





- d. Will the enemy reinforce the objective area with Hard Core units, local or paramilitary forces? If so, to what extent, type of unit(s) and in what strength?
- e. Will the enemy defend the objective area? If so, in what strength?
- f. Determine if the Viet Cong and/or civil populace will employ booby-traps and/or mines. If so, to what extent, type and how employed.
- g. Will local forces withdraw in force from the objective area, leaving only small groups of guerrillas for harassment and infiltration tactics?
- h. Determine if DAGGER THRUST operations in the target area have a significant effect on the political, sociological, and economic attitude of the populace. If so, what effect and to what extent?
- i. Determine whether DAGGER THRUST operation has been compromised and advance notice received by the Viet Cong.

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3. RECONNAISSANCE AND OBSERVATION MISSIONS

- (d) Information on the availability of ITT teams and interrogators.
- (e) Aerial photographs, vertical and obliques of the objective area.
- (f) The latest weather forecast and tidal data.

4. MEASURES FOR HANDLING PRISONERS, CAPTURED DOCUMENTS, AND CAPTURED MATERIAL

- a. Responsibility and coordination. - The S-1, in coordination with the S-2, S-4, and Headquarters Commandant, is responsible for the collection, safeguarding, administrative processing, utilization, treatment and discipline of all prisoners of war (POW). The S-1 will notify all companies and attached units of the Battalion POW Collection Point (POW Compound). Unless Interrogation Translation Teams (ITT) are attached, the S-2 will conduct all interrogation of POWs.

B-2

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- b. Personnel considered as POWs.—POWs include enemy military personnel, home guards, hostile civilians, deserters, diplomatic personnel and any other individuals who demonstrate hostility to the point of impeding the accomplishment of the mission. While operations are in progress, all captured personnel, regardless of connection with the hostile forces, will be considered POWs until determination is made of their status by higher headquarters.
- c. The Five S's.—All units of this Battalion will adhere to the "Five S's" when in contact with or handling POWs. The five steps are: SEARCH, SEGREGATE, SILENCE, SPED (to the rear), and SAFEGUARD.
- d. Purpose of standard POW handling methods.—All except the most hardened soldiers experience a certain amount of shock during battle contact with the enemy. Usually this shock is increased upon capture. Instructions for handling POWs are designed to keep them in this state of shock until their interrogation begins.
- e. Immediate processing by capturing unit.—This phase of POW handling is one of the most important because POWs have an inherent capability to furnish information that may bear directly on the capturing unit's mission. Initial processing should be such as to maintain the POWs state of shock.
- (1) Disarming.—Immediately upon capture, the initial concern is with complete and thorough disarming. All items of any type which give the POW a capability of taking his own life, or another's life, should be removed.
 - (2) Documents.—While the disarming is of prime importance items of possible intelligence information must not be overlooked. All items (papers, documents, notebooks, cigarette packs, etc.) should be taken from the POW immediately so that he will not have the opportunity to destroy or dispose of anything.
 - (3) Reporting.—All organizations/units must report the capture of POWs through the S-1 as soon as possible; to include all attachments.
 - (4) Search.
 - (a) At the capturing level everything will be taken from the POW except the minimum necessary clothing.
 - (b) Generally, methods of search will be governed by the circumstances surrounding the capture. In the case

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of a large number of POWs, they may be instructed to place everything in a pile in front of them; for a few, the search should be conducted by an unarmed man while armed men stand guard. Everything taken from the POW should be placed in a container (empty ration box, knapsack, etc.), bundled together and marked or tagged to identify it with the owner. Care should be taken to avoid defacing captured documents. Notations should NOT be made on the documents themselves.

