2. ENEMY, WEATHER AND TERRAIN

UNCLASSIFIED

a. General. During the month of August the enemy activity was relatively light. Significant events of the month were the firing of rockets on Da Nang, NSL and the Marble Mountain Air Facility from within this TAO. Numerous intelligence reports were received for dates of the rocket attacks and an aggressive H&I program was instituted on suspected rocket sites. It is believed that the harassment fire on these suspected rocket sites kept the rocket activity to a minimum.

On 11 August 1969, Company E was probed by what was believed to be elements of the R20 Battalion. PW reports indicate it was the 1st Company of the R20 Battalion with a strength of about 36 men. Approximately 18 of them took part in the actual attacks. They suffered (9) KIA's by body count and (1) POW. The weapons used included: RPG's, AK-47's and other small arms. There were also many satchel charges and grenades utilized.

The size of the unit and the lack of covering fire prior to and during the attack is an indication of the strength and condition of the enemy units operating in this area. There are reports of discontent, lack of supplies and low morale within the units due in part to the domineering attitude of the North Vietnamese towards their South Vietnamese counterparts.

d. Weather and Terrain

(1) Weather. The weather for the month was hot and extremely dry with no rain for the entire month. The wind direction remained variable with a velocity of 5 to 10 knots per hour.

(2) Terrain. The terrain is flat and sandy, with rice paddies and broken trochines. Cover and concealment are fair and observation is very good.



### 3. ORGANIZATION AND OPERATIONS

a. During the period 1-4 August 1969 the Battalion continued to participate in Operation Durham Peak. The primary mission of the 2d Battalion was to conduct a deliberate, detailed search to find, fix, capture, and/or destroy enemy forces (NVA, VC, VCI), harbor sites, supplies, and fortifications in the area of Phu Loc Valley.

b. During the period 5-7 August 1969 the Battalion conducted offensive operations from the Phong Luc Combat Base consisting of day and night small unit combat patrols and night ambush patrols.

c. On 8 August 1969 the Battalion was relieved of the responsibility of the Phong Luc Combat Base and assumed command of the Cau Ha Combat Base. Offensive operations from 8-31 August in the Battalion TAOR consisted largely of day and night small unit combat patrols and night ambush patrols. During the reporting period a company size cordon and search was conducted in the Tan Lau village complex. A unit of National Police Field Forces and a platoon of Marines conducted a detailed search utilizing two Kit Carson Scouts for interrogation of detainees. Road security was maintained by the use of engineer sweep teams, observation towers and night road patrols consisting of motor vehicle patrols.

### 4. AIR SUPPORT

a. 2d Battalion, 1st Marines had 38 medevac missions of which there were 75 evacuations. Marine battle casualties were broken down into 23 emergency, seven priority, and six routine, one of which was a KIA. Marine non-battle casualties were five emergency and seven priority. In addition, we called in medevacs for civilians and ARVN's of which there were 12 emergency, nine priority and six routine. The time span required for a medevac ranged from 15 minutes to one hour and 55 minutes for an average delay of 33 minutes.

b. Four visual reconnaissance flights were made during the month, carrying unit commanders and staff personnel. A total of 16 passengers were carried on these flights.

c. OV-10's flew two sorties for the 2d Battalion providing visual reconnaissance in our area. There were no fix wing missions flown in support of the 2d Battalion during this period.

d. There were six sorties of resupply with 8,340 pounds of supply. Administrative aircraft flew 12 sorties carrying 41 passengers and 2000 pounds of supply.

e. A gunship supported this unit one night for 4½ hours expending 42,000 rounds of 7.62mm and 37 flares. An Army Ch-54 helicopter moved a radio relay tower into the combat base.

f. There were two troop lift missions which carried a total of 774 passengers and 4100 pounds of equipment in 69 sorties.

5. ARTILLERY FIRE SUPPORT UNCLASSIFIED

a. From 1 to 31 August 1969 fire support was provided by Battery "B", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines.

b. No new officers reported to the Battery during the month of August. One enlisted Marine from FSCC rotated to CONUS. Two enlisted personnel from Company "F's" FO Team were replaced by two personnel from Battery "B". One was placed in FSCC and the other remained in Battery "B" motor transport. Present strength in the field is four officers and 12 enlisted. FSCC strength remains at one officer and six enlisted.

c. The 1st Battalion, 11th Marines remained in direct support of the 1st Marines during the month. During this time, approximately 8000 artillery rounds were fired in support of this Battalion. Artillery support was supplemented by 1832 HE, 72 WP, and 1307 illumination rounds fired by organic 81mm mortars.

