2. ENEMY, WEATHER AND TERRAIN

a. General. During the month of September enemy activity was moderate. High points of the month were the finding of 38 Russian 122mm rockets and the relocation of Vietnamese Civilians from the Cam Sa and Vien Dong areas to the New Life Hamlets. Numerous intelligence reports were received concerning dates of rocket attacks and possible enemy locations. It is believed that constant aggressive patrolling, short duration company size operations, and effective H&I fire kept rocket activity to a minimum, in addition to keeping VC/NVA units from organizing for any period of time within this TAOR.

The month of September was also highlighted by three incidents of terrorist activity preceding the September 28th elections. From intelligence reports and POW reports, the VC/NVA intend to increase their terrorist activity towards the New Life Hamlets and any FWF Pacification efforts.

Principal enemy units operating within this TAOR have been the R-20 Battalion, the Q-82nd Local Force Battalion, elements of the Q-92 Battalion and local village guerrillas. The weapons they have used included: RPG's, AK-47's and other small arms, grenades, 50 caliber and 30 caliber machineguns and mortars. There are several reports of discontent, lack of supplies and low morale within these units.

d. Weather and Terrain

(1) Weather. The weather for the month was hot with approximately 14 inches of rain. The wind direction remained variable with a velocity of 5 to 10 knots per hour.

(2) Terrain. The terrain is flat and sandy, with rice paddies and broken treelines. Cover and concealment are fair and observation is very good.

3. ORGANIZATION AND OPERATIONS

a. During the period 1-30 September 1969 this Battalion conducted offensive operations from the Cau Ha Combat Base. These operations consisted largely of day and night small unit combat patrols, and night ambush patrols.

b. During this reporting period three Battalion size cordon and search operations were conducted. On 1 September 1969 a Battalion size cordon and search was conducted within the Viem Dong Village complex with the mission of conducting a detailed search for tunnels, bunkers, enemy ammunition and food caches. The detailed search accounted for six bunkers and two tunnels destroyed and the capture of four 122mm rockets along with intelligence information.

c. On 12 September 1969, this Battalion conducted a joint operation with the 181st RF Company in the vicinity of the Tu Cau and Ngan Trung Village complexes. This Battalion (-) in cooperation and coordination with the 52d and 57th RD Platoons established blocking positions while the 181st RF Company swept the area and displaced all civilians to the New Tu Cau Resettlement Hamlet. Approximately 1500 personnel were moved to the Resettlement Hamlet.

d. On 20 September 1969, a combined patrol of a unit from Company E and 3rd ITT, with the use of ordnance detectors, discovered a total of 28 122mm rockets and 1940 AK-47 rounds. The unit was dispatched on information provided by a Vietnamese Chieu Hoi female. This informer had been apprehended during one of the previous operations.

e. On 26 September 1969 this Battalion conducted another joint cordon and search operation with the 181st RF Company in the vicinity of the Viem Dong Village. 2d Bn 1st Marines provided blocking forces while 181st RF Company and 2d Bn 1st Marines Liaison Team swept the Viem Dong area. The mission was to relocate the civilians in the cordon area to the Tu Cau Resettlement Hamlet. Approximately 350 Vietnamese civilians were resettled. 3d ITT screened civilians and detained eight VC suspects. In addition, 21 houses, 13 bunkers, and two tunnels were destroyed by the 181st RF Company.

f. Road security during this reporting period was maintained by day and night motor vehicle patrols.

4. AIR SUPPORT

a. 2d Battalion, 1st Marines had 30 medevac missions in which there were 84 evacuations. Marine casualties were broken down into 23 emergency, nine priority and one routine which was a KIA. Of these Marine casualties

five were non-battle casualties which required emergency evacuation. This organization called two medevac missions for the ARVN's; two emergency, one priority and one routine. Also called were eight medevac missions involving civilians. There were 47 civilian evacuations of which 23 were emergency, 19 priority and five routine. The average delay for emergency medevacs was 26 minutes. The shortest delay for an emergency medevac was 13 minutes, while the longest delay was 70 minutes.

b. OV-10's flew seven sorties for this Battalion, providing aerial visual reconnaissance.

c. Flare ships flew two missions, dropping 75 flares.

d. A total of seven visual reconnaissance missions were flown with 30 personnel utilizing the VR's.

e. Two helo missions were utilized to transport 28 122mm rockets from the field after they were found by units of this Battalion.