- (5) Tagging.—The POW and his possessions must be tagged. Captured units will use the standard POW tag for personnel and the document envelope for documents. (See Figures 5 and 6 of reference (4))
- (6) Segregation.—One of the purposes of segregation is to keep the POWs in the same state of shock as when captured. Another is to deny their leaders an opportunity to organize active or passive resistance to their captors. Normally, placing POWs back to back in pairs and enforcing silence is adequate segregation until interrogation commences. If possible, after completing the search and tagging, POWs should be segregated into the following groups.
 - (a) Military by rank (officers, NCOs, privates)
 - (b) Deserters
 - (c) Civilians (guerrillas).
 - (d) Females
 - (e) Political indoctrination personnel.
 - (f) Friendly evaders and/or escapers.
- (7) Silence.—Silence between individual prisoners will be maintained at ALL times. The combat situation will dictate the methods used (such as distance between prisoners). Guards will not talk to POWs except to give them orders. Guards will not converse with each other within hearing of the POWs.
- (8) Safeguard.—From the moment of capture, POWs will be guarded. Enough guards must be assigned to prevent the possibility of escape. One guard should be detailed to follow behind, being alert to prisoners attempting to discard or conceal any item of information.

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(9) Movement to Battalion.—Unless circumstances dictate otherwise, the capturing unit provides guards and transportation, as needed, to move POWs to the rear. Returning patrols, reserves, walking wounded, etc, should be considered for use as guards.

(a) Speed is essential, otherwise the intelligence value of POWs will be negated.

(b) Care should be taken to insure that POW evacuation routes do not pass through or in the near vicinity of tactical installations.

(c) POWs should not receive any aid or comfort items, other than minimum medical aid if necessary. Items such as food, water, cigarettes, and head privileges will not be given to POWs by the capturing unit unless prolonged retention is required.

(10) POW treatment.—Capturing personnel must strictly enforce orders to POWs. Violators should be dealt with quickly and severely within the limits of the Geneva Convention and human decency. POWs attempting to escape may be shot. However, this extreme measure should be used after all other reasonable attempts at recapture have failed and after appropriate warnings are issued in each circumstance. Accomplishment of the mission will never be subordinate to, or jeopardized by, consideration of POW welfare.

f. Battalion Processing.—The Battalion serves as a collecting point for POWs captured within the Battalion area of responsibility. Normally, this is the first echelon at which interrogation may be conducted. Unless IIT are attached, interrogation at this echelon will be limited and concerned only with developing information of immediate tactical value.

(1) Processing.

(a) POWs will be searched once again.

(b) If segregation by rank, sex, etc, has not been accomplished, POWs will be segregated at this time. This segregation will be maintained throughout evacuation to rear areas. Silence will be strictly maintained.

(c) S-2 personnel will check POW tags, document notation and captured equipment tags to insure completeness of information and that documents and material are pro-

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properly associated with the prisoners from whom they were taken.

(2) Battalion POW Collection Point.—The Battalion POW Collection Point will be established in the proximity of the Battalion OP, with regard to the accessibility of evacuation routes to the ARVN Junk Force. When established it,

- (a) Relieves the capturing units of guard responsibility after the S-2 has debriefed the POW guards. (Before escorting the prisoners to the Battalion Collecting Point, guards should be made aware of the time, place and circumstances of capture, as well as the identification of the capturing unit, down to the squad level.)
- (b) Conserve guard personnel by concentrating prisoners.
- (d) Provides facilities for interrogators/translators when assigned.

(3) Evacuation.—The Battalion has the responsibility for establishing the evacuation of POWs to the rear, to the ARVN Junk Force. In the event the Junk Force is not available to accept POWs, all POWs will be retained by PLT.

g. Refugees.

(1) Infiltrators.—During the course of military operations, elements of this Battalion may encounter large groups of civilian refugees. The enemy may be expected to use refugee columns for the insertion of agents, saboteurs and guerrillas. To the extent permitted by the situation, units will attempt to screen all civilians to identify those who are not bonafide refugees. Civilians so identified will be removed and treated as POWs.

(2) S-2 Responsibilities.—Although the handling and processing of refugees is not an S-2 function, S-2 assists and advises in maintaining security and in preventing refugee interference with military operations. Further, if feasible, S-2 will exploit the refugees as a source of information.

(3) Refugee Control.—Large groups of civilians in refugee columns cannot be treated as POWs; however, commanders whose lines they have passed through must take certain precautions. Specific instructions, including routes, medical aid, and processing information will be issued in appropriate Operation and Administrative Order. The Battalion will maintain refugee control points when necessary, and to the extent permitted by the situation, will screen all refugees for weapons, large numbers of persons of military age, persons

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carrying large amounts of money, or any other suspicious condition. Those persons appearing as other than bonafide refugees will be removed and treated as POWs until their status is determined by higher headquarters.

h. Captured Documents.