6. TRAINING

a. During August, due to operational commitments, training was limited to orientation training for replacement personnel and attendance at Division and FMFPAC formal schools.

b. Orientation training for new personnel consisted of five days of instruction covering the following subjects; Vietnamese Customs, Surprise Firing Devices, Booby Trap Lane, Enemy Tactics, Handling of POW's, Scouting and Patrolling, Map Reading, Compass, Ambushes and Counter Ambushes, Rules of Engagement, Supporting Arms, Air Support, Weapons and Grenade Safety, Civil Affairs, Civic Action/Psychwar, Narcotics, Prostitution, First Aid, Apathy Toward Criminal Violence, Request Mast, and Communication with members of Congress. All replacement personnel underwent Quick Fire/Quick Kill indoctrination and fired individual weapons for zeroing at the 1000 inch range.

7. LOGISTICS AND SUPPLY

a. Logistics

(1) During the month of August the Battalion moved from Phong Tho Combat Base to Cam Ha Combat Base. On 15 August the Battalion assumed responsibility for a larger TAOR, greatly increasing the Battalion's operational commitments. This increase in commitments put a strain on the Battalion's material and transportation requirements, but through effective utilization of materials and equipment, major problems were alleviated. Trucks and LVT's were used to resupply units operating throughout the TAOR.

(2) The Battalion's requirements for third echelon maintenance continued over the last month. The breakdown on Tactical Equipment Repair Orders is as follows:

b. Motor Transport

(1) The overall deadline rate for the Motor Transport Section dropped to 40%, a decrease of 8% over last month. This high deadline rate is directly attributed to a lack of spare parts

(2) Two M151A1 vehicles were Code H during the month. Five new vehicles were received. Presently there are two vehicles deadlined for second echelon NORS.

(3) Twelve M274A2 vehicles are currently deadlined. Seven are deadlined for second echelon NORS, and five are deadlined for third echelon NORS.

(4) T/E deficiencies are as follows,

- a. Three M151A1 jeeps
- b. Five M-149 water trailers
- c. Three M16B1 trailers
- d. One M170 ambulance
- e. Four M274A2 mechanical mules

c. Roads

(1) Roads within the Combat Base were not oiled during the month due to the fact that oil was not available.

(2) Crushed stone has been ordered to build up the roads within the Combat Base, but as of yet, it has not been delivered.

d. Land Clearing

(1) On 20 August 1969 five bulldozers from 1st Engineer Battalion began land clearing operations at the Cau Ha Combat Base. In five days they partially cleared a thousand meter radius around the combat base. Two bulldozers are presently being used to build up the berm.

e. Supply

(1) A new Supply Officer reported aboard on 15 August 1969. The Supply Chief left on 17 August. Major discrepancies in the informal and formal accounts have been noted. These discrepancies are to be reconciled in the current physical inventory now underway.

f. Fiscal Obligations

(1) Obligations during the month of August for SFA items were \$ 89,901.25 Funds for ASA items were \$ 83,163.86.

8. COMMUNICATIONS

a. During the month of August 1969, the Communication Platoon provided and maintained all normal communications facilities for 2d Battalion, 1st Marines. The battalion moved from Phong Luc to Cau Ha Combat Base. Since arriving in the Cau Ha area primary emphasis was placed on repairing and installing new communication facilities. In addition, a radio relay tower was hoisted to the Cau Ha Combat Base and will be in operation within a short period of time.

b. Radio Section: A high of eleven deadlined AN/PRC-25's in for DX was attained at the end of the month. Communication Security Classes were held for communication personnel. Emphasis was directed at improving radio operating procedures within the Battalion.

c. Wiro Section: Preparations are in progress for rewiring the defensive perimeter of the Cau Ha Combat Base. The switchboard bunker was rewired and wire lines were policed throughout the new CP area.

d. Message Center Section: The message traffic for the month of August consisted of 24 outgoing and 965 incoming messages. The total recorded down time for the month of August between Regiment and 2/1 was 21 hours and 8 minutes. The Message Center received one KBY-6 from repair.

e. Engineer Equipment: Two men attended Generator School at NSA during the month of August. Both base power generators were replaced by NSA.

f. Electronic Maintenance Section: During the month of August this section repaired the following:

Two men from the Electronic Maintenance Section attended a one day supply records school at Division.

