SECTION B  
ENEMY WEATHER AND TERRAIN

1. Enemy.

a. Exclusive of Operation Pipestone Canyon, which will be discussed separately, during the month of May there were 3 major enemy incidents within the 1st Marines TAOR.

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(1) On 12 May 1969 a Sapper Attack was launched against 1st Marines CP. The attack appears to have followed the general pattern of such attacks. It is believed that a total of 80-100 actually participated in the attack, though it is possible that an additional assault force was in readiness to exploit a successful penetration. The Attack by Fire, including B-40 rockets, RPG's, and possibly 60mm mortars, was timed to cover the final penetration of the Sappers through the wire. The apparent objectives were the "C" Battery and 1st Battalion's 81mm mortar positions. The enemy failed to penetrate the defenses and withdrew, leaving behind 30 KIA and 3 WIA/PW's.

(2) The attack on 2nd Battalion began at approximately 0030H on 12 May 1969. 4 Sappers penetrated the perimeter and immediately moved to areas in the vicinity of the CO's quarters and the messhall. The Sappers destroyed a hootch next to the Staff/Officers Club, it is felt that they believed it to be the CO and XO's living area. They proceeded to the area of the BOQ and threw a grenade and demolitions, then moved to the Staff NCO hootch where another grenade was thrown. A large number of incoming B-40 rounds, some 82mm, 60mm and a large volume of small arms fire was received from outside the perimeter. The penetrating troops continued under the incoming mortar fire and prior to the main body withdrawing, a white star cluster was observed to the SW and a red star cluster to the NE of the compound. The attack lasted for about 2 hours with the enemy withdrawing to the East and SE. The attack resulted in 19 enemy KIA.

(3) At approximately 0745 on 13 May 1969, Intelligence Reports were received indicating 2 NVA Companies preparing fortified positions in Giang Dong. The report stated weapons, including AK's, B-40's, rockets and mortars were seen. 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines engaged the enemy at approximately 1230-1300 on 13 May 1969. After a determined stand, the enemy withdrew to the South having suffered 103 KIA.

b. The remainder of the month was limited to small unit contacts conducted against friendly CP's, bridge security units and patrols. Sporadic harassment and sniper fire occurred throughout the month.

c. Enemy units reported to be employed in the 1st Marines TAOR consist of elements of the 36th NVA Regt, the R-20 Bn, the V-25 Bn, the T-89th Sapper Bn, elements of the 3rd Sapper Bn, and the 3rd Quang Da Bn. Enemy local force units consist of the Q-60th and the Q-82nd Companies.

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d. The number of SFD's found or detonated by 1st Marines forces in the TAOR has decreased from last month. Of the 155 SFD's encountered, 38 were detonated and 117 were found. The enemy continues to use trip wires and pressure fuses for detonating both our own and locally manufactured explosive devices. Devices utilize C-4 or similar explosives and are simple containers such as cans or boxes, although large and elaborate mines were at times used.

e. There were 3 rocket attacks launched from the 1st Marines TAOR in May. Their DTG, No., Firing Sites, and Impacts are listed below:

3. Ground Surveillance. The Ground Surveillance Program decreased during May due to the removal of Sensors. One major activation occurred during May. A 105mm fire mission was called, however, the mission was delayed more than 30 minutes due to clearance problems.

4. Weather. The weather during May had little or no effect on friendly or enemy operations. Warm humid weather prevailed throughout the 1st Marines TACR with an average high temperature of 94° and the average low of 80°. The average humidity was 76.2% and the rainfall was 2.32 inches. Visibility was good to excellent.

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5. Terrain. The 1st Marines TAOR consists of fertile rice paddy land containing many hamlets. Scattered throughout the TAOR are rivers, streams, sand dunes and bamboo hedgerows. Located in, or passing through the TAOR are routes 1, 1B, 1C, 12N, 12E, 130, and 538.