(1) Sources.—The primary sources of captured enemy documents are:

- (a) Captured enemy CPs and other installations.
- (b) POWs, both military and civilian.
- (c) Enemy dead.
- (d) Captured material.

(2) Disposition.—All captured enemy documents, regardless of source, will be immediately turned in to, or placed under the cognizance of, the S-2. Such items as name plates, operating manuals, gun books, or blueprints should be tagged and left attached to equipment they have been captured with. The disposition of such equipment will be covered in paragraph i., below. It should be noted that captured documents are the property of the United States, and appropriation for personal use is strictly forbidden. Documents will be forwarded through the intelligence chain utilizing the standard documents envelope as shown in Figure 5 of reference (h), which will be provided.

(3) Regulations Concerning Various Sources.

- (a) In the event that a POW is the source of the document, the document must be identified with the POW, and the circumstances of the capture, including capturing unit, date-time group, and location of capture must be noted.
- (b) When counting enemy dead left on the battlefield, units will routinely search the bodies for documents or other material of intelligence value.
- (c) When captured intact or partly intact, enemy CPs, installations, government offices or similar activities will not be disturbed, investigated, or inventoried by the capturing unit. The battalion will give notice of the capture of such installations to higher headquarters by the most expedient means available. Pending receipt of instructions in this regard, physical security of the captured installation will be established and maintained by this organization.

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- (d) Upon capture of terrain upon which an enemy CP was formerly located, units will routinely search the area for documents which might have been overlooked in withdrawing from the site.
- (e) Documents captured at electronics installations or sites will not be separated from the equipment unless recapture is imminent. Such documents and equipment will be placed under guard and Battalion will notify higher headquarters by the fastest possible SECURE means.
- (f) Under NO circumstances will any unit or organization use plain language transmission to report capture of enemy communications documents and security material.

1. Captured Material and Equipment.

- (1) Responsibilities.—The S-4, in coordination with the S-2, is responsible for the disposition of all captured enemy material and weapons. In cases involving communications equipment, the S-4 will coordinate with the Communications Officer and the S-2 concerning its disposition.
- (2) Disposition.
 - (a) All captured equipment will be tagged with the standard captured equipment tag. (See Figure 7 of reference (h))
 - (b) Reports of capture will be made to the S-2, including time, location, circumstances of capture, capturing unit, and equipment description whenever evacuation of the equipment is not feasible, or is prohibited by this or other orders.
 - (c) If practicable, weapons captured from POWs are evacuated with the prisoner's other belongings.
 - (d) Reports of frequency settings on captured radios or radar transmitters and receivers will be classified SECRET and forwarded through the intelligence chain within this Battalion, and from this Battalion to higher headquarters, by the fastest SECURE means available. (From companies, this will normally require a runner with the requisite security clearance.)
 - (e) Captured or crashed enemy aircraft will be reported immediately. The capturing unit will provide necessary guards until relieved by competent authority.

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- (f) The removal of name plates, manufacturers identifying marks, or other special markings of captured enemy material and equipment is prohibited.
- (g) In case of new, unusual, or different types of weapons, or material, every effort should be made to place such material under the cognizance of the S-2, either by evacuation, or by notification and guarding, as noted above.
- (h) In the event of imminent recapture, however, Commanders are responsible for the destruction of enemy material in the custody of their unit/organization.
- (i) If material is destroyed, a report listing amount, description, location, date, and destroying unit should be forward to the S-2.

(3) Emergency Utilization.—No provisions set forth herein should be construed to prohibit the use of captured material or weapons when required by tactical situation.

J. Salvage and Retention.

(1) Requests.—All captured material becomes the property of the UNITED STATES and appropriation thereof is strictly prohibited. Individuals WILL not retain any item (captured or unclaimed) of enemy material, documents or equipment for souvenirs.

(2) Security.—Every individual in this organization will take steps that captured weapons, equipment, and material does not fall into dissident hands, either military or civilian.

