Pope Benedict Not Changing Catholic Teaching on Condoms

A forthcoming book "Light of the World: the Pope, the Church and the Signs of the Times" by Peter Seewald is generating significant buzz because it reportedly has the Pope significantly changing Church teaching on the usage of condoms.

In the book, Pope Benedict XVI says the Catholic Church "of course" does not regard condom usage as the "real or moral solution" to the problem of AIDS.

But book says the Pope indicates there may be an "exceptional situation" when using condoms may be appropriate, such as cases of sexual intercourse that may threaten the life of another person because of a transmis-

sion of a potentially deadline sexual disease. That might justify their usage in instances such as male prostitutes using them to stop the spread of HIV.

"There may be a basis in the case of some individuals, as perhaps when a male prostitute uses a condom, where this can be a first step in the direction of a moralization, a first assumption of responsibility, on the way toward discovering an awareness that not everything is allowed and that one cannot do whatever one wants," the Pontiff said.

"But it is not really the way to deal with the evil of HIV infection. That can really lie only in a humanization of sexuality," Benedict added.

Obama Admin Okays Second Trial of Embryonic-Like Stem Cells in Humans

The Obama administration today approved the second trial involving the use of human embryonic-derived stem cells on patients despite significant problems in animal studies.

Advanced Cell Technology, a cloning and stem cell research firm, received approval from the Food and Drug Administration to use derivatives of embryonic stem cells in patients with Stargardt disease, a rare eye disease than can lead to

blindness.

The approval for the California firm to move forward comes one month after the FDA approved a request from Geron Corporation to try embryonic-like cells in patients with spinal cord injuries.

The new trials will also involve healthy scavenger cells, created in a laboratory from human embryonic stem cells but that are not embryonic stem cells. Embryonic stem cells still can't be used because they cause significant problems such as tumor formation and are rejected by the immune system when injected into animals in studies. ACT indicates 12 patients will receive the treatments.

"We're also hoping to see some improvement in visual acuity, but that's a bonus," said Dr. Robert Lanza, ACT's chief scientific officer.

Dr. David Prentice, a former Indiana State University biology professor who is a fellow at the Family Research Council, emailed LifeNews.com in response to the news.

Vote Shifts Towards Telling Couple to Have Abortion, Possible Vote Fraud

Elaborate hoax, publicity stunt or legitimate effort to get input on a major life decision, the vote the infamous Minnesota couple has put online of the potential abor-

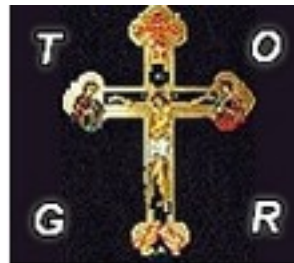
tion of their unborn child has taken a turn.

Whereas the vote ran largely in favor of Pete and Alisha Arnold keeping their 17-week-old unborn child, it has seen a seismic shift towards telling the couple to have an abortion.

At midday Friday, the vote at the BirthOrNot.com web site stood at 82,584 (about 80%) for "give birth" and 19,539 (about 20%) for "have an abortion."

Now, more than 838,000 people have voted, with 67.54 percent (566,461) saying the couple should have an abortion and 32.46 percent (272,249) saying they should give birth to the baby.

Pete Arnold, who has said in interviews the vote is legitimate, in a post on the blog, acknowledges both the massive popularity of the web site, given the international media attention focused on it, and the potential for vote fraud.



Funeral for Babies Found in Abortion Dumpster Attracts 1,000

More than 1,000 pro-life people attended a funeral for seventeen aborted babies whose remains were discovered earlier this year in a trash dumpster used by the Woman's Choice abortion center.

Members of the Citizens for Pro-Life Society organization discovered the allegedly illegal dumping of fetal remains in dumpsters outside the Woman's Choice abortion clinics in Lansing and Saginaw.

They also found patient documents including the names of women who obtained abortions at the facilities and bloody instruments. At least 1000 people in a public display of grief and mourning, packed St. Mary's Cathedral on Saturday and paid their respects to the babies victimized by abortion. The aborted babies, whose bodies once laid at the bottom of a garbage container, were brought before the sanctuary in a simple white infant's coffin for a funeral Mass celebrated by Lansing bishop Earl Boyea.

We Must Help Pro-Life Students Facing Arrest, Discrimination

As you know, the students were arrested for holding graphic signs of aborted children in the public quad on campus. Two weeks ago, Carleton Lifeline (the pro-life student group at Carleton) was notified that the school Student Association would be decertifying the group in less than a week, on November 18th, unless they renounced the pro-life beliefs expressed in their group constitution. The Carleton University Student Association (CUSA) is using the school's "Discrimination on Campus" policy, which upholds "a woman's right to choose" to justify discriminating against the pro-life student group.

Louisiana Abortion Law Protecting Women Gets New Lawsuit

Not content to allow a Louisiana law to stand that allows the health department to hold abortion centers accountable for violating health

and safety standards, the law is now subject to another lawsuit.

Five abortion centers and an abortion practitioner filed the lawsuit contenting the law allows the health department to suspend or revoke their licenses "based on any violation of any state or federal law or regulation" without warning.

That, they say, is a violation of due process. They say the law intends "to close down outpatient abortion facilities regardless of whether those facilities are operating safely."

Birth or Not Couple Says Abortion Vote Web Site Not a Hoax

The couple at the center of the attention of the BirthOrNot abortion vote website in what many are calling an elaborate hoax, says the vote about her potential abortion is legitimate.