6. Operation Pipestone Canyon.

a. During May 1969 1st Marines were alerted to be prepared to conduct operations in the Dodge City - Go Noi Island area. Forces assigned to participate consisted of ARVN, ROKMC and U.S. Marines.

b. To provide for the collection and dissemination of Intelligence Information to forces speaking three different languages, a Combined Intelligence Center was established. The basic organization of the Intelligence Center is contained in Figure 1.

(1) Representatives from the Senior Headquarters of forces were requested to form the Combined Intelligence Center to insure a coordinated collection effort and to facilitate dissemination of Intelligence.

c. To facilitate the exploitation of Detainees and POW's each participating force was requested to provide an Interrogation Team. These teams were combined and formed the Combined Detention Center. This allowed all PW's captured to be interrogated regarding specific BEI's from each of the participating forces and the rapid dissemination of information developed.

(1) To support the Combined Detention Center, a Document Translation Team was formed and representatives from Counter-intelligence were available for Interrogation of the VC Infrastructure.

d. To facilitate the mission of destroying the Viet Cong Infrastructure, Quang Nam Province was requested to provide the following forces:

- (1) National Police Field Forces.
- (2) Provincial Reconnaissance Units.
- (3) Census Grievance.
- (4) Special Police.

e. Province was also requested to make the VCI files of the PIGMC available for screening detainees.

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f. Province Forces were organized and operated as follows:

(1) Representation was maintained in the Combined Intelligence Center to insure coordination and control as well as to disseminate information.

(2) Special Police were assigned to the Combined Detention Center for Interrogation and Exploitation of Detainees.

(3) Screening Teams, consisting of NTF, PRU's, CI and Counterintelligence personnel were formed and assigned to tactical units that would be moving through populated areas. As the tactical troops moved through the area they moved all indigenous personnel to centralized points where they were screened by the Screening Teams.

(a) Screening consisted of filling out two cards with the pertinent identification data on each individual. One card was retained by the Screening Team, the other was helo-lifted to the PIOCC in Poi An for processing against their files. If a person was found to be a VCI the card number was relayed back to the Screening Team and that person was removed from the indigenous personnel and evacuated to the CDC for Interrogation and Exploitation.

(4) Reaction force was formed, consisting of PRU, NTF and CI personnel. It was established to provide the Command with the capability of exploiting information gained from interrogations without interfering with the tactical forces. It had the capability of being committed by helicopter in a minimum period of time.

g. Support. To insure the rapid dissemination, collection and exploitation of Intelligence, the following unique resources were made available to the Combined Intelligence Center:

(1) TAC #4 Radio Net. This net was utilized by the CIC to receive information and disseminate Intelligence to the tactical forces.

(2) Intelligence Net. This net was utilized to control Screening Forces, to commit Reaction Forces and to pass information between the PIOCC, CIC, CDC and helicopters.

(3) Helicopters. The Intelligence effort had two helicopters assigned at all times. These were utilized to move Screening Forces and Reaction Forces, deliver Screening Cards from the Screening Forces to the PIOCC, evacuate PRU's and captured equipment from tactical units, as well as resupply Province Forces in the field.

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h. Operation Pipestone Canyon commenced on 26 May 1969 as elements of the 5th Marines from An Hoa and BLT 1/26 operating from Hill 37 commenced movement towards Go Noi Island and Dodge City. Contact with the enemy was light, however, the enemy's presence in the area was manifested by the numerous SFD's encountered. SFD's were employed in daisy chains and hanging from small trees and bushes to allow air bursts. Trip wires with friction fuses continue to be the method for detonation. Of the 58 SFD's encountered 21 were detonated and 37 were found and destroyed.

(1) Enemy units reported to be deployed in the area are the 1st Bn, 36th NVA Regt and District II DaLang forces consisting of the T-89th Sapper Bn.