5. MAPS, CHARTS AND PHOTOGRAPHS.

- a. See Appendix 3 (Map Distribution). Maps will be issued prior to D-Day by this Headquarters (S-2).
- b. Request for photographs will be coordinated by this Headquarters (S-2).

6. COUNTERINTELLIGENCE

- a. Reference (b) applies
- b. Military Security

(1) All units will have an effective EMERGENCY DESTRUCTION PLAN, to be used in the event of capture for any material that

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is classified and/or material that would aid the enemy in obtaining information concerning this unit's identification, strength, and operations.

- (2) Personnel security is a continuing factor in combat situations. All units will pay particular attention to:
 - (a) Front-line coordination, especially during the hours of darkness.
 - (b) Instruction in the Code of Conduct.
 - (c) Use of Challenge and Password.
 - (d) Unit Commander will ensure that personnel participating in operations ashore carry only the very minimum personal property ashore. Specific items which should not be carried ashore are: money, personal mail, photographs of any type, liberty cards (or any document which could identify a unit) or any items that could be used for barter or negotiation to obtain funds or property.
 - (e) Prisoner handling.
 - (f) Due to the unique nature of DAGGER THRUST Operation, maximum security protection must be afforded the mission, composition of forces, and types of targets engaged.

c. Civil Security.

- (1) Check points established to control the flow of civil populace within the objective area.
- (2) The Civil Affairs officer and the S-2 will coordinate the action taken concerning the handling, interrogation, and disposition of all local populace entering the objective area of the VLT (See Administrative Order 202-65).
- (3) Civilians entering or leaving the VLT objective area through check points or picked up in the VLT objective area will be:
 - (a) Searched for arms, ammunition, medical supplies. All material will be taken, tagged and turned over to the S-2.
 - (b) Carrying identification. Papers will be checked.

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d. Challenge and Password.

- (1) The Challenge and Password will be effective from H-hour on D-Day to 2359 hours on D-Day, at which time the new Challenge and Password will go into effect.
- (2) When compromise of the password is suspected, the unit having original knowledge of the compromise will place the alternate in effect and immediately notify this Headquarters.

Time Zone: H

1. MISSION

- a. LT 2/1 conducts amphibious raid on Wung Mu Peninsula commencing at H and L Hours on D-Day landing over and in designated beaches and helicopter landing zones. Search for, capture or destroyed all VC personnel and material in zone of action, Conducts withdrawal within 48 hours.
- b. This estimate is promulgated to furnish units with intelligence data as to the enemy, weather, and terrain and other items of concern in the objective area.

2. CHARACTERISTICS OF THE AREA OF OPERATIONS

- a. Weather.—The weather will be affected by the southwest monsoons during September and October. The area of operation falls within northern coastlands weather pattern, which receives most of the rainfall during the month of October. (about 80%) the autumn transition period. Sudden tropical thunderstorms, of short duration occurs mainly during the afternoon period. Five or more consecutive days of clear weather should not be expected. A crashin condition (a period of widespread fog and drizzle) may appear during the month of October. Ceilings under 1,000 feet (frequently below 500 feet). The annual cloud coverage is sixty-five percent (65%). Humidity during the period normally will be in the high seventies to low eighties with the temperatures during mid-day in the 90s. Surface winds are from the southwest quadrant. Along portions of the coast protected from the prevailing winds, the land and sea breezes have their major effect, sometimes reversing the monsoonal air flow at lower levels. The sea breeze is at it's maximum during early afternoon and ceases about sunset. (See Tab A for Astronomical Data)
- b. Terrain.—The objective consists of an irregular boot shaped peninsula approximately 9 miles long ranging in width from .3 miles to 2 miles wide. The peninsula can be isolated from the mainland at it's northwestern extremity. The mainland beach

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area is bordered by National Route #1 which in turn skirts the beach area at the base of a hill mass that extends inland. Heavily vegetated sand dunes rising to heights of 10 meters are prevalent from CR 087088 to CR 153008. Approximately 3/4 of the peninsula is composed of sand dunes. The southern portion contains rocky hills that descend steeply to the flat lowland agricultural areas which fringes most of the island bay side of the peninsula. These hills range from 24 meters at the southern tip of the peninsula to 158 meters approximately 3 miles to the north (CR 130000). The southern area contains lowland agricultural areas and sand dunes on the extreme southern portion of the peninsula.

c. Hydrography.