5. ARTILLERY AND FIRE SUPPORT

a. From 1 to 30 September 1969, fire support was provided by Battery B, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines.

b. During the month of September, one officer reported to Bravo Battery and was assigned to Company G, 2d Battalion, 1st Marines. Company F's forward observer officer was transferred to the 11th Marines.

c. The 1st Battalion, 11th Marines remained in support of the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines during the entire month of September. During this reporting period 50 observed missions were recorded. Daily pre-empted fires totaled 320 targets. Because of the civilian populace and the extensive allied ARVN and CAP's activities within the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines TAOR, artillery fire has been restricted to several specific areas. These areas are commonly referred to as No Name Island, Cam Sa I and II, and the southern borderline area. During the month of September, approximately 6000 artillery rounds were fired in direct support. An additional 200 rounds of general support were expended. Artillery support was supplemented by 2790 HE, 87 WP, and 1627 illumination rounds by organic 81mm mortars.

6. TRAINING

a. During September, training within the Battalion consisted of Rehabilitation Training for rifle company personnel, Orientation Training for replacement personnel, and attendance at Division and FMFPAC schools.

b. Rehabilitation Training consisted of six days of instruction covering the following subjects; Mapping and Compass, Fire Control/Discipline, M-79 Grenade Launcher, Claymore Mines, MACV Rules of Engagement, Patrolling, .45 Caliber Pistol, M-16 Rifle, M-60 Machinegun, Weapons/Grenade Safety, Starlight Scope, Supporting Arms, 81mm Adjustment/FO Techniques, Personal Response, Ambushes/Counter Ambushes, LAW, First Aid/Field Sanitation, Combat Leadership, Tank/Infantry Coordination, Narcotics/Drug Abuse, Mines/Booby Traps, Race Relations, and Attack of Fortified Positions. In addition, all personnel underwent the Quick Fire/Quick Kill Course and fired individual weapons for zeroing at the 1000 inch range.

7. LOGISTICS AND SUPPLY

a. Logistics

(1) During the month of September the Battalion conducted several operations in its TAOR. Resupply of operating units was accomplished by trucks and LVT's. The Battalion has the responsibility of logistically supporting four rifle companies, one of which provides security for a major bridge in the Battalion's TAOR. Three bridges located in the 2d Bn.'s TAOR are on the primary routes of supply for all operational units south of Da Nang.

(2) The Battalion's requirements for third echelon maintenance over last month. The breakdown on Tactical Equipment Repair Orders is as follows:

b. Motor Transport

(1) The overall deadline rate for the Motor Transport Section was 40% the same as last month. This is directly attributed to a lack of spare parts.

(2) On M151A1 vehicle was Code H during the month and four were deadlined for third echelon NORS.

(3) Fifteen M274A2 vehicles are currently deadlined. Seven are deadlined for second echelon NORS and eight are deadlined for third echelon NORS.

c. Roads.

(1) Roads within the combat base are in poor condition due to the rain. Several roads are flooded. Crushed stone has been ordered to build the roads up. Approximately ten truck loads have been received.

d. Supply

(1) One third of the 1969 monsoon requirements was obtained from FLC, with the remainder to follow. The use of barrier construction material by the Battalion was extremely heavy during September. Critical shortages of body armor appeared at the end of the month. The rearrangement of the requisition file into status categories has almost been completed.

e. Fiscal Obligations

(1) Obligations during the month of September for SFA items were \$110,188.49. Funds for ASA items were \$27,359.96.