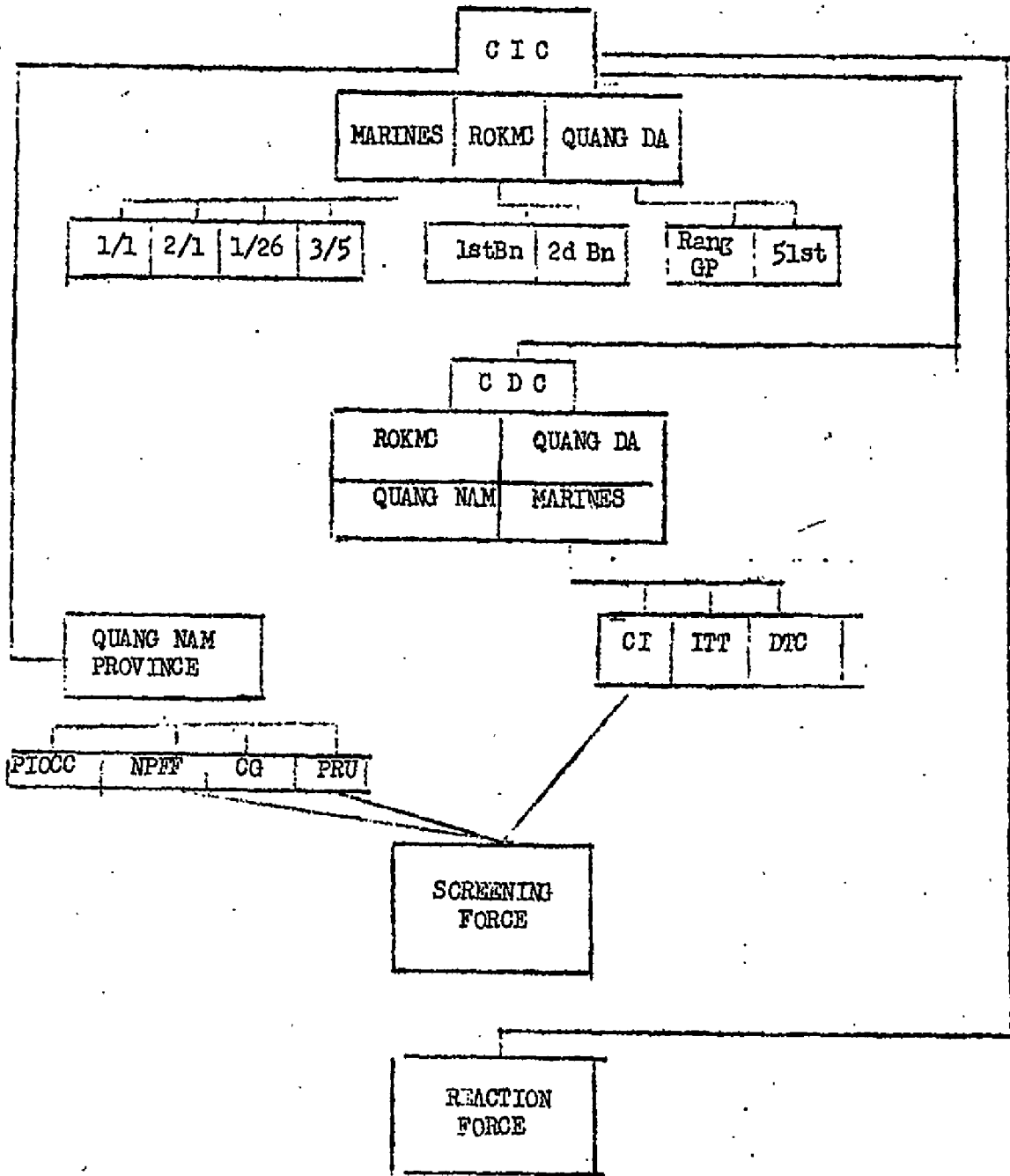

SECTION C  
OPERATIONS

1. COMBAT OPERATIONS

a. During the month of May 1969, missions of the First Marine Regiment remained unchanged. Emphasis continued on extensive combat patrols and night ambushes throughout the TAOR including the Rocket Belt. Steady improvement continued in uncovering enemy Surprise Firing Devices (SFD's) and road/trail mines. Combat operations were conducted in cooperation and coordination with RVNAF and ROKMC forces to capture and/or destroy NVA, VC and VCI forces; and to support Special Pacification and Hamlet upgrading plans. The movement of NVA/VC forces was generally suppressed in the First Marines TAOR during May 1969 and the enemy's only organized major effort during 12-13 May resulted in his defeat.

b. The enemy initiated Post Spring Offensive offered the First Marines its most significant contact of the month:

(1) On the night of 12 May, the Second Battalion CP was attacked by an estimated enemy company, supported by 82mm mortars, B-40 rockets and automatic weapons. The Second Battalion rallied to a quick defense, returning fire with organic weapons, mortars, direct artillery fire and gunships. The following morning, 19 NVA soldiers lay dead around the perimeter, in addition to an assortment of individual weapons, equipment and ordnance.

(2) On the same night, only ten minutes after Second Battalion came under attack, the First Battalion CP (also the Regimental CP) came under a mortar and RPG supported ground attack. Supported by OV-10s, Huey gunships and "Spooky", the enemy was viciously repelled, leaving 30 enemy dead and three wounded PWs. In addition to capturing individual weapons, B-40 rocket launchers, much ordnance and miscellaneous equipment were also found after the battle.

(3) As a result of the early morning contact and information indicating that an enemy force of about 2 companies had moved to QUANG CELU (just West of the Regimental CP), the Third Battalion with three companies was launched into an attack at first light. Crossing the GCD at Anderson Trail (63 GL), the units searched from South to North as far as QUANG CHAU, when India Company met resistance from an unknown size enemy force entrenched