(1) NIS Beach #28.

(a) Location: Centered 4 miles northwest of Mui Ke Ga, between CR 081085 to CR 145008.

(b) Length: 6.75 miles long, concave beach terminated by rocky headlands; all usable.

(c) Width: 30 to 80 yards at low water; 15 to 40 yards at high water.

(d) Beach Gradients: Low water to high water; 1:10 to 1:25. High water zone, 1:10 or steeper.

(e) Approach: Nearshore bottom slopes steep to gently shoreward of discontinuous 18 foot depth contour 50 to 440 yards off high water line; 36 foot depth contour 200 to 750 yards off high water line; off shore approach partly obstructed by island, a few inlets, and coral bank with least depth of 25 feet, all about 2.25 to 5 nautical miles off southeast end of beach; near shore approach partly obstructed by rocks and reef patches 1,200 yards off southeast part of beach and flanked by rocky headlands; bottom sand; anchorage in 60 foot depth 1,000 yards off southeast end of beach; anchorage bottom unknown.

(f) Surf and Tidal Range: Surf 4 feet or greater can be expected to occur 51% of the time in winter, 17% in spring, 6% in summer and 24% in fall; tidal range 4.5 feet, tropic.

(g) Material and Firmness: Sand; firm in wetted area, soft where dry.

(h) Terrain immediately behind beach: Beach backed by mostly barren dunes extending 500 yards to 1.25 miles across peninsula behind northwest 3/4 of beach and 1,000 yards inland to wooded hills.

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- (1) Exits and Communications Inland: Exit cross country or by trail leading north and west from northwest end of beach; trail connects with surfaced coastal road 1.5 to 3.5 miles behind beach.
- (2) NIS 15
 - (a) Location: Centered 1,000 yards west of Mue Ke Ga at CR 155002.
 - (b) Length: 700 yards; slightly concave, sand beach.
 - (c) Width: 65 to 145 yards wide at Low Water and 30 to 65 yards wide at High Water.
 - (d) Approach: Offshore approach clear; near shore approach clear but flanked by rocky headlands; anchorage in 16 foot depth in bay three nautical miles south of beach; anchorage bottom mud.
 - (e) Terrain immediately behind the beach: Beach backed by partly brush-covered dunes flanked by wooded hills and extending 630 yards northwest across peninsula; village 450 yards behind northeast end of beach.
 - (f) Exits and Communications Inland: Exit cross country.
- (5) NIS 16 Vung Mu Area
 - (a) Location: Centered 1.5 miles southwest of Mue Ke Ga, at CQ 142989.
 - (b) Length: 650 yards; slightly concave; sand beach.
 - (c) Width: 80 to 95 yards wide at Low Water; 30 to 65 yards wide at High Water.
 - (d) Approach: Offshore approach clear; near shore approach clear but flanked by rocky headlands; anchorage in 16 foot depth in bay 2.25 miles south of beach; anchorage bottom, mud.
 - (e) Terrain immediately behind the beach: Beach located on peninsula and backed by cultivated low-land extending 75 yards inland across peninsula to bay.
 - (f) Exits and Communications: Exit cross-country.

d. Politics.--The political organization in the area of operations falls within the Song-Cau District in the Province Phu Yeh.

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Within the district structure is the village of Xuan Loc with a Liberation Front Committee. The village area encompasses the entire area of operations. Hamlets within the village are administered by either Administrative Section or by the Village Liberation Front Committee. Both of these organizations are Viet Cong Political/Military Cells. The Front Committee, originally in Phuoc Loc Village (vicinity of BR 985335), is now operating in Xuan Loc Village. (See Appendix 4, Black List Personnel).

- e. Economics.--Fishing and rice are the main industries with small areas of cultivation (other than rice) in the area of operations. Wood cutters (producers of charcoal) make up a minor group of peasants. Communications into the area are mainly National Route #1 (runs north and south), local fishing junks and the foot trails for cross country movement.