8. COMMUNICATIONS

a. During the month of September 1969, the communication platoon provided and maintained all normal communications facilities for 2d Battalion, 1st Marines. Since arriving in the Cau Pa area primary emphasis was placed on improving and installing new communication facilities for the command. Continued emphasis was placed on preparation for the upcoming Command Material Management Inspection.

b. Radio Section: A high of twelve deadlined AN/PRC-25's in for DX was attained at the end of the month. Communication Security Classes were held for communication personnel. Renewed emphasis was placed on improving radio operating procedures within the Battalion.

c. Wire Section: Rewiring of the defensive perimeter was completed. Improvement of the wire lines throughout the CP is still in progress.

d. Message Center Section: The message traffic for the month of September consisted of 45 outgoing and 1027 incoming messages. The total recorded down time for the month of September between Regiment and 2/1 was 58 hours and 24 minutes.

e. Engineer Equipment: All generator personnel have now attended the NSA Generator School. The total down-time for the CP generators for the month of September was 1 hour and 45 minutes.

9. MEDICAL AND DENTAL

a. During the reporting period, the Battalion Aid station had a strength of one officer and 53 Hospital Corpsmen in the field, and in garrison. A forward Battalion Aid Station was established on 1 September 1969, for a one day Battalion Operation.

b. The Battalion Aid Station treated 854 patients during the month of September. There were no acute or unusual medical problems of epidemic scale during this period. There are no major sanitation problems at this time.

c. Analysis of routine medical treatments revealed six cases of upper respiratory infection, nine cases of diarrhea, 54 cases of foot disorders, 163 dermatology problems and nine cases of venereal disease. There were four cases of FUO and no new cases of malaria. There were 609 patients treated for miscellaneous problems at routine sick call. There were 286 dental patients.

d. Analysis of mortality figures reveal no USMC KIA's, and no USMC DOW's as a result of hostile action. There were 23 USMC WIA's. There were 12 USMC WIANE and 11 USMC NBC's. There were two USN WIA's and one USN KIA.

e. The immunization program was adequate, 2020 immunizations were given to members of this Battalion.

f. There was an active civilian medical program. 943 Vietnamese civilians were treated. 20 Vietnamese civilian dental patients were treated.

g. There were seven USMC, and 47 Vietnamese civilians evacuated for medical reasons.

10. CHAPLAIN

a. The Battalion Chaplain Lt. Irvin H. Thompson, CHC, USNR, attended the Far East Southern Baptist Chaplain's Conference 1-5 September in Tokyo. One Lay Protestant service was conducted for the Battalion. CDR. William Fuller, 1st Marines Regimental Chaplain conducted two Protestant services. The unit Chaplain conducted 15 Protestant services with 435 in attendance. The Battalion had 11 Catholic Masses said by Lt. J. J. Conway from 3rd Amtrac Battalion. A memorial service was held 28 September for those who were killed during the previous month.

b. Leave was granted to all Jewish Personnel to partake in the Jewish Holidays during September. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur were celebrated at the China Beach R and R center by the Jewish Chaplain, Captain G. M. Stengel, USAR.

c. The Battalion Chaplain assisted six persons in making MARS calls to their families. One American Red Cross death message was delivered. The Chaplain counseled fifteen men with personal problems, twelve visits were made to the hospitals and two to the brig.