in a tree line bordering the village. Kilo and Lima Company moved in on the West side of the village while two companies from the 59th RF Battalion closed the cordon to the North and East. Tanks and Amtracs provided additional support, and throughout the day and that night, the enemy was pounded by allied forces. He finally withdrew from the area. The result of this action left 103 NVA killed.

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c. The second major event for the month of May was the formulation and commencement of Operation PIPESTONE CANYON. Planning began when the First Marines CO and S-3 attended a conference at the First Marine Division CP. On 25 May the first organizational meeting convened in the First Marines COC Briefing Room.

(1) Operation Order OOL-69 sets forth PIPESTONE CANYON in three phases, covering a total period of about 45 days in the DODGE CITY-GO NOI ISLAND area, known to be the enemy's main staging and harbor site, and their base of operation in the DANANG AO. Forces involved in the operation include First and Second Battalions, First Marines; Third Battalion, Fifth Marines; Delta Company, First Battalion, Fifth Marines; BLT 1/26; First and Second Battalion, Second Brigade, ROKMC; two battalions of the 51st Regiment (ARVN); and the First ARVN Ranger Group.

(2) During Phase I, which commenced at 0600 on the 26th, Third Battalion, Fifth Marines and BLT 1/26 began deceptive operations in Western Area, driving the enemy to the East. During this phase, the First Marines were tasked as the operational reporting channel to Division.

(3) During the period 300600H-310600H, no offensive activities were initiated in observance of a cease fire for Buddha's Birthday.

(4) Phase II, unveiled at 0900 on the 31st, as the CO of the First Marines assumed control, and First and Second Battalions, First Marines, and elements of the 51st ARVN Regiment and First ARVN Ranger Group crossed the Line of Departure (LOD), sweeping abreast from North to South. Simultaneously, Third Battalion, Fifth Marines and BLT 1/26 manned blocking positions on Western GO NOI ISLAND and West of DODGE CITY respectively. Forces of the Second Brigade, ROKMC screened South of Eastern GO NOI ISLAND.