3. ENEMY SITUATION:

- a. Composition.-- The Cong Cau District Force has one company with a Code name: 4-60. This company consists of four (4) platoons with the company strength of approximately 140 men. In addition there are approximately 175 guerrillas operating in the area.
- b. Disposition.-- One of the F-60 company areas of operation is in the village of Xuan Loc (possibly 2 platoons, 50 men). Squad and platoon operations 10-20 guerrillas, have been reported moving between the hamlets of Tuy Phuong 7 (1) (CR 075085) and Thach Kho (CR 043055) on several occasions during the month of September.
- c. Arms and Ammunition.-- Approximately one third (1/3) of the Song Cau District Force is armed with individual weapons. In addition, the company is equipped with a 60mm mortar, 4 BAR'S and one .30 cal. machine gun, 5 CHICOM 7.92mm rifles, and 2 SMG's (type and caliber unknown).
- d. Reinforcements.-- There are no known organized units capable of reinforcing the objective area within 30 kilometer radius. The 50th Local Force Battalion has been reported operating somewhere in the southern portion of Binh Dinh province. There have been unconfirmed reports of a possible 81st Local Force Battalion (approximately 400 men) operating in southern Phu Yen Province.
- e. Peculiarities and Weaknesses.--The enemy has the means of movement by small junk, as a method of communication, resupply and troop movement, both to our front and rear area. Within the area controlled by the enemy, communication methods are primitive, (smoke, runners, pounding trees with bamboo) but effective.

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4. ENEMY CAPABILITIES

a. Enumeration.

- (1) Maintain widespread guerrilla tactics by using groups of 4 to 10 men for harassment.
- (2) Withdraw active guerrilla bands from the objective area, into the headlands to the west and north.
- (3) Defend objective with present force.
- (4) Reinforce objective with up to one Local Force battalion and an unknown number of guerrillas.

b. Analysis and Discussion.

- (1) The probability of the enemy to maintain a defense of the objective area, either in force or with force locally available is unlikely for three major reasons:
 - (a) The terrain does not favor enemy holding action.
 - (b) The proximity of friendly forces to the north could close escape routes and limit guerrilla tactics and open control of the local population.
 - (c) Contrary to known VC tactics.

5. CONCLUSIONS

a. Relative probability of adoption of enemy capabilities

- (1) Maintain the use of 4-10 man guerrilla bands throughout the objective area.
- (2) Withdraw active guerrilla bands from the objective area.
- (3) Defend objective area with present force.
- (4) Reinforce the objective area with Local Force units or guerrillas.

b. Effect of enemy capabilities on the mission.

- (1) The probability of adoption by the enemy of capability (1), (2) or (3) will not alter the accomplishment of the mission.
- (2) Capability (4) will delay the accomplishment of the mission.



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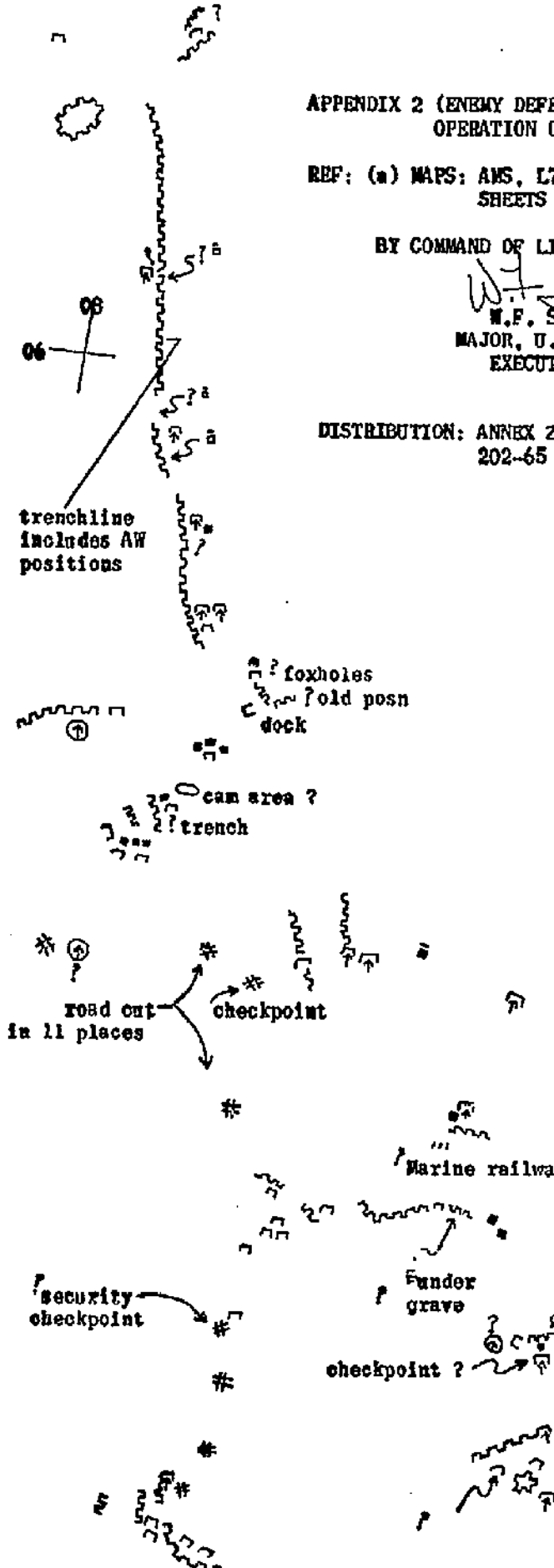