Pete and Alisha Arnold set up the web site, which has received worldwide attention and subjected them to claims of creating a ruse designed to oppose abortion, to receive input on whether or not to have an abortion of a 17-week unborn baby.

A poll on the site asks simply, "Should we give birth or have an abortion?"

While both pro-life and pro-

abortion bloggers say the web site is a hoax and use information about Pete Arnold's background as a conservative political activist to make the case, Alisha tells the Pioneer Press newspaper it is legitimate and the couple has no "hidden agenda" or were not looking for publicity and attention.

"I didn't think it would go anywhere," Alisha Arnold said. "There are so many websites out there."

Alisha told the newspaper that she has not had an appointment with an abortion business but would "if it's looking like it's going to be that way we will definitely be looking into it and setting something up if we need to."



Pro-Life Groups Want Pitts to Chair Health Subcommittee if Upton is Chairman

The debate over Congressman Fred Upton becoming the next chairman of the House Energy and Commerce committee has taken

a new turn as pro-life groups are pressing for input on a key subcommittee.

Upton has come under fire from both pro-life organizations and fiscal conservative groups because his is weak on both issues and they want someone else to head the important committee that will lead the fight to repeal or water down Obama Care.

Connie Hair of Human Events recently highlighted Upton's weak voting record on pro-life issues, but he is still seen as the likely new chairman of the committee.

Should he assume leadership of the panel, two pro-life groups say they want a respected pro-life congressman to lead the Subcommittee on Health, which would start any dismantling of Obama Care or its provisions allowing abortion funding and rationing.

Yesterday, the National Right to Life Committee sent a letter to members of the House Republican Steering Committee, which makes the decisions on committee and subcommittee chairs, saying pro-life advocates want pro-life Rep. Joe Pitts of Pennsylvania as the head of the subcommittee.

Catholic Backer of Pro-Abortion Obama to Attend

Cardinal Burke's Designation

In what is an intriguing irony for pro-life Catholic activists, President Barack Obama announced yesterday the official delegation representing him at a ceremony elevating two American Archbishops to Cardinals.

Obama will send Miguel Diaz, the U.S. Ambassador to the Holy See, as the lead delegate for the White House to the ceremony.

Diaz was a staunch defender of then-candidate Barack Obama despite his radical pro-abortion positions that violate the teachings of the Catholic Church. He will attend the elevation of Archbishop Raymond Burke, who has been one of the most outspoken Catholic leaders on the issue of pro-abortion politicians.

Vatican Chief Justice Archbishop Raymond Burke, formerly Archbishop of St. Louis, Missouri, will be honored with membership in the College of Cardinals, as designated by Pope Benedict XVI.

Diaz, who was a theology professor at St. John's University and the College of Saint Benedict in Collegeville, Minnesota before becoming ambassador, is reportedly pro-life but he served as a member of Obama's Catholic advisory

board during his presidential campaign.

Planned Parenthood, NA-RAL Bash Pro-Life Push for Joe Pitts

The abortion lobby has come out in full force this afternoon bashing the pro-life push for Joe Pitts to head the Energy and Commerce Subcommittee on Health.

The National Right to Life Committee and the Susan B. Anthony List both are pushing for Pitts to chair the panel if Rep. Fred Upton, who has a weak pro-life voting record, becomes the chairman of the Energy and Commerce Committee.

The battle is important because the Energy and Commerce Committee and the Health subcommittee will have jurisdiction over any efforts to repeal, weaken, defund, or remove the abortion funding components of the ObamaCare law.

Pro-Life Debate: Repeal ObamaCare or Just Fix Abortion Funding

Two pro-life thinkers are engaged in a heady debate about whether to repeal abortion-funding ObamaCare or merely fix the law to stop its abortion-funding components.

Richard Stith, a professor of law at Valparaiso University School of Law, initially argued at the Catholic blog first Things that the ObamaCare law ought to be kept in place because it provides health care coverage for those who don't have it, but said it should be modified to stop abortion funding.

Scotland Again Rejects Bid to Legalize Assisted Suicide

The Scottish Parliament, the devolved national, unicameral legislature of Scotland, has rejected legislation for a second time that would legalize the practice of assisted suicide. In December 2008,

the parliament rejected a first attempt.

The Press and Journal newspaper indicates a Holyrood committee defeated an effort to make Scotland the first part of the United Kingdom to allow assisted suicide as the End of Life Assistance Bill committee said it was □not persuaded that the case had been made□ for the legislation.



Couple's Web Site Lets Public Vote: Give Birth or Have Abortion

A Minneapolis, Minnesota couple is making waves across the Internet with a web site they created allowing the public to vote on whether or not they should give birth or have an abortion.

Pete and Alisha Arnold are both 30 and they are 17 weeks pregnant with a perfectly healthy baby nicknamed □Wiggles.□ The unborn baby is just weeks away from viability and past the

point at which most women have had an abortion. However, the Arnolds have set up a website, <http://www.birthornot.com> because they aren't sure whether they want to become parents despite the fact that that journey has already started for them. To make a difference in the real world, the couple has set up a poll on their website to allow the public to make the final decision for them. They write: "The whole point here is to let people have a



real way to voice your opinion on the topic of abortion and have it actually make a difference in the real world. By voting on whether to continue or abort an actual pregnancy, you are doing so much more than simply telling an elected representative

your feelings. You are actually changing something in the real world.

For the first time in history, your vote on the topic of abortion will not go unheard. We meant that, they said. Currently, more than 32,000 people have voted in the poll with 79.16 percent urging the couple to give birth to their baby and 20.84 telling them to destroy the child's life in an abortion.