SEQUENTIAL LISTINGS OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Sept 69 - 0110 - Company E at BT082653 observed four VC/NVA with weapons and engaged them with small arms fire. The enemy, breaking contact, fled into a village. The unit pursued the enemy losing sight of them in the village.
- 0720 - Engineers at BT065665 one 81mm round was turned in by Vietnamese boy. Paid individual 200 piasters and destroyed round with $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. C-4.
- 0730 - 3d Amtrac Battalion at BT098666 Amtrac hit a mine resulting in three USMC WIAE and the total destruction of one Amtrac.
- 1030 - Company H unit at BT094656 while sweeping, area found four bunkers, one 2'x4' under bamboo thicket, two bunkers were 4'x4'x8' reinforced with bricks, concrete, and wooden beams, the other bunker was 2'x4'x6' reinforced with bricks, concrete, and wooden beams. Destroyed all bunkers with 20 pounds C-4.
- 1055 - Company H unit at BT095653 found enemy bunker 9'x4' reinforced with log beams and bricks. Destroyed with C-4.
- 1100 - Company H unit at BT094656 discovered two tunnels, one bunker 8'x4'x3' located under a bamboo tree, with openings concealed by bamboo leaves. Threw CS grenades in bunkers and destroyed with C-4.
- 1130 - Company H unit at BT092656 while conducting a sweep simultaneously set off four box type mines with pressure fuse. Contents consisted of bent rusty nails resulting in four USMC WIAEs. Company H units remained in position and were assisted by Company F in completion of the sweep.
- 1100 - Company H unit at BT095650 while, conducting sweep using ordnance detectors, located metallic objects in open field. Unit discovered four 122mm rockets, (three with warheads, one without) buried approximately three feet in depth. Ordnance was turned into S-2.
- 1130 - Company H unit at BT095698 discovered one dud 105mm round. Destroyed in place with $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. C-4.
- 1910 - Company G unit at BT033648 had two men injured when a bunker they were in collapsed. Individuals were taken to BAS.
- 2 Sept 69 - 1600 - CAP 276 at BT076704 patrol found trip wire extended across trail leading into cave consisting of M-26 in cam rigged as SFD. Two similar SFDs were discovered in same area. Destroyed in place with C-4.
- 1610 - Company E unit at BT094650 while on patrol discovered a bunker camouflaged with bricks and rubble 10'x5'x3'. Bunker was reinforced with lumber and earth but was not recently used. Bunker was checked out and then destroyed with C-4.

- 1702 - Company H unit at BT013593 discovered one bunker with two exits 5'x4'x8'. Search conducted by tunnel rat found one M-26, and one smoke round.
- 3 Sept 69 .. 0645 - Company H unit at BT047701 discovered L shaped tunnel 2'x2'x5' reinforced and having five entrances and airholes extending from abandoned house to rice paddy. Smoke grenade was employed and men investigated the tunnel and found one knife. Destroyed tunnel with C-4.
- 0700 - Company H unit at BT054703 found one 60mm SFD with trip wire extending across paddy dike. Within the same area a M-26 SFD with trip wire was discovered. Both SFDs were found by utilizing an ordnance detector, and were destroyed by pulling the trip wires with a rope.
- 0730 - Engineers at BT049659 One M-79 and one 81mm round were turned in by Vietnamese boy while unit conducted road sweep. Destroyed with C-4.
- 0915 - Company E unit at BT090665 while on patrol spotted four VC dressed in green, two had weapons. VC seeing friendly unit, fled to the south. Company E unit opened up with small arms and called in 81mm and artillery fire missions on the enemy's position. After a thorough search of the area unit reported negative sightings of the enemy or enemy weapons.
- 1230 - Company E unit at BT075643 while on patrol unit discovered one pound of C-3 and one mutilated ID in a family bunker. Detained civilian who lived in the house adjacent to the bunker and brought to ITT upon completion of patrol.
- 1430 - 2d Bn, 1st Marines CP at BT074656 received M-79 rounds from Vietnamese children. Later, an explosion set off mortar rounds on the side of the road, resulting in negative casualties. S-2 and ammunition technician were called on to investigate.
- 1840 - Company H unit at BT040681 found one SFD M-79 round in C-section can with pressure release and trip wire. SFD was discovered in trash dump along a tree line. No warning indicators were present. Destroyed SFD with C-4.
- 1930 - S-2 at 2d Bn, 1st Marine Contingent by use of sensory devices detected some activity at BT053641. Called in an artillery fire mission, where in 30 HE rounds were fired for effect.
- 2115 - Company E unit at BT068610 while setting in ambush site observed movement. And then received three or four small arms rounds, called in 81mm fire mission and conducted thorough sweep of area with no further enemy contact.