BLACK LIST PERSONALITIES

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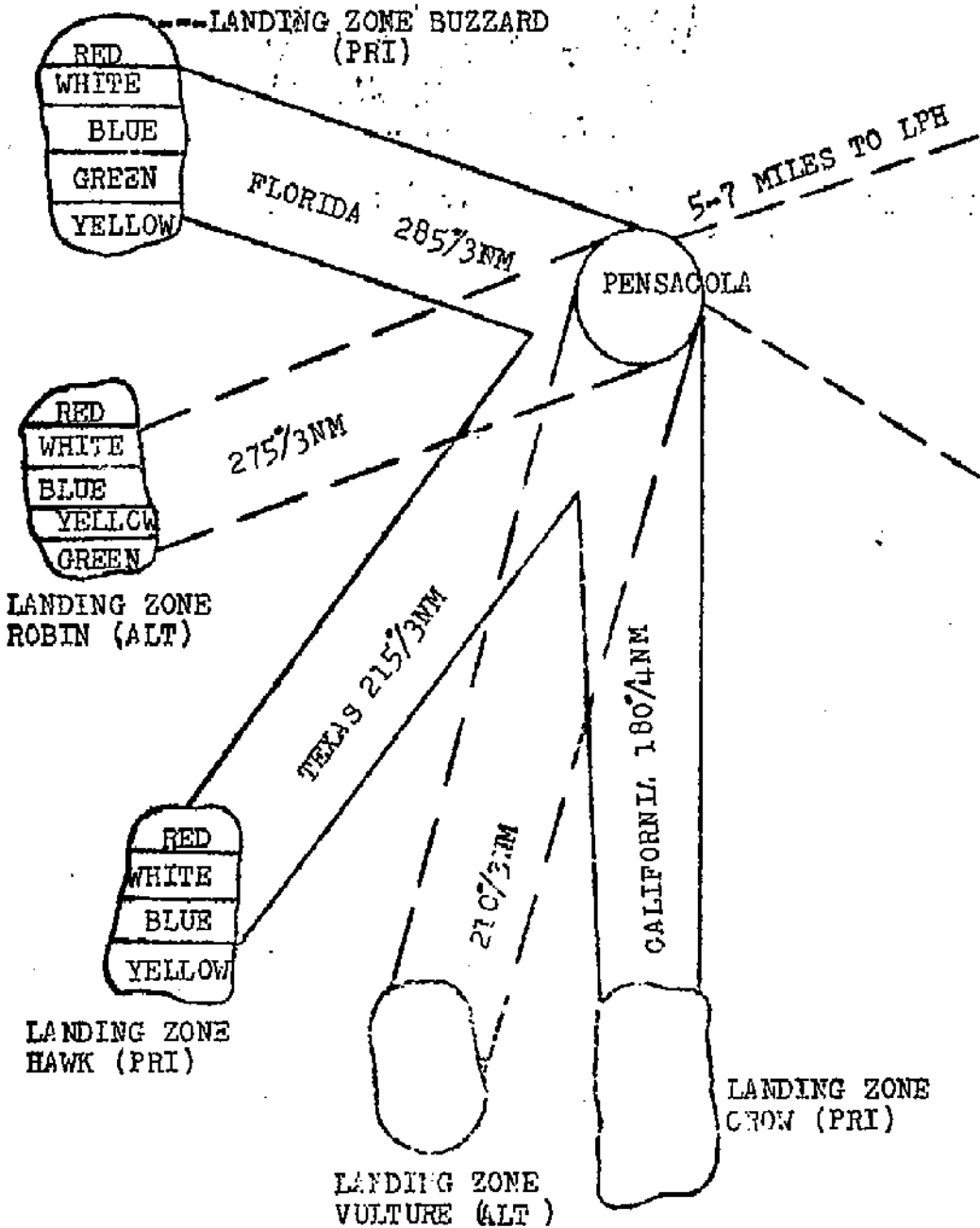