#### 9. MEDICAL & DENTAL

a. Battalion Surgeon is Lt. N. L. Smith, MC, USNR. Battalion Chief is HMC R. A. Eiser, USN. During this period, the Battalion Aid Station had an approximate strength of two (2) officers (1 Medical Corps and 1 Chaplain Corps) and fifty-three hospital corpsmen in the field and in garrison. On 25 August 1969, Lt. R. D. Cox III, MC, USNR, was transferred to 1st Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division, for duty.

b. The Battalion Aid Station treated 822 patients during the month of August. There were no acute or unusual medical problems of epidemic scale during this period. There are no major sanitation problems at this time.

c. Analysis of routine medical treatments revealed 15 cases of upper respiratory infection, 42 cases of diarrhea, 69 cases of foot disorders, 73 cases of dermatology problems and 12 cases of malaria. There were 594 patients treated for miscellaneous problems at routine sick call. There were 360 dental patients.

d. Analysis of mortality figures reveal one USMC KIA and one USMC DOW as a result of hostile action. There were 32 USMC WIA's. There were six USMC NBC's and one USN NBC.

e. The immunization program was adequate, 1400 immunizations were given to members of this Battalion.

f. There was an active civilian medical program. 1473 Vietnamese civilians were treated. 21 Vietnamese civilian dental patients were treated.

g. There were 54 USMC, and 14 Vietnamese civilians evacuated for medical reasons.

10. CHAPLAIN

a. During August the Battalion Chaplain, Lt. Irvin H. Thompson, conducted 11 Protestant Divine services. Lt. J. J. Conway of 3d LVT Battalion conducted seven Catholic Divine services. One Lay Led Protestant service was conducted and the Regimental Chaplain, Cdr. William Fuller, conducted one Protestant Divine Service.

b. The Battalion Chaplain made 14 visits to the hospitals, assisted with six American Red Cross Cases, and counseled 13 men. Four indoctrination lectures were given to the incoming personnel.

c. On 7 August the Battalion had a Memorial Service for the men who were killed during the month of July. This service was attended by the Commanding Generals of the 1st Marine Division and III MAF and the Commandant of the Marine Corps, General Leonard F. Chapman, Jr.

SEQUENTIAL LISTINGS OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 1 Aug 69 - 1130 Company G found one 75mm recoilless rifle, bipods, sight, cleaning kit, and spare parts in a canvas bag, and two NVA packs with clothes and a clothes line in a cave, dimensions 12 feet high, 20 feet wide, at AT985425.
- 1945 Company G unit spotted VC/NVA movement at AT989437 and fired M-60, called in 81mm fire mission and adjusted an artillery mission. The movement ceased.
- 2030 Company F unit while in ambush site at BT005431 received one incoming enemy grenade from the rear.
- 2200 Company F unit observed enemy crawling on hill to rear at BT001878. Utilized one claymore and one M-26, received two enemy grenades. No friendly casualties were inflicted.
- 2 Aug 69 - 0800 Company F at BT000543 had unit check out area where Company F units had encountered enemy and found one grenade that had apparently fallen from an enemy cartridge belt. No other visible results were evident.
- 0850 Company F at AT987426. While returning to IP spotted five VC/NVA leaving a bunker complex. Unit initiated a hasty ambush and killed two NVA/VC and captured one AK-47.
- 1115 Company H, 2d Bn, 5th Marines at BT020473. Unit spotted five to seven NVA/VC in mixed civilian and green clothing. They were carrying packs but no weapons, and were moving southwest across paddies. Helo unit moved to block and intercept. Captured one NVA, others fled northwest using stream beds and tree lines for cover.
- 1200 Company H at AT963453. While on patrol unit found one pair of VC/NVA trousers and one USMC map.
- 1530 S-1 vehicle, while on run to Regiment, took one sniper round at village 1 1/2 miles this side of Regiment. One individual was hit in chin with flying glass.
- 1825 Company G at AT964434. Unit while moving downhill spotted two NVA/VC. Called in artillery and 81mm fire mission. Results were two VC/NVA KIA.
- 2100 Company F at BT005431 detected movement around defensive position and responded by throwing hand illumination followed by a M-26 grenade. Heard and observed enemy moving away as though wounded. Dispatched unit and while searching area received one enemy grenade, resulting in one USMC WIA. Unit withdrew to defensive position and covered enemy area with heavy saturation of 60mm mortars.