(5) The results of Phase I left ten enemy killed and 14 individual weapons captured. Units encountered many enemy surprise firing devices (SFD's), destroying most of them in place. There was no significant contact and only small sized enemy units were observed and taken under fire. Company "A", BLT 1/26 however, while digging in night ~~at the~~ ~~positions,~~ inserted an extensive ordnance cache consisting of many mortar and small arms rounds and about 75 Chicom grenades.

(6) D-Day of Phase II was the last day of May. Activity for that day accounted for an additional 13 enemy killed and seven weapons captured.

d. Operations also concentrated on efforts in coordination and cooperation with RVNAF to pacify hamlets and to capture and/or destroy VCI. On 8 May, Company "F", Second Battalion, First Marines with two companies of the Fourth Battalion, 51st Regiment (ARVN) and one platoon of PRUs, established a cordon and search of VIEM DONG resulting in seven

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VC suspects detained. On the 23rd, Golf Company, Second Battalion, First Marines with one platoon of NPFF's, conducted a cordon and deliberate, detailed search of VHEM TAY (1), resulting in the detention of six VC suspects.

Land Clearing Operations in the GAM NE (1) area were terminated on 17 May. The results for this operation included the destruction of seven bunkers, one fighting hole, ten trenches, four tunnels and an unknown number of SFD's. A total of 967,000 square meters were cleared.

2. ORGANIZATION:

a. On 10 May the Mobile Battalion (Third Battalion) CHOPped to First Marines after it had assisted the Seventh Marine Regiment in carrying out its mission since 26 April.

b. On 12 May the regular rotation of battalions commenced with Second Battalion assuming the mission of Mobile Battalion with its CP located at PHONG LUC (2), and Third Battalion assuming the mission of the Eastern AO with its CP located at CAU HA (1). The rotation was completed by noon on 16 May.

c. On 27 May, Company M, Third Battalion was CHOPped from Twenty-Sixth Marines back to First Marines.

d. On 29 May, the Regimental TAOR was realigned in preparation for the First Marines assuming operational responsibility for PIPESTONE CANYON. India Company relieved Bravo Company of the responsibility of CAU DO Bridge at this time.

e. The following day, Third Battalion, First Marines was given OPCON of Alpha Company, First Battalion, First Marines which had been OPCON to the Mobile Quick Reaction Task Force until this time. Alpha Company assumed control of HA DONG Bridge in the southwest sector of the TAOR and commenced day and night combat patrols and ambushes from Platoon Patrol Bases (PPB's) in the area.

f. On 30 May the Regimental CP displaced to the Mobile Battalion CP at PHONG LUC in preparation for Operation PIPESTONE CANYON. The Regimental Rear, however, remains at DUONG SON (2).

3. VISITS. VIP visits for the month included the Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Pacific Affairs, the Commanding General, First Marine Division, and the ADC of the First Marine Division.

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4. COMBAT SUPPORT OPERATIONS

a. Artillery

(1) Throughout the month of May the First Battalion, 11th Marines continued their assigned mission of providing direct support artillery for Marine and ARVN units operating within the TAOR. These fires were reinforced with fires from the 11th Marines General Support Batteries.

(2) A particularly successful technique of infantry cordon and close artillery coordination was achieved on 12-13 May, when Third Battalion, First Marines with ARVN units, established a cordon to contain and destroy enemy forces massed in the Western TAOR. The coordinated artillery-ground attack resulted in 103 VC/NVA KIA.

(3) The planning for the projected needs for Operation PIPESTONE CANYON was well underway in early May. Massed fire capability was planned to be available for supported units at any time, as well as normal prep and close support fires during the operation. A summary of artillery missions is as follows:

b. Naval Gunfire. The USS ST. PAUL (CA-73) fired in support of the First Marines during the month of May.

