- c. Committee Reports
 - (1) Minutes from September 18, 2017 Membership Meeting read by Adjutant Vin Burdziuk And the Adjutant Report was Accepted.

(2) TREASURER'S REPORT: Steve Hendricken's report is from July 1st to November 6, 2017. Beginning Balance in July \$8,866.12 – Due's received from National \$717.00 – Forget Me Not Drive received \$255 from 5 members for our Virtual Drive. And we collected \$952.59 on Friday and \$1064.01 on Saturday for a total of \$2271.60 - We collected Interest of \$30.12 and from other source \$32 for a TOTAL of \$3050.72 – We spent \$1103.07 in total. \$40 for new membership. \$25 Common-wealth of Massachusetts filings. \$112.00 for PO Box Rental. And, print and mail came to \$906.07 – Rent for \$20.00 – Checking balance is \$4813.33. Our CD is \$6,000.44 - Our Ending Balance \$10813.77 - The Treasurer's Report was accepted as read.

Our Member Beau McIver asked what the interest was on our CD. Answer given was 1.5%

(3) SICKNESS & DISTRESS REPORT: Dan Meehan is ill and could not make it to the meeting.

Dave D'Amato was picked up and brought to our last Veterans Luncheon. And Dick Jennings still homebound.

***We found out after the meeting that Dick Jennings had passed. We notified Chapter 65 members and sent the Jennings Family a Sympathy Card.

4) NEW BUSINESS: Forget me Not was very successful received donations of \$2271.60 – Stop & Shop Manager was given a Certificate from our Chapter thanking him for letting us use his store for our drive. Members voted on how to disperse our money to support Veterans Issues. \$150 was voted to be given to each town we represent. The \$150.00 check will be delivered to each towns Veterans Agent. \$250 will be donated for the Van Program to get Veterans to the Hospital for their appointments. \$250 will be donated to the VA West Roxbury Volunteer Services.

\$500 was discussed for the Honor Flight program which starts up again in the Spring time. Total Amount to be donated by Chapter 65 is \$2500.00

DEP Meeting was brought up and Warren Smith and George Pontes attended. The department uses and suggests Quick Books to be used for the Chapter(s). If we purchase it the department will help set it up.

(5) OLD BUSINESS: Donation Boxes we're brought up again. DAV was approved to use the donation boxes to accept clothing. The Chapters would have to do all the work on the collections. Hanover is the closest Savers Store where the box could be set at. But, Commander Smith did not commit to it as we do not have enough members to handle the extra work.

Second Lieutenant Ralph Talbot 1897 – 1918

Ralph Talbot was born in South Weymouth, Massachusetts, on January 6, 1897. He lived on Park Street and attended the original Weymouth High School. High School was a very busy time for Ralph, as he was a member of the debate team, captain of the track team, and editor of the school newspaper. After high school, he attended Mercersburg Academy and Yale University. Upon completion of his freshmen year at Yale, he enrolled in the U.S. Navy. 2d Lt Talbot was the first Marine Aviator awarded the Medal of Honor. This is America's highest military honor for exceptional heroism. Talbot earned this distinction for actions during World War I above Pittem, Belgium.
