Senate to Vote on Bill Next Week Allowing Abortions at Military Base Hospitals

Washington, DC (LifeNews.com) -- Members of the U.S. Senate will vote next week on whether to stop a filibuster against that bill containing a provision allowing abortions at taxpayer-funded American military bases. Republicans, perhaps joined by a Democrat or two, are filibustering the bill funding the Defense Department. They are doing so for a number of political reasons -- including the fact that the bill contains an amendment allowing abortions at all worldwide U.S. military base hospitals. The amendment, sponsored by pro-abortion Sen. Rolland Burris of Illinois, would have the military break with current longstanding policy disallowing abortions.

The Senate is expected

to vote on Tuesday on a

cloture vote on the mo-

tion to proceed -- with proabortion Senate Democratic leader Harry Reid asking senators to end debate so the measure can have an up or down vote. Senator Roger Wicker of Mississippi led the fight in the committee against the amendment and planned an amendment of his own on the Senate floor to strike the language. However, it appears the Reid motion will not allow Wicker's amendment to be considered. The Senate Armed Services Committee voted 15-12 for the amendment with all Republicans and Democratic Sen. Ben Nelson voting against it and all other Democrats voting for it. Nelson is one Democrat, and there may be others, who may very well ioin Republicans to vote against ending the filibuster on the bill and its proabortion provision. Current law in effect since 1996 prohibits the performance of abortion by **Department of Defense** medical personnel or at DOD medical facilities. A separate provision prohibits the use of DOD funds for abortion except to

Stacked Panel to Tell Congress to Fund More Embryonic Stem Cell Research Washington, DC (LifeNews.com) -- A stacked panel will tell members of the Senate on Thursday that Congress should green light more funding for embryonic stem cell research and should overturn the federal law a judge has cited in his decision to temporarily halt government funding authorized under President **Barack Obama's executive** order. Senator Tom Harkin, an

Iowa Democrat who is a forceful abortion and embryonic stem cell research proponent, will head the hearing.

He was the lead Senate sponsor of two bills in 2006 and 2007 to attempt to force taxpayers to fund embryonic stem cell research even though it involves the destruction of human life and has not worked well in animal studies because the cells cause tumors and are rejected by the immune system. The Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Labor, Health and Human **Services and Education** will hear from two panels. The first features only Francis Collins, the man who heads up the National Institutes of Health and who has come under sharp criticism. Collins has fiercely opposed efforts by adult stem cells scientists to stop the taxpayer financing Obama authorized of embryonic stem cell research. When a judge ordered it temporarily halted, Collins came under fire for essentially telling scientists who had already received taxpayer dollars they could ignore the decision.

Later, when a federal appeals court temporarily stopped the temporarily injunction, Collins and NIH staffers threw out protocols and began moving at breakneck speed <u>to au-</u> <u>thorize</u> as much government-funding for embryonic stem cell research as possible in case the appeals court reverses itself or the judge overturns the executive order.

Obama's Donald Berwick Pretends to Change His Spots on Health Care Rationing

Thus, the short term Medicare head, Donald Berwick-who Obama gave a recess appointment to so he wouldn't have to testify in a Senate Committee about his rationing viewspretended that we can expand coverage, while not raising prices and not cutting care in a speech yesterday. What a joke. From the Associated Press story: The nation's health system can't be transformed by rationing medical care, **President Barack Obama's new Medicare** chief said Monday in his

first major speech. Dr. **Donald Berwick's appoint**ment earlier this summer without Senate confirmation was contentious because some Republicans accused him of being willing to deny care to save on costs. Since then, the administration has kept Berwick out of the limelight, turning the otherwise well-known medical innovation guru into something of a mystery man in Washington.

Berwick broke his silence Monday, telling an audience of health insurance industry representatives that pushing back against unsustainable costs cannot and should not involve "withholding from us, or our neighbors, any care that helps" or "harming a hair on any patient's head." Berwick also said he doesn't think federal bureaucrats have all the answers when it comes to remaking the system. "A massive, topdown, national project is not the way to do this," he told a conference hosted by America's Health Insurance Plans, the industry lobbying group.