- 2400 - Company E unit at BT082650 while set in ambush, saw movement and opened fire with four rounds M-16. Movement then ceased. While returning to initial point discovered one woman who had been wounded by a stray round. Woman taken to BAS for treatment.
- 4 Sept 69 - 0735 - Engineers at BT047659 One M-79 round and one M-45 round were turned in by Vietnamese boys. Paid personnel 60 piasters and destroyed with C-4.
- 0910 - Engineers at BT079659 while on road sweep discovered one M-79 round. Destroyed with C-4.
- 1145 - Company F unit at BT070660 while on patrol observed four civilians who were fleeing from unit toward the north. One civilian hit an SFB and two appeared to be wounded, but all personnel continued to move out of the area. Unit swept area with no further sightings.
- 1810 - Company G worked jointly in a combined operation with the 181st Regional Force Company. Company G supplied a blocking force and Marine engineer support. Four fighting tunnels, one ChiCom grenade, one M-26, and one M-79 round were destroyed. The 181st Regional Force Company advised the Vietnamese people to move to the 181st protected resettlement compound. In general, the joint cooperation and coordination of the operation proved to be successful.
- 5 Sept 69 - 0115 - Company G at BT033648 while firing 60mm mortars had a short round occur, resulting in two men with minor shrapnel wounds. Roving night vehicle patrol provided transportation for one man to BAS.
- 0810 - Engineers at BT049659 while on road sweep two Vietnamese boys turned over one LAAW to the mine sweep team. Paid individuals 100 piasters and destroyed with C-4.
- 1450 - Company E unit at BT072642 while crossing open field received three M-79 and 50 AK-47 rounds from treeline. Returned fire with M-16, and M-79 rounds. Unit then swept area with no further sign of enemy activity.
- 2325 - CAP 275 at BT057703 while on patrol the point men spotted two Vietnamese males who ran when ordered to stop. Point men killed one Vietnamese male, the other escaped. Found one VC KIA in area of contact with three ChiCom grenades in his possession.
- 6 Sept 69 - 0245 - Company E unit at BT085645 while in ambush site received heavy 50 cal. machine gun and AK-47 fire from approximately 75 meters away. Resulted in seven USMC WIA and one USN KIA. Echo 1 was dispatched to area to reinforce. Area swept with no further contact.

- 0255 - CAP 272 at BT012693 reported three rockets presumed to be 122mm fired in rapid succession from grid C12693. Called in artillery mission on enemy position and will check at first light.
- 0200 - Crowneast at BT061707 reported rocket and mortar sites. Personnel manning the 106RR immediately took under fire the area north of Binh Ky. When a second mortar site was discovered, the 106RR immediately fired on it. When a rocket site was again activated unit immediately fired on the area resulting in good coverage of target. It is believed that the 106RR firing forced the enemy to withdraw as evidenced by the six 122mm rockets, and seven 82mm rounds captured during the sweep that followed.

Units proceeded to rocket site BT058706 where they discovered six unfired 122mm rockets, nine rocket firing positions, six fighting holes, three mortar positions, and seven 82mm rounds. In addition discovered two blood trails with drag marks within village leading north.

- 1650 - Company G unit at BT028651 detained one civilian with a Marine's Geneva Convention Card and three penicillin capsules. Individual was sent to IIT for questioning.
- 1200 - Company C, 1st Bn, 1st Marines at AT990690 unit found anti-personnel mine field consisting of booby trapped fire cracker rounds. Destroyed ordnance with C-4.

A sweep of the area resulted in the capture of one M-79 with seven HE rounds, six M-26 grenades, two magazines, two cartridge belts, assorted documents, and 300 pounds of rice.

Search of area revealed four drag marks and five blood trails.
- 15 Sept 69 - 0730 - Company F at BT073646 had two Vietnamese boys turn in two M-26s. Paid boys 1000 piasters for same and destroyed with C-4.

VC were wearing ARVN uniforms without covers and were carrying AK-47s, SKSs, and M-16s.
- 0935 - ITT team at BT069649 found one tunnel 3'x4'x8'. Checked out with negative results and destroyed with C-4.

- 1345 - Company H at BT072652 discovered two L shaped bunkers 4'x3'x8' and destroyed them with C-4.
- 1400 - Company H at BT063649 found an area which was believed to be a mine field with 81mm illumination canisters in each of the four corners. Checked area with negative findings.
- 1410 - Company H at BT067647 found one L shaped bunker 4'x3'x8' with an 18 inch false bottom. Destroyed with C-4.
- 1645 - Company E unit at BT081649 while on patrol detained two males, age 35 and 40 years. One male did not have an ID card and the other had a suspicious ID. Sent personnel to ITT.