3 Aug 69 - 0730 2d Bn, 1st Marines CP. Company H and Company G began hoilift back to the Battalion area.

0950 Company G at AT972432 while moving to objective Alpha 2 made contact with estimated three to six VC/NVA. Returned fire with small arms and called in artillery mission resulting in two probable VC/NVA KIA. Commenced sweep of the area.

1230 Helilift to battalion area completed.

4 Aug 69 - 0730 Company H and Company G began hoilift back to battalion.

1030 2d Bn, 1st Marines completed helilift back to battalion.

5 Aug 69 - 2200 2d Bn, 1st Marines at 2/1 contonment received two rounds believed to be 105mm rounds. One round detonated in Company F's living area causing four minor USMC casualties. One dud 105mm round was found on the landing zone with fuse missing. Investigation Team is being called in for crater analysis.

2345 Company G unit; at BT001611, spotted movement from tree line 50 meters away. Fired two claymores, throw four M-26's and used small arms resulting in one NVA/VC KIA and blood trails going southeast. 81mm mortars fired illumination and HE ahead of unit as the unit swept area following the blood trails. Unit lost blood trails approximately 150 meters from point of initial contact and then moved 100 meters east to new ambush sight and continued its activity.

6 Aug 69 - 0100 Company G unit completed final sweep of the area. Sweeping unit lost blood trails 150 meters from point of initial contact. Unit moved in ambush sight 100 meters to the east to continue its activity.

1100 Queen from the Regimental FSCC conducted a crater analysis of the craters from the previous night's incoming rounds. It was determined by him that the rounds were 105mm lob bombs.

7 Aug 69 - 0930 Company E unit at AT981682 found a tunnel four feet high, three feet wide, and 15 feet long. Also found were three RPG rounds without boosters, one US canteen with cover and cup, three M-16 magazines with 18 rounds in each, one NVA belt and two books with NVA writing inside. Ordnance and documents brought in and tunnel blown with C-4.

2200 Company H unit at AT991635 found one spider hole dimensions three feet by three feet by 25 feet. Searched area and blow spider hole with M-26 grenade.

- 2225 Company E unit at BT011697 while moving to ambush site received one incoming M-26 grenade. Returned fire with 20 rounds M-16 ammunition and swept through area. No further contact made on enemy sited.
- 8 Aug 69 - 0800 2d Bn, 1st Marines commenced move from Phong Luc Combat Base to Cau Ha Combat Base.
- 1200 2d Bn, 1st Marines assumed command of Cau Ha Combat Base. Completion of movement of troops and equipment was made on 9 August.
- 11 Aug 69 - 1435 Company E unit at BT097659 found one 60mm SFD with pressure type firing device.
- 1800 Company F at BT033648 paid 400 piasters for one butterfly bomb turned in by Vietnamese.
- 1900 Company F at BT033649 paid 1000 piasters to Vietnamese for one dud 105mm round.
- 2030 Company G unit at BT069668 while on patrol detonated a 60mm round set as an SFD. It was believed to be command detonated, resulting in four USMC WIAE.
- 2055 Company G unit at BT061649 while on patrol spotted five VC/NVA 300 meters away. Called in 81mm fire mission on movement and then swept the area finding no trace of the enemy.
- 12 Aug 69 - 0130 Company E at BT098665 received 20 to 30 incoming grenades and three to four B40 rockets resulting in four USMC WIAE and one USMC KIA. Returned fire with small arms, 81mm mortars, artillery, and gunships resulting in nine enemy KIA's and one enemy POW/WIA. 2035 Roving Patrols 1 and 2 at BT068680 received fire from approximately one squad size ambush on east side of HSR, 200 meters south of Tower #2. Returned fire with M-26's, M-60, and M-76. No casualties were taken as a result of the enemy activity.
