AT 211045H, AS UNIT WAS MOVING THROUGH OPEN SANDY AREA, ONE WOMAN WAS OBSERVED APPROX 20 M AWAY HEADING TOWARD TREELINE WHICH WAS APPROX 50 M SOUTH OF UNIT. PATROL LEADER APPROACH WOMAN TO CHECK HER ID. AT 211100H, PATROL OBSERVED 5 VE CIVILIANS ON VIEL DOING TRAIL VIC BT100654. TWO MEMBERS OF PATROL WENT TO DETERMINE THE STATUS OF THE 5 VN CIVILIANS. AT 211105H, THREE MEMBERS OF THE UNIT APPROACHED THE WOMAN IN A DESERTED HUT THAT HAD ORIGINALLY ENTERED THE TREELINE VIC BT103654. SHE YELLED OUT AND STARTED RUNNING TO THE NORTH. AT 211110H, THREE VN MALES WERE OBSERVED APPROX 20-25 M TO THE SOUTH. THEY APPEARED TO HAVE ON CARTRIDGE BELTS AND WERE OPENED UP ON WITH SAF AS THEY FLED SOUTH REERING WITH NEG RESULTS. AT THIS TIME THE PATROL LEADER HAD APPREHENDED THE VE WOMAN. AT 211115H, AN OLD MAN RAN FROM THE TREELINE GOING SOUTH VIC BT102653. THIBR GUARDING THE 5 VN CIVILIAN DETAINEES FIRED SAF VIC OF THE OLD MAN MOVING SOUTH RESULTING IN ONE VCS MIA. AT 211120H, TWO ALCO CANS WERE FOUND IN THE DESERTED HUT WITH THE WOMAN. WOMAN AND GEAR WAS TAKEN TO TEMPORARY POSITION WHERE OTHER DETAINEES WERE BEING HELD. AT 211130H MEDEVAC WAS CALLED FOR VCS MIA. MEDEVAC COMPLETED AT 211140H. AT 211215H TR DEPARTED FOR CP WITH 1 VCS AND 5 DETAINEES. (SEE ATTACHED OVERLAY (INCL 1 & 2))