"Some Republicans accused." No, he said it himself.

screen. This is also what causes dryer units to potentially burn your house down with it! He said the best way to keep your dryer working for a very long time (and to keep your electric bill lower) is to take that filter out and wash it with hot soapy water and an old toothbrush (or other brush) at least every six months. Republicans Voters More Optimistic Than Democrats, Think House, Senate in Play

Washington, DC (LifeNews.com) -- Republican voters are more optimistic than Democrats about the 2010 elections and are more likely to believe the House and Senate are in play as potential takeovers for pro-life Republican candidates. Most voters, the PPP poll shows, believe Republicans will take control of the House but not the Sen-

ate.

The newest national survey finds 46% think the GOP will get the House to 32% who think it will not. But only 36% think it will take the Senate and 40% disagree.

Republican voters are extremely optimistic about their party's prospects for this fall and that may be part of what is driving the high level of enthusiasm on their side. 74% think their side will get back the House to only 7% who disagree and 62% think they'll get the Senate with 14% dissenting.

Among all respondents, 64% said they were 'very excited' about voting this fall. But with Republicans who think their party will take back power that figure is 78%. The conviction that their votes are going to bring about a change in control of Congress is driving GOP voters out to the polls.

Democratic voters are a lot less sold on the GOP's chances. Only 22% think they'll take control of the House and just 17% think they'll get the Senate.

Delaware Senate Candidate Christine O'Donnell Trails 53-42 Percent in New Poll

Dover, DE (LifeNews.com) -- In the first poll it has conducted since pro-life Senate candidate Christine O'Donnell <u>toppled pro</u> -abortion candidate Mike <u>Castle</u> for the Republican nod in Delaware, Rasmussen Reports has her trailing her opponent by 11 percent.

Democrat Chris Coons holds a double-digit lead over O'Donnell as Coons earns 53% of the vote to O'Donnell's 42%, with leaners included. One percent (1%) prefer some other candidate, and four percent (4%) are undecided.

If leaners are not included, Coons, the elected executive of the state's largest county, posts a 51% to 40% lead over O'Donnell. Leaners are those who initially indicate no preference for either of the candidates but answer a follow-up question and say they are leaning towards a particular candidate. Coons led O'Donnell 46% to 36% in a survey in August, but a month earlier the two were in a virtual tie, showing it is possible for O'Donnell to close the gap.

Pennsylvania: Pro-Life Senate Hopeful Pat Toomey Posts Best Poll Showing

Harrisburg, PA (LifeNews.com) -- Republican Pat Toomey, the prolife Senate candidate in Pennsylvania, inches closer to the 50% mark this month in his best showing yet in a Rasmussen Reports poll of likely voters.

The new survey shows Toomey earning 49% support, while pro-abortion **Democratic hopeful Joe** Sestak picks up 41% of the vote. Another 10 percent are undecided or like another candidate.

Without leaners included, Toomey posts a 10-point 37%. In the previous survey when leaners were excluded, Toomey was ahead 45% to 39%. Sixty-nine percent of Toomey's voters say they've already made up their minds about how they will vote in November. Seventy-four percent of Sestak supporters say the same.

Colorado Pro-Life Senate Candidate Buck Leads Pro -Abortion Bennet After Debate

(LifeNews.com) -- After the first debate between the two, Colorado pro-life Senate candidate Ken **Buck leads pro-abortion** incumbent Democratic **Senator Michael Bennet** 49% to 45%.

The latest Rasmussen Reports telephone survey of likely voters shows six percent favor another candidate and five percent are undecided.

In late August, Buck held an identical 49% to 45% lead when leaners were included in the totals.

Pro-Life Democrat Becomes First to Sign Petition to Overturn ObamaCare

Washington, DC (LifeNews.com) -- One of the few truly pro-life Democrats in Congress, who opposed the ObamaCare bill when the House passed it, became the first Democrat to sign a petition to repeal it. Mississippi Rep. Gene Taylor signed the petition Wednesday, his office said.

Taylor is the 172nd person to sign on to the legislation to repeal the bill following pro-life Republican Rep. Steve King (Iowa), who offered the act on June 16. The entire House Republican leadership has also signed onto the petition, according to Politico. Taylor earned some conservative praise for his signature.
