1. It is your decision, your right, to keep or kill your baby.

The message projected here is, "It is ok to kill anything that is inconvenient." God said, "Thou shalt not kill." He also said, "I knew you before you were in your mother's womb." In Genesis, God said, "Creation was **very good**." As Catholics, we do not believe in capital punishment. It is the rapist that should be punished, not the baby. Blessed are the innocent. 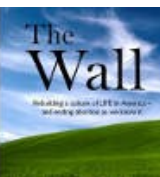
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