(2) Extensive planning and target selection was instituted during May for the employment of Naval Gunfire during Operation PIPESTONE CANYON, against prepared positions and enemy staging areas.

c. Air Support

(1) General. Maximum use of air support was programmed during the month of May. Operation PIPESTONE CANYON commenced on 25 May. Air

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support requirements for this operation was provided by 1st Marines only on 31st of May.

d. Psychological Operations.

(1) The Regiment has shown a marked increase in all phases of PsyOps over the previous month. The HB Team is a prime instrument in the targeting of the various audiences throughout the TAOR. It is used extensively to broadcast the rewards system and Pro-GVN themes. The main emphasis this past month has been to persuade the civilian populace to point out set SFD's. Immediate remuneration for this information is the reward.

(2) Supporting MedCaps and DentCaps with the HB and HE team has been highlighted this past month. The MedCaps and DentCaps are being scheduled on a more regular basis. The HB Team announces the offer to train villagers as corpsmen and nurses. Sanitation and Hygiene films were shown by the HE team and leaflets and posters on the same themes were distributed.

(3) Aerial broadcasts were conducted daily in one part or another of the TAOR. The themes were varied but mainly encompass Pre-GVN, Rewards, Chieu Hoi, and Sanitation with accompanying live broadcasts. Broadcasts were made regularly in support of all Civic Action projects especially on the New Life Village at Xuan Tra.

(4) The battalions were active in indoctrinating newly arrived Marines in PsyOps, Civic Action, and Vietnamese Religion and Customs. Personal Response teams were obtained from Division to assist in the indoctrination of the new troops.

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2. Reciprocal Training. During the month of May, the 2nd Battalion submitted a written request for ARVN Mobile Training Teams to conduct training in the following subjects: VC Patterns, ARVN Definition of VC Main Force and Local Force, and Vietnamese Culture. Direct liaison was made with the C-3 of the 51st Regt (ARVN) in an attempt to provide the requested training. The C.O. of the 51st Regt (ARVN) was enthusiastic over our request but regretted to inform us that Reciprocal Training during May would not be possible due to operational commitments. As soon as tactical situations with both units permits, the Reciprocal Training Program will commence.

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### 3. Marksmanship Training

#### a. Ranges utilized by First Marine Regiment.

(1) First Battalion, First Marine Regiment has a 1000 inch zero and FAM fire range for weapons up to .50 cal. size at AT987677. During the month of May, 312 Marines were trained on the range, totaling 54 hours.

(2) Second Battalion, First Marine Regiment has a 1000 inch and FAM fire range for weapons up to .50 cal. size at BT015633. During the month of May, 170 Marines were trained on the range,

(3) Third Battalion, First Marine Regiment has a 1000 inch zero and FAM fire range for weapons up to .50 cal. at BT075657. During the month of May, 206 Marines were trained on the range.

b. A 1000 inch/25 meter zero target for the M-16 was produced by the First Marines and sent out to all battalions for use specifically in areas where the platoons and companies work. It was accompanied by instructions to ensure that a proper zero could be obtained. The units operating in the field use the targets to zero their weapons once a week without having to come into an established range. Safety factors are strictly adhered to.