- b. Prevailing wind direction will be shown by installing a short pole (approximately 3 Ft) with streamers, flag or pennants of sufficient length to allow the pilot to see the local wind direction.
- c. Once the helicopter point has been established with the triangle the type and size of the unit will be identified as follows.

- (1) Type of unit. Identified by one or more panels in the center of the triangle.

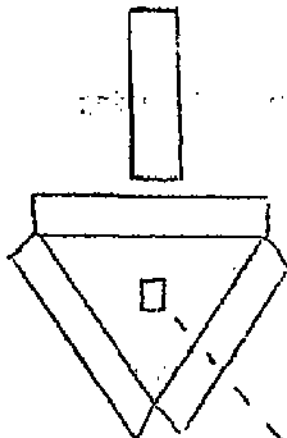
- (3) Upon receiving an air raid warning/alert, the helicopter landing point display will be removed without delay.
- (4) Marking of Night Landing Points. The boundaries of all points used for night operations should be marked with at least four low intensity lights on the outer perimeter of the point, the complete area between the lights must be suitable for landing.
- (5) Care must be exercised in securing panels to the ground to prevent destruction of the displays each time helicopters land or take off.

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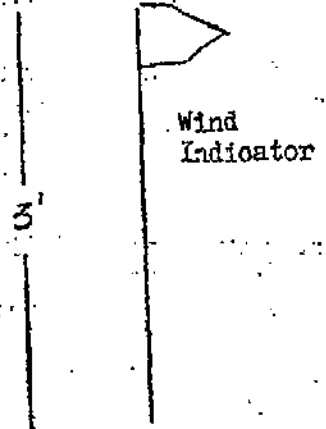





1. GENERAL

- a. Nothing shall infringe on the inherent right of the individual Marine to defend himself against hostile attack. In the event of such an attack, the individual concerned may take immediate aggressive action against the attacking force with any means available.
- b. In cases where defensive fire is undertaken, care will be exercised to insure that friendly or innocent personnel are not endangered.
- c. In a situation where light fire is received from a populated area, effort will be made to identify the exact target before engagement.

2. RULES OF ENGAGEMENT

- a. Unit Commanders may direct fire when:
 - (1) They observe and positively identify a person or persons as enemy.
 - (2) Fire is being delivered on friendly troops.
 - (3) Personnel are attempting, by hasty or suspicious acts, obviously to avoid contact with friendly forces.
 - (4) Requested to fire by friendly Vietnamese Commanders after approval from appropriate RVNAF Officials.
- b. Troop indoctrination briefings will be held before each operation to emphasize the importance of minimizing non-combatant battle casualties.
- c. Troops should also be indoctrinated in that:
 - (1) They are guests of the Vietnamese and should act as such.
 - (2) They should join with the people and try to help them in any way they can.
 - (3) They should be polite to the Vietnamese women and children.
 - (4) They should make friends with their Vietnamese counterparts.

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- (5) They should be alert at all times.
- (6) They should give the Vietnamese the right of way whenever they are driving a vehicle.
- (7) They should not be loud and boisterous.
- (8) They should not ostentatiously show money when in the company of Vietnamese.
- (9) They should reflect honor on themselves and their country at all times.