- 1830 - Company H unit at BT041697 found eight holes, the largest of which was 7x3x3 inches. Impressions on bottom resembled 122mm rockets, 82mm mortars, and one 82mm mortar base plate. Holes appeared to be fresh and recently used. Foot prints were found leading into river, set an ambush site 50 meters to the south of holes.
- 2300 - Rat Patrol at AT989672 received one ChiCom grenade, either thrown or booby trapped resulting in negative casualties.

- 19 Sept 69 - 1600 - Company G at BT024658 reported a truck received sniper rounds while moving south along Highway 1 resulting in one USMC WIAE with head wound. Company G dispatched squad size unit and swept area with no further sign of the enemy.
- 20 Sept 69 - 0215 - S-2 at 2d Bn, 1st Marines Contonement received report of activity at BT092653. Fired 10 rounds 81mm HE.
- 0630 - CAP 276 at BT071702 found type written notice in front of Village Chief's house stating in effect that all persons in vicinity of GVN and U. S. Marines are to move their houses. Message further cautioned villagers to avoid Marines on the road. In addition it encouraged indigenous personnel to supply names of any Vietnamese persons giving information to Marines and ARVNs so that they may be killed.
- 1130 - 3d CIT and 2d Bn, 1st Marines S-2 at BT021644 found tunnel 2'x2'x 8', with two entrances, 11x10 inches. The tunnel was well concealed under three inches of soil. Inside the tunnel were one U. S. Carbine, four ChiCom grenades, one 81mm round, one B-40, and one NVA flag. Destroyed the tunnel with C-4 and turned in all captured gear to 5th CIT Headquarters.
- 1200 - CAP 272 at BT034628 had one Vietnamese child report that two Vietnamese were VC. Detained two VC suspects.
- 1450 - Company E unit at BT074637 reported that their Kit Carson Scout spotted two Vietnamese females emerge from a bunker. Scout told them to halt, when they attempted to avoid the unit, the scout opened fire, followed by Company E unit. The results were one VC/NVA killed and the other was wounded and evacuated.
- 1600 - Company H unit at BT073638 while on patrol the second man in column tripped a home made box mine. The individual was evacuated.
- 1635 - Company E unit at BT073637 while searching area, received two M-79 rounds. Unit set up a quick defense and laid down a base of fire resulting in no further enemy contact.
- 1645 - Company H unit at BT068647 discovered an SFC consisting of two cans of C-4 with trip wires. Destroyed in place with C-4.
- 2145 - Company E unit, Company H unit and 3d ITT at BT073634, through the use of ordnance locators and accurate intelligence information provided by a Vietnamese woman, found 28 122mm rockets buried underground. A total of 1940 AK-47 rounds were buried with the rockets. With the aid of artillery illumination and a flare ship, the search was continued.
- 2250 - 2d Bn, 1st Marines at BT074655 received a report from Whiskey Tower that approximately 12 VC were about 200 meters from the western side of the Contonement. 106 HE, 81mm HE, and 81mm illumination were fired with unknown results. However, observers feel a number of direct hits were suffered by the enemy.

- 1 Sept 69 - 0600 - 2d Bn, 1st Marines at BT071615 and surrounding area, with reference to journal #28 of 20 September 1969 had unit search area. Unit found impact area of what appeared to be three 106 pheshette rounds and discovered two sets of bare foot prints heading in an easterly direction.
- 0610 - Company F unit at BT068700 received three M-26 grenades from three children while the unit was on patrol. Destroyed grenades with C-4 and paid the children 1040 piasters.
- 0930 - Company H unit at BT087679. While the unit was on patrol the 3d men in the column tripped a 60mm SFD with trip wire and delay fuze, resulting in one USMC WIA. The unit administered first aid and continued the patrol.
- 0950 - Company E unit at BT073647 found one bag of salt, nine RPG rounds, 450 AK-47 rounds stored in seven ammunition cans, two LAAWs, six M18 bombs and one bag of medical supplies. The unit turned in their findings to S-2 for study.