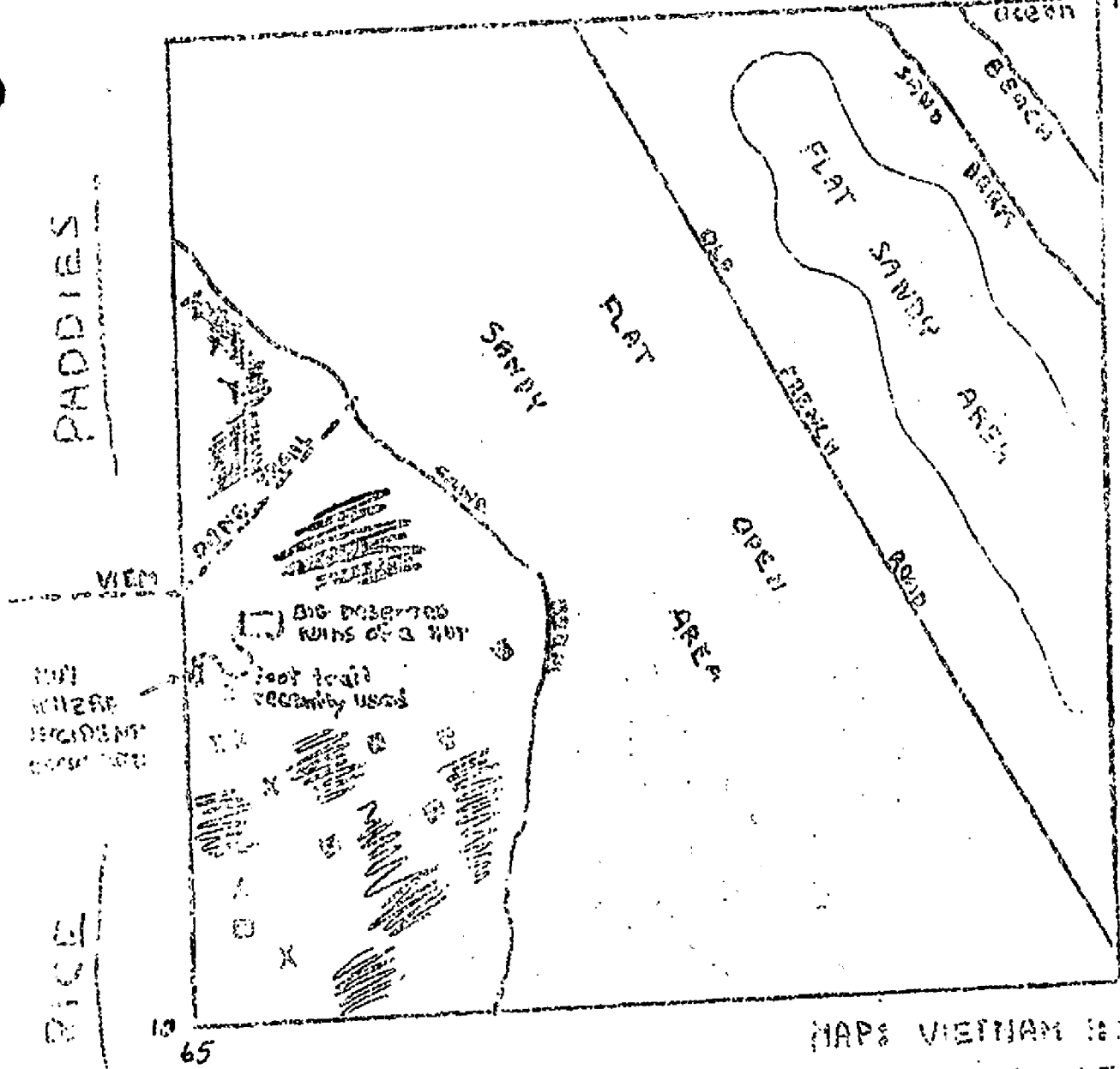

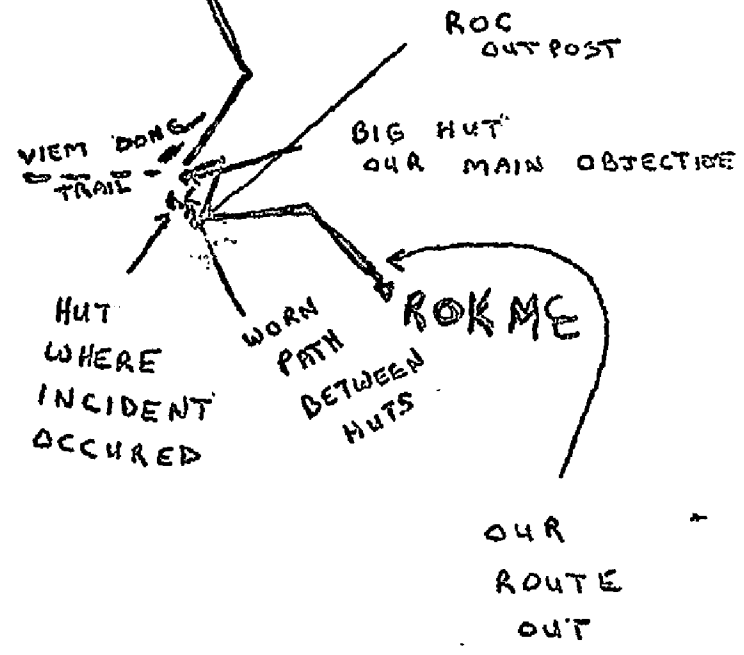

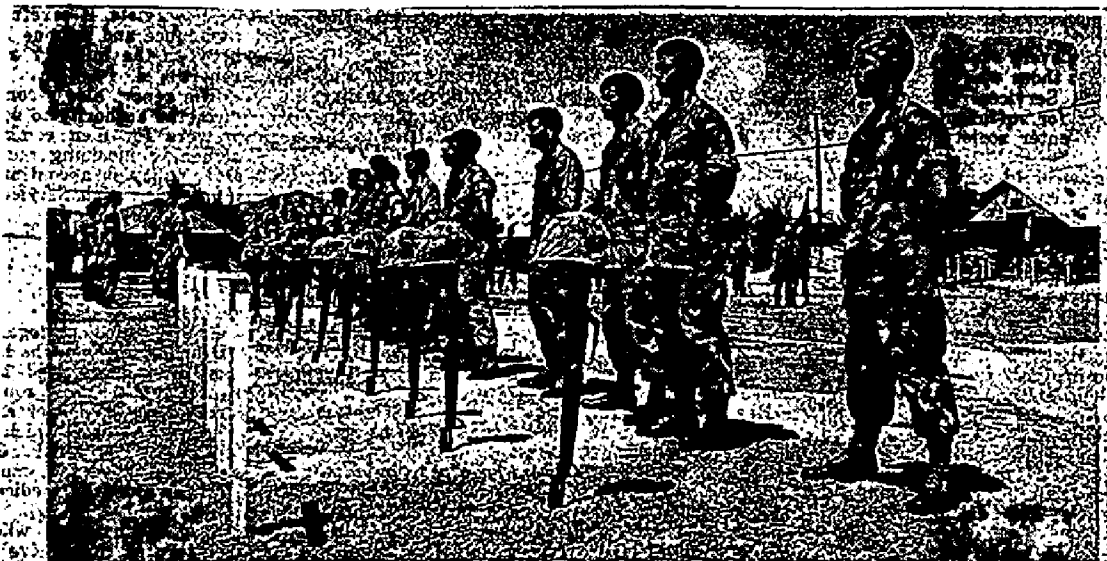