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1. SUPPLY-LOGISTICS. Normal supply point distribution was used throughout the month. FLC provided all classes of supplies. The Field Supply Analysis Team visited units of the 1st Marines during 8-13 May and 18-19 May. Purpose of this visit was to promote efficiency and economy by observing and reporting upon the condition and readiness of the supply units to fulfill their mission, to determine whether regulations are being complied with, and to render assistance and guidance through the medium of an analysis of supply procedures and operations. Ratings are not assigned however; reports of the analysis of each unit are submitted to the Commandant of the Marine Corps. Attendance at Division G-3 and G-4 planning conferences was made in early May for Operation PIPSTONE CANYON. Liaison was effected with FLC and FSR representatives and the S-4, 7th Marines, as initial guidance was received that the 7th Marines engaged in Operation OKLAHOMA HILLS would continue to run the Hill 55 LSA. Initial planning conferences at Division G-3 and G-4 were attended. Briefings were held throughout the month on the concept of the operation and the intended Logistic Support for Division, BOK Marine Corps and ARVN Commanders and their staffs. On 29 May the Commanding Officer, 1st Marine Regiment assumed responsibility for the Hill 55 LSA as the 7th Marines secured their operation that date. Operations continued for the remainder of the month and resupply was made to 1st Battalion and 2d Battalion, 1st Marines and 1st Battalion, Twenty-sixth Marines. Third Battalion, Fifth Marines elected to continue to receive their support from AN HOA Combat Base LSA. Concept of resupply and Logistics Support was extremely simple. Each day prior to 1500 individual battalions radioed their resupply requests to their own representative in the Hill 55 Logistic Support Area LOC. Battalion Supply personnel then drew their supplies, staged their loads and were ready for the next day's resupply. Upon arrival of helicopter and request for resupply, the rotary wing craft then brought out passengers and supplies and removed retrograde items and troops. During the period 29-30-31 May, while in support of 3 infantry battalions, our resupply effort effected 25 lifts, carried 96 passengers and 40,830 lbs of cargo.

2. TRANSPORTATION. Motor transport support was excellent throughout the month of May. The 5-ton truck and trailer provided by 11th Motor Transport Battalion three days a week has greatly enhanced the pickup and delivery of supplies and equipment for units of this command. Additional 5-ton trucks also provided by 11th MTBn to deploy and relocate units of this command greatly facilitated operational commitments. Three 2½-ton trucks from 1st Medical Battalion and one 5-ton truck from 11th MTBn during latter-May ere also a great assist for utilization by the S-5 in their civic action program. The eighteen 2½-ton trucks from 1st Motor Transport Battalion in direct support of the 1st Marines were utilized to their maximum.

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3. MAINTENANCE AND ENGINEER ASSISTANCE

a. Engineer effort and assistance during May were excellent. A Regimental Briefing Room was constructed and became operational. Over 2,000 T-shaped probing rods were fabricated and readied for distribution for units engaged in Operation FIREFSTONE CANYON. Requests for the paving of Routes 13C and 12E were submitted. The Regimental S-4 Officer attended the Division Base Development Board Meeting and discussed all major engineering projects of concern to the 1st Marines.

b. Equipment maintenance was provided by 1stFSR. The table depicts the number of Tactical Equipment Repair Orders submitted and completed during May.

4. EMBARKATION. All commands continued to improve embarkation procedures. Division Embarkation printed new decks of card 1 and card 3 MEDS cards for all units.

5. SANITATION. Sanitation in the Regimental Command Post and all combat bases remained excellent. Regular inspections and continual supervision keep sanitation problems to a minimum.

6. MEDICAL. During the month of May, medical facilities were maintained throughout the Regimental TAOR, each holding routine sick call twice daily and giving emergency treatment to those needing it. The medical facilities were manned by a total of 8 Medical Officers, 3 Dental Officers, 159 Corpsman and 3 Dental Techs. The following is a breakdown of the patient load seen during the month of May 1969.

CIVIL AFFAIRS-CIVIC ACTIONS

1. PUBLIC WORKS

a. The vast majority of the S-5's effort has been spent in securing building supplies for the hamlets at BINH KY (BT050697), XUAN TRA (BT 064676), and QUANG CHAU (AT 998687). The resettlement hamlet at XUAN TRA is now almost half completed (36 homes have now been erected). During the past month a total of over 40 truck loads of wood have been hauled to these three hamlets. The working parties for these projects are Vietnamese and the trucks and supervision are provided by the S-5. We have been able to make considerable progress on the above named projects during this month, largely due to the salvage lumber made available from the Freedom Hill complex. Continuation of these salvage runs is planned for the next few weeks.

b. Ten sheets of tin have been provided to each family in the hamlets by HOA YANG district. Cement is being provided on an as available basis by 1st Marines.