The unit fired M-79 rounds at the point element of the enemy resulting in one enemy KIA who fell into the water. - 1940 - Company H unit at BT090675 spotted three VC/NVA in a treeline approximately 200 meters southwest of their position. The unit called in 60mm fire mission, and searched area with no further evidence of the enemy.
- 2210 - 2d Bn, 1st Marines Contonement received two incoming enemy rounds of unknown type resulting in one USMC WIA. Crater analysis will be made as soon as possible.
- 2235 - Company G unit at BT035655 while in ambush site an unknown number of personnel approximately 175 meters to the south, who were apparently working or digging in the area. Unit fired upon the enemy with small arms, LAAWs, and M-79. A thorough sweep of the area revealed freshly dug holes and matted grass in area of contact.

- 0710 - Company F unit at BT071648, received two 60mm rounds and one M-26 grenade from Vietnamese personnel. The unit paid the individuals 1000 piasters and destroyed the ordnance with C-4.
- 0718 - Company F unit at BT071698 received one dud 105 round from Vietnamese children. Paid the children 500 piasters and destroyed the round with C-4.
- 1015 - S-2 at BT074655 received one M-26 grenade, one claymore, five 60mm rounds, and two 81mm HE rounds from Vietnamese children. Paid children 1800 piasters and placed rounds in bunkers awaiting disposition by ammunition technician.
- 2130 - 2d Bn, 1st Marines at the Contonement spotted approximately 20 personnel moving quickly to the north about 400 meters out. Fired 106s, 81mm, and artillery resulting in two secondary explosions. The enemy was last seen fleeing to the east.
- 2300 - 2d Bn, 1st Marines and 181st RF Company at BT060650. The 181st RF Company and resettlement hamlet had unknown type ordnance detonate inside the resettlement hamlet resulting in five KIAs and 25 wounded civilians. The 181st RF Company sealed off all exits from the village and are searching for the terrorist. 2d Bn, 1st Marines evacuated all the wounded civilians to the Battalion Aid Station and then by helicopter to the hospital. A later analysis of the incident determined the terrorist act resulted in a total of 33 casualties.
- 23 Sept 69 - 0430 - Company H units Hotel 11 and Hotel 12 at BT087654 spotted three or four personnel moving in village about 40 meters from their ambush site. The units checked out the entire area and took villagers to the new life hamlet for a brief interrogation.
- 0715 - Engineers at BT052659 found one booby trapped LAAW while on daily morning road sweep. Destroyed it with C-4.
- 0725 - Company H unit at BT090654 discovered coke can filled with C-4 with pull friction fuze set in a foot trap. Destroyed SFD with C-4.

2200 - Roving Patrol at BT065673 evacuated three Vietnamese females to 2d Bn, 1st Marines Battalion Aid Station. The three females were wounded as a result of a 60mm M and I by the 134th ARVN.

26 Sept 69 - 0700 - Company H unit at BT065643, while returning from night ambush site received sniper fire from a treeline to the southwest. The unit returned fire with a M-60.

0700 - Company E unit at BT082648 observed 10 civilians moving from south to north attempting to penetrate cordon. Personnel were detained and will be taken to collection point.

0730 - 2d Bn, 1st Marines with 181st RF Company while conducting a joint operation, at BT086666 discovered two bunkers 15'x8'x8' and one metal house 10'x10'. Destroyed with C-4.

0915 - Company E at BT073647 had personnel activate 60mm SFD with pressure type firing device resulting in one USMC WIAE.

1040 - Company E unit at BT078654 received two M-26 grenades, one 60mm round, and one 105mm round from four Vietnamese children. Destroyed ordnance with C-4 and paid the children 2000 piasters.

IFF screened civilians and detained eight VC suspects. In addition, 21 houses, 13 bunkers and two tunnels were destroyed by 181st RF Company.

1800 - Company H unit at BT068651 while on patrol observed one Vietnamese female and called for her to stop to check her ID. When the woman began to flee after the unit attempted to halt her, a scout sniper wounded her in the leg to prevent her escape. A Corpsman treated the wound and requested a medevac. The woman will undergo questioning later.



