obtain the spiritual and practical betterment of the Chaplains of Military Region I.

Subsequent to Echo 3 terminating it's activity, elements of 592d RF Company moved into area and killed one (01) VC at grid AT970653 and captured one (01) AK-47 rifle and numerous documents. RF's also found two (02) caves which they destroyed. Documents captured by Echo 3 have been examined by CIT and will be turned over to S-2 along with material captured on 22 October 1970.