2. WELFARE

a. Three thousand pounds of food and two thousand and fifty pounds of clothing were distributed to the civilians throughout the TAOR.

3. EDUCATION

a. During this past month one hundred and fifty school kits were distributed to schools in our area.

b. The Bo De school at VIEM TAY (BT034640) is presently nearing completion. This project consists of a three room concrete structure; the material for which, has been provided entirely by the Marines and all labor contributed by the people of VIEM TAY. An appropriate dedication ceremony is planned for the opening of the school. This should occur within the next month.

c. The hamlet TAN AN (BT090690) now has an active school run by the Revolutionary Development Team in that hamlet. S-5 has contributed school kits for each of the 100 students of the school. Plans are now being drawn up to assist in the construction of a small school for this hamlet.

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d. Also our General WAIT Scholarship program, consisting of 137 scholarships, was brought to a successful conclusion with the ending of the last month of the present school year. Plans are being made for expansion of this program during the next school year beginning in September.

4. HEALTH

a. Med-Caps by all the battalions and the regimental medical teams treated 3,795 people. The number of people treated and the quality of their treatment is considered noteworthy.

b. Weekly Dent-Caps are continuing to be conducted by battalion and regimental medical teams.

5. AGRICULTURE

a. Large amounts of vegetable seeds were distributed to the inhabitants of QUANG CHAU and XUAM TRA. This part of a GVN program aimed at diversifying the agricultural production of the DA NANG area. These products will substantially improve the diet of the local people.

b. The IR-8 rice which was planted during the last month is now being transferred from the seed bed to the field and seems to be doing quite well.

c. Several pig projects are planned for the future in 1st Marines TAOR. These projects are dependent, however, upon G-5 procuring the pigs which have been requested by this unit.

6. SOCIAL

a. The Civil Affairs program in 1st Marines TAOR is now reaching more people and is actively assisting more projects than at any time in the past. This assistance has alleviated much of the suffering and hardship caused by military operations in heavily populated areas. But most importantly, our program continues to assist the people in building a sound economic and social environment upon which future progress can be based.

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7. SOLATIUM PAYMENTS

- a. During the past month 1st Marines has paid 26,000\$VN in Solatium Payments to 9 persons for personal or property damage caused by combat related activities within the MAOR.
- b. These payments reduce the immediate suffering of the people involved and effectively demonstrates the concern for the local population.

COMMUNICATIONS

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1. During the month of May 1969, the 1st Marines Communication Platoon continued to provide radio, telephone (Integrated Landlines and Radio Relay), and teletype circuits from Doung Son (2) Combat Base to the 1st Marine Division and the 2nd Battalion and the 3rd Battalion. The Communication Center maintained COMM/CRYPTO Guard for the 1st Battalion. Telephone circuits were maintained to the 7th Marines, 1/11, and its ALPHA, BRAVO, CHARLIE Batteries; 1st Tanks, ALPHA/1st Engineers, Hoa Vang Sub-District Headquarters, and 1/51 ARVN. The Platoon also provided Communications for Operation PIPESTONE CANYON.
2. Emphasis during May was twofold. First improvement of Intra-Regimental Communications with the laying of a new twenty-five pair cable. The new cable will give more dependable telephone communication from the Regiment to the Battalions. The second was in preparation and planning for "PIPESTONE CANYON".
3. On May 16th planning for communication support of Operation PIPESTONE CANYON commenced. Additional personnel and equipment requirements were submitted to the Division CEO and on 21 May direct liaison with 7th and 5th Communication Battalions was authorized. By 24 May all participating Battalion Communication Officers were briefed. Installation of communications facilities for the 1st Marines ALPHA CP, at the 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines CP, commenced 29 May and was completed on 31 May.
4. The main area of concern during May continued to be providing power to operate Radio Relay and Radio equipment. 400 cycle Generators or Converters, and 24volt Rectifiers are difficult to obtain.