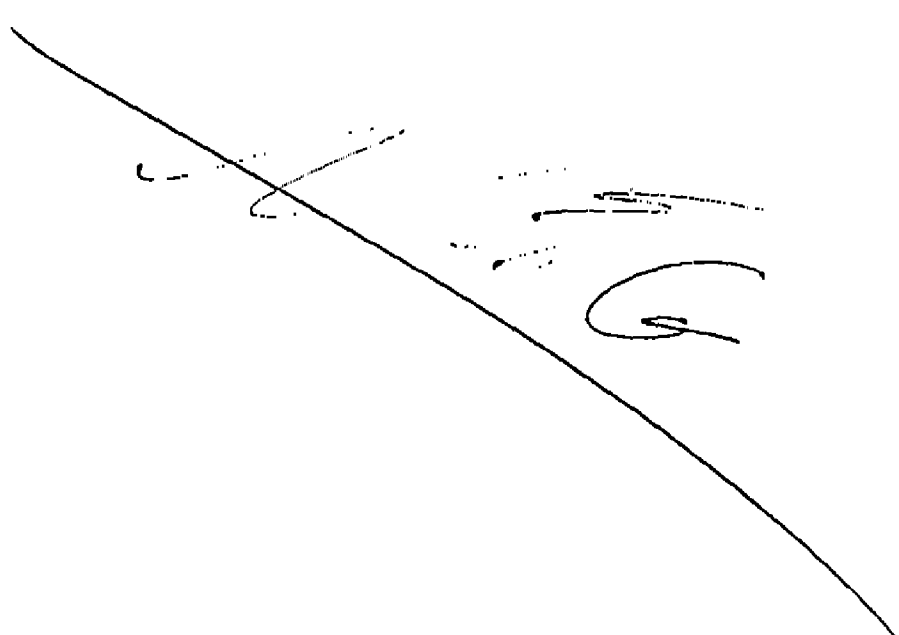

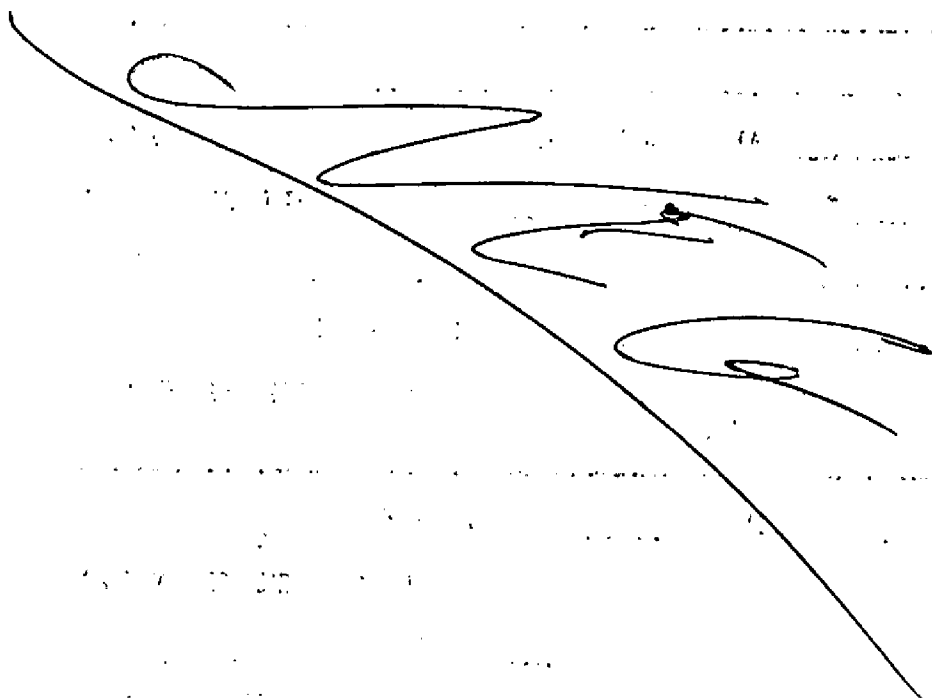
