TESS BARRETT

COHASSET

Barrett had a terrific junior campaign as she tallied 43 goals and 29 assists to earn South Shore League Most Valuable Player. A star since her freshman year, Barrett is a three-time SSL MVP and already Cohasset's all-time scoring champion with 97 goals to go with 67 assists. Barrett holds a commitment to the University of Maryland and is set to be one of the state's top players in 2024.

LAUREN BOUGHNER

MASCONOMET
